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### **WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

Much warmer and drier today. Very poor recovery of humidity tonight. Warming trend to continue through Tuesday as High Pressure builds westward across the region. A slight cooling trend is expected from Wednesday through Friday.

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### **WEATHER FORECAST:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly Clear.

**TEMPS:** Max 99-103°  
Min 70-75°

**HUMIDITY:** Min 5-10%  
Max 15-25%

### **20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** till 1000 PDT.....East to Southeast 5-10 mph.  
1100-0200 PDT...Southwest 5 mph.  
0200-0600 PDT...Northeast 10 mph gusts 20 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** till 0900 PDT.....Downslope/down valley 1-3 mph with gusts 8 mph.  
1000-2000 PDT....Upslope/Up valley 5-12 mph with gusts to 25 mph.  
2100-0600 PDT....Downslope/Down valley 3-5 mph with gusts 15 mph.

**MIXING HEIGHT:** until 1000 PDT.....Inversion near 2500 ft

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### **Forecast for Tuesday:** (OPERATIONAL PERIOD – 0600 PDT 08/14/07 - 0600 PDT 08/15/07)

Mostly Clear. Highs 100-105. Lows 68-71. Min RH 5-10%. Max RH 20-25%. Ridge winds northeast 10 to 15 mph during the early morning...diminishing and becoming West 10 mph by afternoon. Up slope winds 5 to 8 mph with gusts 25 mph up valley. Evening ridge top winds Northwest 10-15 mph shifting to northeast overnight.

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### **Outlook...August 15-18 2007**

**Wednesday...**Mostly Clear. Highs 98-102. Min RH 12-18%. Lows 66 to 70. Max RH 25 to 35%. Ridge winds northeast 10-15 mph night and morning hours and west to northwest 10-15 mph during the afternoon and evening. Afternoon upslope winds 5-10 mph with gusts 25 mph up valley. Late night and early morning down slope winds 2 to 5 mph with gusts 15 mph down valley.

**Thursday through Saturday...**Mostly Clear. Slow cooling trend of about 2 degrees each day. Highs 93 to 99. Min RH 14-20%. Lows 58 to 65. Marine layer depth 2000 ft by Saturday morning...otherwise poor overnight recovery with Max RH 25-35%. Ridge winds northeast 5-10 mph night and morning hours and west to northwest 10 mph afternoons and evenings. Normal slope and valley winds.

### **FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST**

#### **GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

Again the fire will become active early in the day. Expect to see torching and continuous runs once the RH drops to 25%. Spot fires from roll outs will continue to challenge containment. The main fire progression will continue to the Northeast. Fire progression will be mainly by backing fire with short intense upslope runs where slope and fuels align. The fire will remain active through the night above 1500ft. Watch for dry down canyon winds during the night.

#### **SPECIFIC:**

##### **Branch V**

- No forward fire progression expected. Watch for hold over heat on steep slopes.
- Watch column if unburned islands ignite, spot fires are possible with column collapse.

##### **Branch VII**

- Expect backing fire with intense uphill runs towards the Don Victor jeepway.
- Spot fires from roll outs will continue to be a problem.
- The fire will back to the south in the Dick Smith, fire progression will slow in the Ogivly burn scar. There remains a potential for a strong down canyon push during the night.
- Rates of spread will exceed 100cph, with flame lengths 30-60-ft. in the brush.
- Interior islands will continue to actively burn.

##### **Branch IX**

- The fire is not expected to impact the Branch during this forecast period.

**Air Operations:** Poor visibility earlier, then clearing by 0900hrs.

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#### **SAFETY:**

**Conditions are hot and dry. Expect extreme fire behavior.**

**Steep slopes mean spot fires from roll outs. Post lookouts!**

**FIVE HAZARDOUS ATTITUDES (This applies to all of us, not just pilots!)**

Flight out of Balance  
(four in a series of five)

**4 "Macho"**

A pilot we know - a mild mannered, soft-spoken chap - started a takeoff into a strong crosswind recently, and finding that he could not keep the airplane tracking down the centerline, he thought about aborting. Realizing that friends were watching from the ramp, however, he continued the takeoff. As he drifted across the runway edge lights with about two feet of altitude, he realized he had fallen victim to the most perfidious of the hazardous attitudes, "macho." "I'll show them," he was unconsciously thinking. "I can do it."

The "macho" bug can bite the shy and retiring. It bites women with great regularity, as well, particularly women who feel they are somehow in competition with male pilots. But "macho" reaches its nastiest manifestations in pilots whom, for whatever psychological reasons, are always trying to prove they are better than anyone else. They prove this to themselves by taking risks and trying to impress others. Beware overconfidence.

Aviation's fascination with having "the right stuff" unconsciously reinforces this most dangerous of attitudes. Recent popular books, films and television programs imply that pilots who don't take risks, who are afraid of facing a little danger, don't have the moral fiber required of a "real" pilot. Having had the right stuff is of little consolation to the widow(er) and orphans of the pilot who had it.

In fact, the researchers' choice of the word *macho* is probably ill-taken. Macho means nothing more than strong, manly. Though some feminists may argue that this in itself is an undesirable attribute, the dictionary would disagree. Rather, the negative response we are supposed to have to the word is based on its misuse (probably in place of the work *machismo*, which is derived from macho but implies male domination) in popular culture over the last decade or two. A more appropriate word is *hubris*, meaning excessive pride or self-confidence, arrogance.

Competitiveness is a characteristic of modern society, and most of us probably fall prey to it on occasion. Competition has its place in aviation, but that place is not in the day-to-day flying activities of the majority of general aviation.

Antidote: Be on guard for the hubris monster, for it is the most insidious of beasts. There's nothing wimpy about saying, "Taking chances is foolish." Just ask

your kids. **To be continued**.....

**FATIGUE & HYDRATION:** Make sure that you are getting your proper two to one work rest ratio. Hydrate often, these high temperatures (100+), low Relative Humidity's (<10%) and poor overnight recoveries mandate we drink plenty of fluids. See the medical unit for meds and foot problems.

**FIRE BEHAVIOR/WEATHER:** We are one again in a hotter and dryer weather pattern. These are the conditions which significantly contributed to the past large spread of this fire. Expect fire behavior to be very active and plan accordingly. Constantly observe weather and burning conditions and always have a contingency plan for any situation.

**INCIDENT TRANSPORTATION:** Highway 154 is open and has heavy traffic. Exercise care when entering and exiting highway. Remember the speed is 45 mph. Expect periods of heavy weekend traffic. Incident travel routes and travel distances can be long, and local residents continue to share the roads. Be alert for traffic, drive with your lights on, keep your speed down, and anticipate other drivers' actions. The camp speed limit is 5 mph.

**STEEP TERRAIN:** Yesterday an inmate was injured from a rolling rock. Watch out for rolling materials on steep slopes. Use lookouts, don't work below others and scream out when material gets dislodged. Always watch your footing and keep your distance between each other when working.

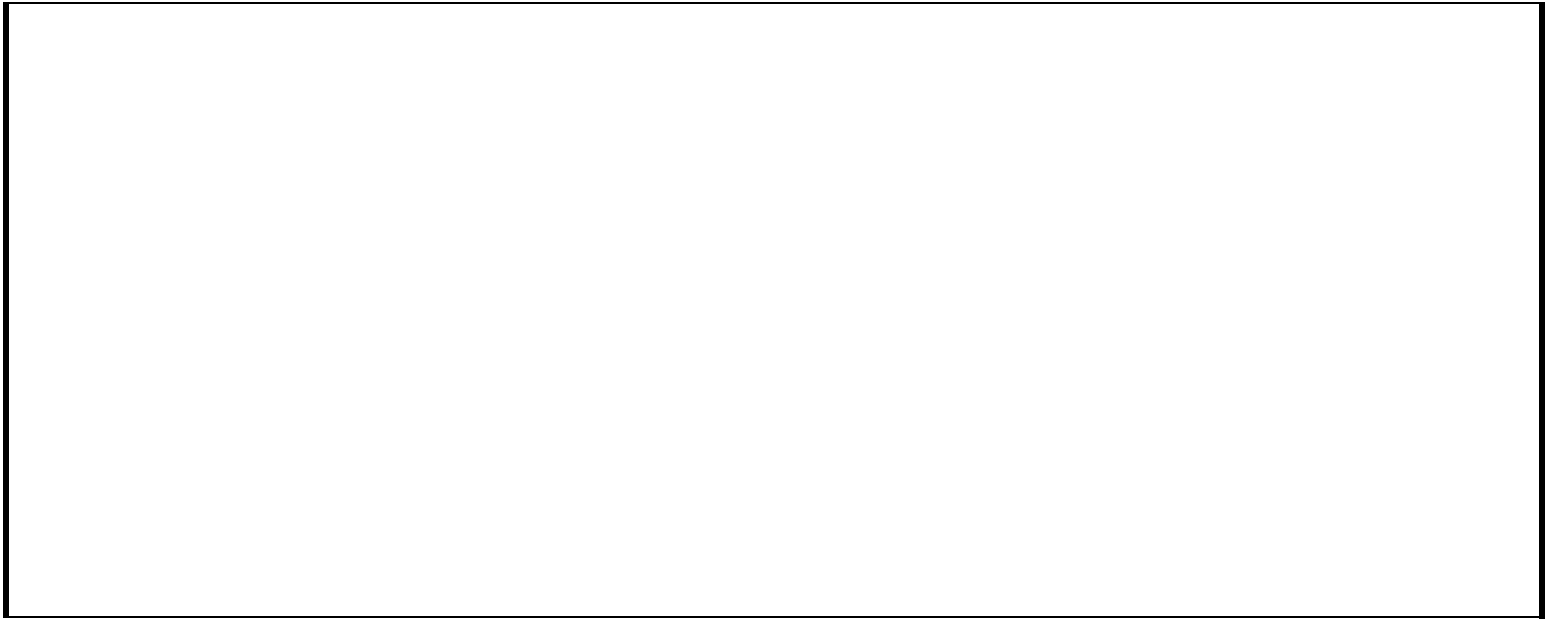
