## **FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST**

### **GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

With conditions becoming warmer and dryer expect the fire to become active earlier in the day. Expect to see torching and continuous runs by 1400hrs. Spot fires from roll outs will continue to challenge containment. Fire progression will be mainly by backing fire with short intense runs into the interior where wind, slope and fuels align. The fire will remain active through the night above 2500ft. Watch for dry down canyon winds during the night.

### **SPECIFIC:**

#### **Branch V**

- No forward fire progression expected. Watch for hold over heat on steep slopes.

#### **Branch VII**

- Expect backing fire with intense uphill runs back towards the interior, both below Little Pine Mt. and in the Indian Creek drainage.
- Spot fires from roll outs will continue to be a problem.
- If the fire crosses Indian Creek there will be intense uphill runs and the potential for a strong down canyon push during the night.
- Rates of spread will exceed 100cph, with flame lengths 30-60-ft. in the brush.

#### **Branch IX**

- The fire is not expected to impact the Branch during this forecast period.

**Air Operations:** Poor visibility earlier then clearing by 1000hrs..

**FIVE HAZARDOUS ATTITUDES (This applies to all of us, not just pilots!)**

**Flight out of Balance**

Most pilots would agree that the single most important element in assuring the safety of flight is the exercise of sound judgment, or good old-fashioned "common sense." In the January issue of *APOA Pilot* (p. 71), Editor Richard Collins discussed six qualities that can be associated with pilots who we consider to exercise good judgment: patience, intuition, organization, cool, decisiveness, and coordination.

Clearly, judgment is the product of a combination - a balance - of factors that includes a pilots basic stick-and-rudder skills; his knowledge of aircraft, route, and weather; experience; training; personality; and attitude. But these factors can just as easily combine in an exercise of poor judgment as they can in good judgment. The challenge facing researchers seeking to formalize judgment training is to find ways to reinforce good decision-making processes and to discourage bad ones.

The personality factor is a particularly tough nut to crack because personality traits are deeply rooted behavioral characteristics that are usually established in childhood and are highly resistant to change. Attitudes, on the other hand, are not innate; they are learned responses to various types of situations. Attitudes can be influenced and changed (this is the stock in trade of advertising agencies, politicians and theologians, among others).

In aviation, a pilot's attitude toward safety in general, toward himself, and toward the very act of flying can greatly influence his judgment. If common sense were really so common, fewer accidents attributed to "pilot error" would occur. Researchers therefore have sought to formalize the difference between good attitudes and bad attitudes. They have come up with five "hazardous" attitudes that may exist in varying degrees in any pilot in any given situation. By recognizing the onset of hazardous attitudes in ourselves and understanding the antidotes to them, we can change our decision-making habits for the better.

**1 Anti-authority**

The anti-authority attitude is found in pilots who dislike being told what to do, who resent external control over their actions. "Don't tell me!" is their unspoken response to what they consider to be a challenge to their command prerogatives. These pilots often disregard rules, regulations, and procedures they feel are silly or unnecessary; they feel the rules were written for "the other guy."

Nobody enjoys feeling like he is being pushed around. Moreover, the pilot has responsibility for, and is the final authority to, what is appropriate for the safety of his flight. The pilot has the prerogative to question authority when he feels it to be in error. Under Federal Aviation Regulation 91.3, in an emergency the pilot may deviate from any rule or regulation to the extent necessary to meet that emergency. Be that as it may, when a pilot deliberately flouts the rules, he has stepped over the line into a hazardous attitude.

The antidote: When you find yourself flirting with the anti-authority hazardous attitude, think, "Follow the rules. They are usually right."

**ENVIROMENTAL HAZARDS:** Poison Oak has become an issue with the crews coming off the line. The Los Padres has been known for their abundance and robust Poison Oak. Shower often when you can, see the laundry service often, and visit Medical Unit sooner than later for lotions and potions.

**CUMULATIVE FATIGUE:** A number of personnel are on their second or third tour of duty here on the Zaca. We need to continue to monitor their health and welfare. Keep hydrating and pace yourself by your distance. Adhere to the two to one work ratio protocols.

**FUEL CONDITIONS:** Fuels across the whole area are extremely dry, compounded by a variety of factors which include low winter moisture, hot dry June and July weather, and increased vegetation stress and mortality from drought. Expect extreme fire behavior and base all actions accordingly.

**INCIDENT TRANSPORTATION:** **Highway 154 is now open, be careful getting onto the highway. Expect periods of heavy traffic.** Incident travel routes and travel distances can be long, and local residents continue to share the roads. Be alert for traffic, drive with your lights on, keep your speed down, and anticipate other drivers' actions. The camp speed limit is 5 mph.

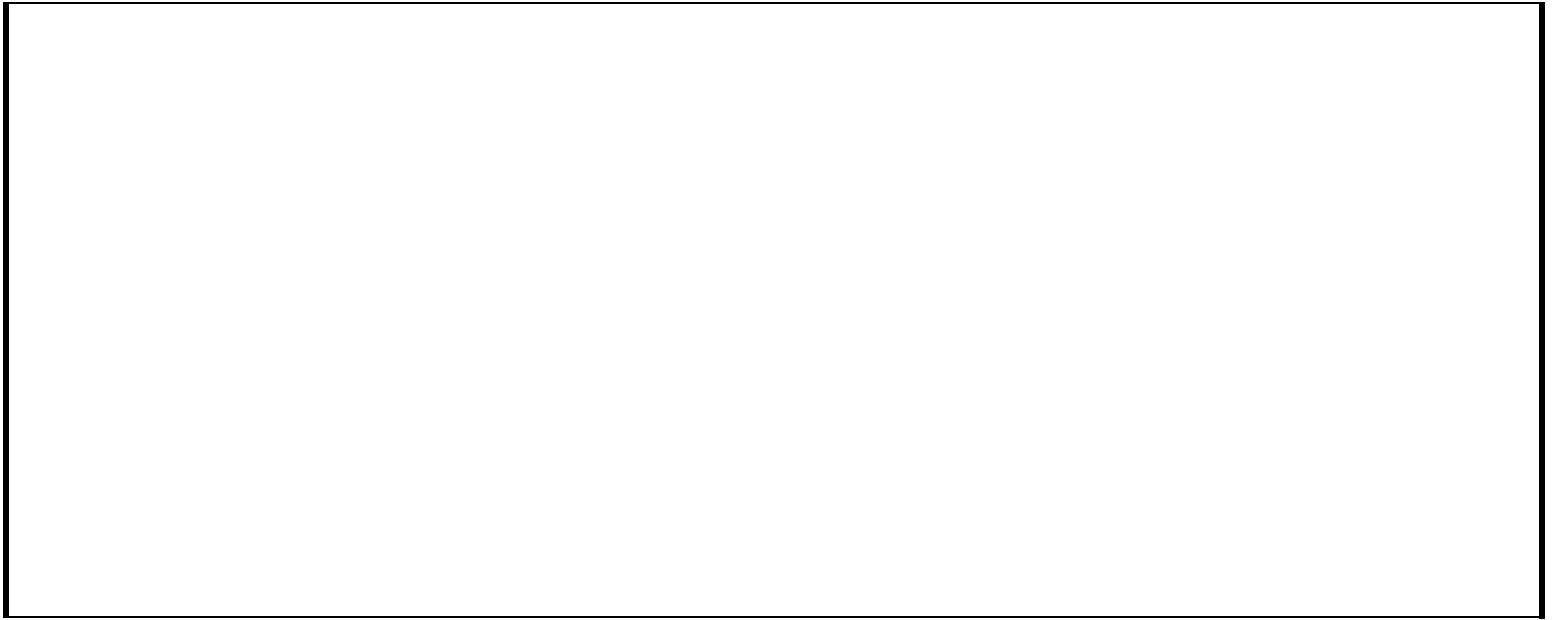
