**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** The fire area will become increasingly warm and dry for the next two days as high pressure builds. Single digit rh's are possible along with poor recovery during the night and morning hours. The marine layer is currently around 1500 ft but should become more shallow through early next week...thus little impact is expected for the north zone through the foreseeable future.

**WEATHER:** Mostly Clear with the smoke layer remaining around 10,000 ft and covering much of the perimeter in the afternoon.

## INPUTS

### WEATHER SUMMARY

The fire area will become increasingly warm and dry for the next two days as high-pressure builds. Single digit RH's are possible along with poor recovery during the night and morning hours.

**PROBABILITY OF IGNITION** = 69% on north aspects to 91% on south aspects.

Live Fuel Moistures are well below critical: Reyes Creek/Ozena= 49% taken on August 1<sup>st</sup>.

## FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** Lower nighttime and daytime humidity will make for very active fire behavior throughout the 24-hour period. All aspects will support active burning when the fire is aligned with the slope. Once in alignment the fire will make significant runs with flame lengths of 50 – 200 feet until the fire moves out of alignment. Fire spread will then progress more slowly and flame lengths drop to around 15-feet. Spotting over the last few days has not been a problem though the potential has increased with higher temperatures and lower humidity.

## SPECIFIC

**Division KK** – The fire in Rattlesnake Canyon has progressed very slowly down towards the Sisquoc River. The fire could reach the bottom of the Sisquoc River near Judell Canyon today. Fire behavior will moderate if heavy smoke moves over the area. If shading is not a factor then the fire could make a significant run up towards Sierra Madre just east of Judell Canyon. Aircraft use to check fire spread will be limited after about 1200 due to heavy smoke.

**Division LL** – The fire will continue moving down into the Sisquoc River. As it repositions itself into drainages, the fire will run up either side of the Sisquoc River with high potential for significant runs up to Samon Peak. If heavy smoke shades the area, fire behavior will moderate but aircraft use would be limited due to poor visibility after 1200. Considerable heat still exists in Alamar Canyon. The fire will continue backing further down into Alamar Canyon with rapid, high intensity runs on both sides of Alamar and the unnamed drainage just south of Madulce Peak after 1000.

**Live Oak Zone** – Easterly progression of the fire from the Live Oak Zone will continue to threaten the Richardson Zone. A critical point ahead is the Mono Canyon area. The lower portion of Mono Canyon runs north and south, which aligns with upslope/upcanyon winds. Once the fire establishes there it will run upslope to the north where the canyon then makes a turn to the east. The orientation in this part of the Mono Canyon is east and west where it will align with west winds forecasted to occur below ridgetops. The west winds along with slope will push fire east towards the Monte Arido Jeepway. This would open the door to fire entering into Ventura County and the Matilijah Wilderness.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Visibility will be good around Richardson Helibase. Aircraft use in the Sisquoc, upper Alamar Canyon, and west of Madulce Peak will be limited after 1200 due to heavy smoke.

## SAFETY

- All fuels types have demonstrated the ability to carry fire under a wide variety of weather conditions.
- Areas not shaded by heavy smoke will experience aggressive burning conditions.

**FIVE HAZARDOUS ATTITUDES (This applies to all of us, not just pilots!)**

Flight out of Balance  
(three in a series of five)

**3 *Invulnerability***

Despite the evidence supplied by such columns as "Never Again" that bad things can happen to anyone, some pilots defy logic and the laws of probability with an attitude of invulnerability. "It can't happen to me," they think, as they read of another gear-up landing or of a duel electric/vacuum failure in instrument meteorological conditions. They know accidents happen, they know anyone can be affected - they just don't believe it will ever happen to them personally.

The evidence of our senses should be enough. Anyone who has amassed sufficient experience in the cockpit will have had some untoward event occur at some time in his flying career. The alternative attitude - that something is likely to go wrong on each and every flight - is equally wrong-headed but overall a safer basis for decision-making. We are taught even in driver's education courses to anticipate the unexpected. If nothing happens on a particular flight, fine, but anticipation of potential trouble is the first step toward dealing with it when (not if) it eventually occurs.

Antidote: If you ever find yourself feeling that you fly under a lucky star, say to yourself "It could happen to me."

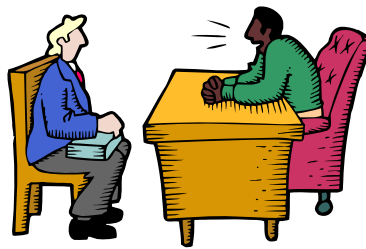
