WEATHER DISCUSSION: The fire area remains under a very stable and dry airmass with a continuation of fairly light winds and subtle changes in RH and Temperatures. Smoke is expected to blanket the north zone again today thus slightly lower temperatures and higher rh's are expected during the afternoon hours. By Saturday a weak trough north of the region will move east out of California allowing the ridge to build for a continued warming and drying trend as well as increased stability. The marine layer is currently around 1500 ft but should become more shallow through early next week...thus little impact is expected for the north zone through the foreseeable future.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly Clear with the smoke layer remaining around 12,000 ft and covering much of the perimeter in the afternoon.

MAX TEMPS: **Under Smoke:** 76 - 80 ridges and mid slope. 80 to 87 valleys.
(Max Temps 10 degrees higher under clear skies)

MIN TEMPS: 47 – 54 along lower slopes and drainages.
58 – 65 above thermal belt (~5000 ft)

MIN HUMIDITY: **Under Smoke:** Min 18-25% lower slopes and valleys.
23-30% ridges and mid slopes.
(Min RH's 10% lower under clear skies)

MAX HUMIDITY: 65-75%. except above 5000 ft...40-50% .

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - 0600-0900 PDT... Northeast 5-10 mph
1000-2000 PDT... Northeast to Northwest 4 to 7 mph
0000-0600 PDT (Sat)...Northeast 3 to 6 mph.

Forecast for Sunday:

Sunny but Smokey. Highs 86 ridges. 97 valleys. Lows 65 to 70 except 55 in the valleys. Minimum Relative Humidity 11-16%. Ridge Winds...Northeast-Northwest 3-6 mph. Slope winds...west or upslope 5 to 8 mph with higher gusts to 15 mph along west to east orientated terrain.

Outlook...August 12-15 2007 / Monday through Thursday...Mostly clear...hot and dry. Highs 88 to 92 upper slopes...96-100 mid and lower slopes...100 to 105 valleys. Lows 70 to 75 mid and upper slopes...55 to 60 lower slopes and valleys. Ridge winds: west and southwest 10 mph with gusts 20 mph. Slope winds: upslope or west 5 to 8 mph.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY

The fire area remains under a very stable and dry airmass with the continuation of fairly light winds and subtle changes in RH and temperatures. Smoke is expected to blanket the north zone again today thus slightly lower temperatures and higher RH's are expected during the afternoon hours.

SEE ATTACHED INCIDENT METEOROLOGIST WEATHER FORECAST.

PROBABILITY OF IGNITION = 67% on north aspects to 88% on south aspects, and 59% under smoky conditions.

Live Fuel Moistures are well below critical: Reyes Creek/Ozena= 49% taken on August 1st.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Potential for spotting has diminished in areas with heavy concentrations of smoke. Fire behavior will moderate on the north side of the Richardson Zone due to shading from smoke but aggressive burning conditions will exist south of Big Pine Mountain. Expect fire activity in Alamar Canyon to start picking up after 0700.

SPECIFIC

Division KK – Heavy smoke from the fire on the south side of Big Pine Mountain will shade upper portions of the Sisquoc reducing temperatures and moderating fire behavior. Fire will continue slowly backing down Rattlesnake Canyon where it will realign itself with the slope and make short runs up towards Big Pine Mountain and unburned spur ridges.

Division LL – The fire is at Sisquoc along the KK/LL break. Heavy smoke produced from the fire on the south side of Big Pine Mountain will moderate any fire spread up towards Samon Peak and the Sisquoc/Alamar Saddle. Water or retardant drops to hold the fire in check should be effective. The fire will continue to back slowly down in the Sisquoc aligning itself with drainages and increasing potential for runs towards Sierra Madre Ridge.

Fire is well established into upper portions of Alamar Canyon and expected to make rapid, high intensity runs towards Madulce Peak and the Sisquoc/Alamar Saddle. Very little lateral spread occurs with these runs. Fire will back further down into Alamar then realign itself and make additional runs upslope on both side of the canyon.

Live Oak Zone – Fire will continue to threaten Richardson Zone from Indian Creek. Rapid upslope runs will occur when the fire crosses any drainage and aligns with the slope.

AIR OPERATIONS: Visibility should be good at Richardson Helibase. Heavy smoke will affect visibility in the upper Sisquoc, areas along Big Pine Mountain, and east of Big Pine Mountain.

SAFETY

- Areas not shaded by heavy smoke will experience aggressive burning conditions.
- The brush/timber fuel mix at the higher elevations will support large scale group torching.
- Watch for slope reversals and strong upslope runs as the fire repositions in Alamar Canyon.

FIVE HAZARDOUS ATTITUDES (This applies to all of us, not just pilots!)

Flight out of Balance
(two in a series of five)

2 Impulsivity

Some pilots feel the need to do something-anything-immediately when confronted with a choice of action. "I must act now - there's no time," they say to themselves. What makes this attitude hazardous is that these pilots usually do the first thing that enters their heads; in other words, they don't think. They don't take the time to select the best alternative.

Decisiveness is a positive attribute in a pilot, but making a decision in the absence of facts is a dangerous habit. "Plan your flight, then fly your plan," the military teaches its pilots. To fly safely, you must always have alternative courses of action in mind should something to wrong right *now*. (Sometimes this is mandated, as in alternate airport requirements under instrument flight rules.) Among other benefits, this reduces overall pilot workload.

Regardless of the swiftness of the onset of an unusual situation, it behooves the smart pilot to take a moment to analyze the situation, carefully consider the alternatives, and then make a decision based on the best possible course of action under the circumstances. It need not take more than a moment if the pilot has the right decision making attitude.

Antidote: When tempted to respond without thinking through a problem, remember "Not so fast. Think first."

TRANSPORTATION- roads may be STEEP and DUSTY-, so BUCKLE UP - USE HEADLIGHTS, tap that horn, and GO SLOW!!! Clean windshields regularly. Use CHOCKS! Watch Out for COWS, DEER, and Public Traffic. STEEP TERRAIN - can significantly reduce your physical capacity = shorten your ESCAPE ROUTE

POISON OAK- Supervisors need to know what it looks like, and brief their personnel on hazard and treatment.

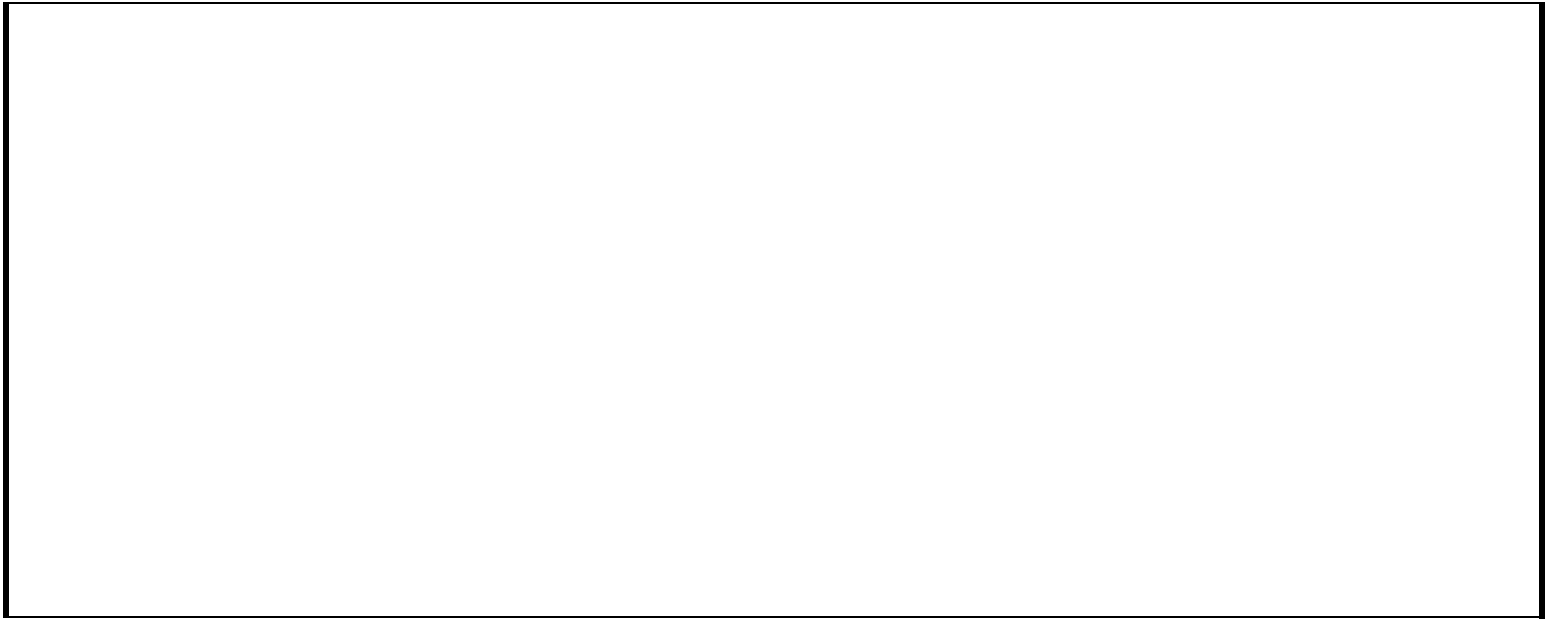
