WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Warmer and drier today. Warming trend to continue through Tuesday as High Pressure builds westward across the region. A slight cooling trend is expected from Wednesday through Friday.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly Clear except smoke in valleys until mid morning and again tonight. Fog at Helibase and ICP clearing by 0800 PDT.

TEMPS: Max 93-98
Min 57-63.

HUMIDITY: Min 8% above 3500 ft...12-16% elsewhere.
Max 22-29%...around 65% below 1500 ft MSL.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - till 1000 PDT.....East to Southeast 5 mph.
1100-0200 PDT...Southeast 5 to 10 mph.
0200-0600 PDT...East 5 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - till 0900 PDT.....Downslope/down valley 1-3 mph.

Mostly Clear. Highs 95-101. Lows 66-76. Min RH 8-12%. Max RH 25-40%. Ridge top winds east 5 mph in the morning...southwest 5 to 10 mph in the afternoon...northeast 5 to 10 mph during the night with gusts 15 mph. Slope winds...upslope/up valley 4 to 8 mph with gusts 25 mph in the afternoon – down slope/down valley 2 to 5 mph with gusts 15 mph.

Tuesday... Mostly Clear. Highs 96-102. Lows 58-64. Min RH 10-15%. Max RH 35-40%. Ridge winds northeast 10 mph in the night and morning...West 10 mph during the afternoon and evening.

FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Again the fire will become active early in the day. Expect to see torching and continuous runs once the RH drops to 25%. Spot fires from roll outs will continue to challenge containment. The main fire progression will continue to the Northeast. Fire progression will be mainly by backing fire with short intense upslope runs where slope and fuels align. The fire will remain active through the night above 1500ft. Watch for dry down canyon winds during the night.

SPECIFIC:

Branch V

- No forward fire progression expected. Watch for hold over heat on steep slopes.

Branch VII

- Expect backing fire with intense uphill runs towards the Don Victor jeepway.
- Spot fires from roll outs will continue to be a problem.
- The fire will back to the south in the Dick Smith, fire progression will slow in the Ogivly burn scar. There remains a potential for a strong down canyon push during the night.
- Rates of spread will exceed 100cph, with flame lengths 30-60-ft. in the brush.
- Interior islands will continue to actively burn.

Branch IX

- The fire is not expected to impact the Branch during this forecast period.

Air Operations: Poor visibility earlier, then clearing by 0900hrs.

SAFETY:

Post lookouts! Watch for rolling material in this steep country you do not want a spot fire below you.

FIVE HAZARDOUS ATTITUDES (This applies to all of us, not just pilots!)

Flight out of Balance
(three in a series of five)

3 *Invulnerability*

Despite the evidence supplied by such columns as "Never Again" that bad things can happen to anyone, some pilots defy logic and the laws of probability with an attitude of invulnerability. "It can't happen to me," they think, as they read of another gear-up landing or of a duel electric/vacuum failure in instrument meteorological conditions. They know accidents happen, they know anyone can be affected - they just don't believe it will ever happen to them personally.

The evidence of our senses should be enough. Anyone who has amassed sufficient experience in the cockpit will have had some untoward event occur at some time in his flying career. The alternative attitude - that something is likely to go wrong on each and every flight - is equally wrong-headed but overall a safer basis for decision-making. We are taught even in driver's education courses to anticipate the unexpected. If nothing happens on a particular flight, fine, but anticipation of potential trouble is the first step toward dealing with it when (not if) it eventually occurs.

Antidote: If you ever find yourself feeling that you fly under a lucky star, say to yourself "It could happen to me."

STEEP SLOPES: Yesterday an inmate was injured from a rolling rock. Watch out for rolling materials on steep slopes. Use lookouts, don't work below others and scream out when material gets dislodged. Always watch your footing and keep your distance between each other when working.

FATIGUE & HYDRATION: Make sure that you are getting your proper two to one work rest ratio. Hydrate often and see the medical unit for meds and foot problems.

FIRE BEHAVIOR/WEATHER: We are once again transitioning into a hotter and dryer weather pattern. These are the conditions which significantly contributed to the past large spread of this fire. Expect fire behavior to be very active and plan accordingly. Constantly observe weather and burning conditions and always have a contingency plan for any situation.

INCIDENT TRANSPORTATION: Highway 154 is open. Exercise care when entering and exiting highway. Remember the speed is 45 mph. Expect periods of heavy weekend traffic. Incident travel routes and travel distances can be long, and local residents continue to share the roads. Be alert for traffic, drive with your lights on, keep your speed down, and anticipate other drivers' actions. The camp speed limit is 5 mph.

A firefighter with good situational awareness is a safe firefighter.

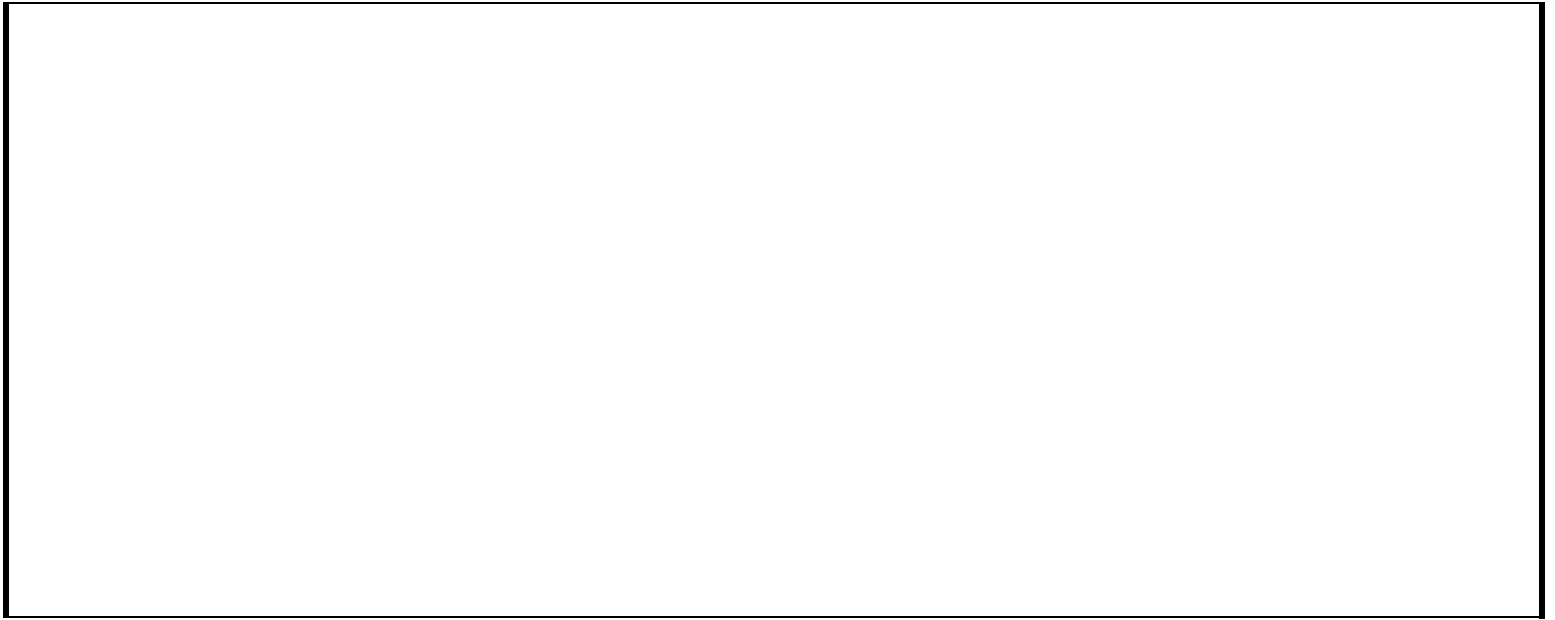

The communications unit shall limit all non essential traffic on command by declaring a "Medical Emergency" and shall then notify the Medical Unit, Safety Officer, and Operations Section Chief of the incident.
