WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Mid level moisture will bring slightly cooler temperatures and slightly higher relative humidity to the fire during the operational period. North to northeast winds will once again occur during the evening and overnight hours at the ridgetops and through and below passes and canyons. The slight cooling trend and increasing relative humidity will continue through the weekend.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly Clear.

TEMPS: Max 95-100 valleys/mid slopes...90-95 upper slopes/ridgetops.
Min 52-62 valleys/mid slopes...63-73 upper slopes/ridgetops.

FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

The fire remains fuels and topography driven upslope up canyon will determine the direction of fire spread. Expect minimal fire spread down the Mono drainage. With the low RH overnight the fire will remain active. Were RH is below 25% expect torching. Spot fires from roll outs will continue to challenge containment. Fire progression will be mainly by flanking fire with short intense upslope runs where slope and fuels align. The fire will remain active through the night above 1500ft. Down canyon winds during the night will push the fire down canyon.

SPECIFIC:

Branch V

- No forward fire progression expected. Watch for hold over heat on steep slopes.
- Watch column if unburned islands ignite, spot fires are possible with column collapse.

Branch VII

- Expect flanking fire with intense uphill runs towards the Don Victor Jeepway.
- Spot fires from roll outs will continue to be a problem.
- The fire progression has slowed in the Ogivly burn scar.
- Rates of spread will exceed 100cph, with flame lengths 30-60-ft. in the brush.
- Expect active fire behavior through out the night, with potential down slope runs.

Branch IX

- The fire has the potential to cross into the Branch during this forecast period.

Air Operations: Poor visibility earlier, then clearing by 1000hrs.

SAFETY:

Conditions are hot and dry. Expect extreme fire behavior.

Steep slopes mean spot fires from roll outs. Post lookouts!

THE FIRST MISSION. Excerpts from the book "Wonderful Flying Machines", by Barrett Thomas Beard

Destiny was on **Commander Frank Erickson's** side in December 1943 as he started the world's first helicopter school at Floyd Bennett Field, New York. The work of getting a flying machine, people trained, and most importantly for him, spreading an awareness of the peculiar capabilities of the helicopter throughout areas of leadership, all combined with a series of fates that pushed Erickson into the first mission.

A catastrophic event occurred on 3 January 1944 that inaugurated the helicopter in the humanitarian role. The Navy destroyer, USS TURNER, anchored off Sandy Hook, New Jersey, suffered an explosion shortly after six in the storm darkened pre-dawn hours. The blast, felt fifteen miles away was followed by a second explosion forty-seven minutes later sinking the ship. Many survivors were brought to the hospital at Sandy Hook. Large quantities of plasma were urgently needed. A blizzard blocked all aircraft flights and hampered ground delivery.

A nor'easterly storm sweeping the Atlantic coast with snow and sleet driven by 20 to 25 knot winds impeded rescue operations. All airfields in the region were closed. U.S Coast Guard Admiral Parker, from his Third Naval District headquarters in New York, remembering what he had earlier described as the remarkable performance telephoned Erickson asking if it would be practicable for a helicopter to pick up blood plasma at the New York City's waterfront Battery and fly it to Sandy Hook in the current weather. Erickson did not restrain his enthusiasm when he responded with a booming, Yes Sir! Neither he nor the helicopter had experience together in stormy conditions. However, this was his chance to prove his dream to the world.

FIREFIGHTER FATIGUE: Crews have been working long hours under strenuous conditions. Be aware of firefighter fatigue. Pace yourselves and take rest breaks as often as needed. Keep yourself well hydrated. Carry plenty of water, drink often, and preplan for water re-supplies as needed. Don't let fatigue make you complacent about your job.

COMPLACENCY: Keep your mind engaged and attentive to the task; continually ask yourself if you are doing the job safely, the way you were trained. Keep an eye on your fellow employees too. If you see unsafe practices, YOU are responsible to stop them.

ATTITUDE: A big key to working accident free is good situational awareness and a positive safety attitude. Supervisors should set a good tone for the whole shift by conducting a line briefing at the beginning of the shift. Re-brief crews whenever conditions change. Supervisors should lead by example and doing that will set the tone for the crews.

The communications unit shall limit all non essential traffic on command by declaring a "Medical Emergency" and shall then notify the Medical Unit, Safety Officer, and Operations Section Chief of the incident.
