WEATHER SUMMARY: See attached Fire Weather Forecast

Another warm night and morning is on tap as persistent smoke cover tends to moderate night and morning temperatures. Northeast ridge winds may get a little gusty again tonight after midnight and through the morning hours...otherwise light east or downslope/down canyon winds are expected again. Relative humidity recovery should achieve 25 to 35% with areas on the southeast perimeter running slightly lower.

Live Fuel Moistures are below critical levels - about 49% at Reyes Creek/Ozena.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: The fire will again remain very active throughout the night due to poor nighttime humidity recovery and extremely dry fuels in Mono Creek and Don Victor Canyon. With sustained runs, flame lengths of up to 70-feet are possible. North-northeasterly ridge winds are favorable for firing operations from the Sierra Madre Ridge; with ridgetop NE winds will becoming gusty after midnight. Expect winds to shift from NW and NE to N and NE at around 2200; this should continue to assist holding on firing operations to the north. In areas with humidity reaching 25% or greater, moisture will begin to impact firing operations. As RH approaches 40-50% fine fuels will not carry fire well. Live fuels will still support intense uphill runs where slope alignment is favorable.

SPECIFIC

Division CC and DD – Heat in lower sections of the Sisquoc from today's fire activity may position the fire to align with slope and wind to make runs up Logan Canyon, unburned portions of Judell Canyon, and smaller unnamed drainages through the night until around 0400. If the RH recovery improves during the night, backing fire spread will be hampered, especially at lower elevations. Fire activity should moderate until around 0600, when activity will then start to increase at sunrise.

Division GG –HH – Fire activity in Mono Creek below Hildreth Peak and the ridge west of Don Victor Canyon will remain active with continuing fire spread to the east. This area has had the lowest RH recovery at night (19% Three Sisters RAWS 0600 8/15). Anticipate short slope runs in areas with continuous fuel and exposure to wind. Spotting and rollout will aid in fire spread.

Firing operations - Fire should carry well in the light flashy fuels until around midnight. As the RH recovery improves into the evening, this will moderate fire spread in fine fuels and could slow or stop the effective spread of a backing fire. The brush is dry enough that once ignited and sufficient heat is generated will carry fire well through the night especially if aligned with slope and wind. If firing is stopped, make sure that it's at a place that won't pose problems for the day shift tomorrow where winds are again expected to switch to west-southwest by mid-morning.

AIR OPERATIONS: Visibility for aircraft will be poor due to smoke in the Sisquoc River drainage and east of Hildreth Peak from late afternoon-early evening until aircraft shut down for the night.

SAFETY

• During the operational period keep informed on changes in weather and their relationship to fire behavior. Monitor and record temperature, relative humidity, wind speed and direction hourly. Fire will continue to spread actively in areas with relative humidity <20% and in alignment with slope and wind.

THE FIRST MISSION. Excerpts from the book "Wonderful Flying Machines", by Barrett Thomas Beard

Destiny was on **Commander Frank Erickson**'s side in December 1943 as he started the world's first helicopter school at Floyd Bennett Field, New York. The work of getting a flying machine, people trained, and most importantly for him, spreading an awareness of the peculiar capabilities of the helicopter throughout areas of leadership, all combined with a series of fates that pushed Erickson into the first mission.

A catastrophic event occurred on 3 January 1944 that inaugurated the helicopter in the humanitarian role. The Navy destroyer, USS TURNER, anchored off Sandy Hook, New Jersey, suffered an explosion shortly after six in the storm darkened pre-dawn hours. The blast, felt fifteen miles away was followed by a second explosion forty-seven minutes later sinking the ship. Many survivors were brought to the hospital at Sandy Hook. Large quantities of plasma were urgently needed. A blizzard blocked all aircraft flights and hampered ground delivery.

A noreastly storm sweeping the Atlantic coast with snow and sleet driven by 20 to 25 knot winds impeded rescue operations. All airfields in the region were closed. U.S Coast Guard Admiral Parker, from his Third Naval District headquarters in New York, remembering what he had earlier described as the remarkable performance telephoned Erickson asking if it would be practicable for a helicopter to pick up blood plasma at the New York City's waterfront Battery and fly it to Sandy Hook in the current weather. Erickson did not restrain his enthusiasm when he responded with a booming, Yes Sir! Neither he nor the helicopter had experience together in stormy conditions. However, this was his chance to prove his dream to the world.



- ❖ Sanitation Cases of "Camp Crud" are on the rise......be vigilant with hand washing & visit Med Unit. Adopt bear precautions at spike & coyote sites with prompt trash removal.
- ❖ Hydration is becoming critical with higher temps and lowering relative humidity. Be alert to heat stress in yourself and others. Drink water.

Common Denominators of Fire Behavior On Tragedy Fires

*Most incidents happen on the smaller fires or on Isolated portions of larger fires.

*Most fires are innocent in appearance before the "flareups" or "blow-ups". In some cases, tragedies occur in the mop-up stage.

*Flare-ups generally occur in deceptively light fuels.

*Fires run uphill surprisingly fast in <u>chimneys</u>, <u>gullies</u>, chutes and on steep slopes.

*Some suppression tools, such as helicopters or air tankers, can adversely affect fire behavior. The blasts of air from low flying helicopters and air tankers have been known to cause flare-ups.

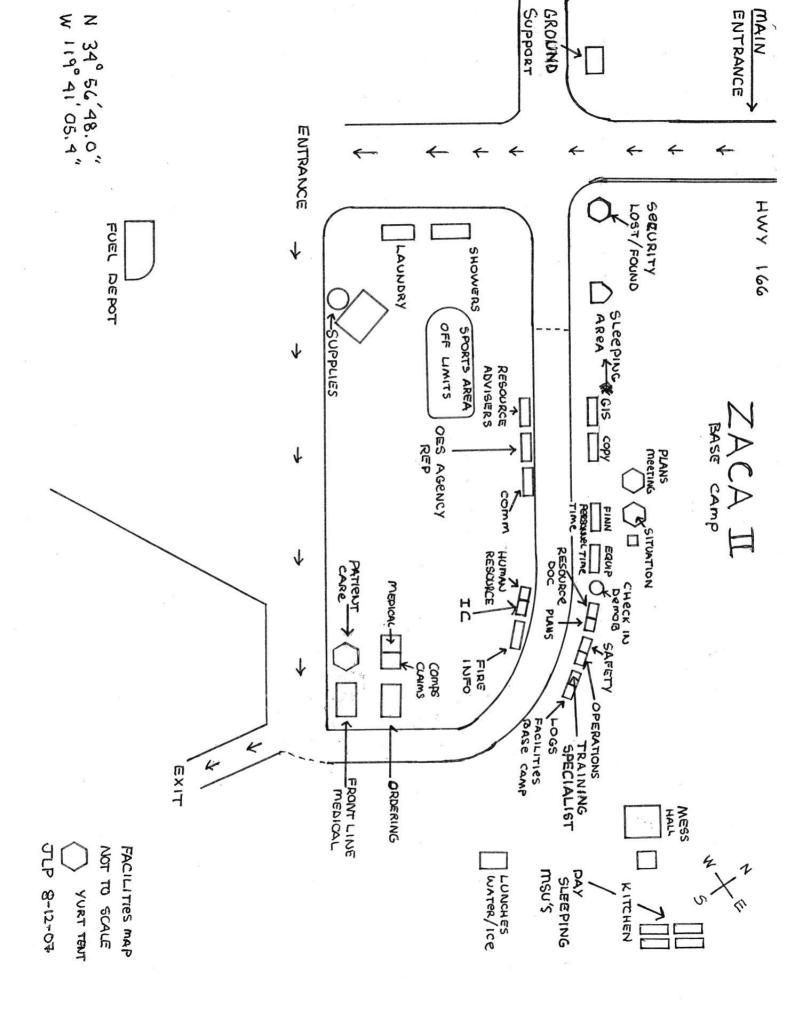

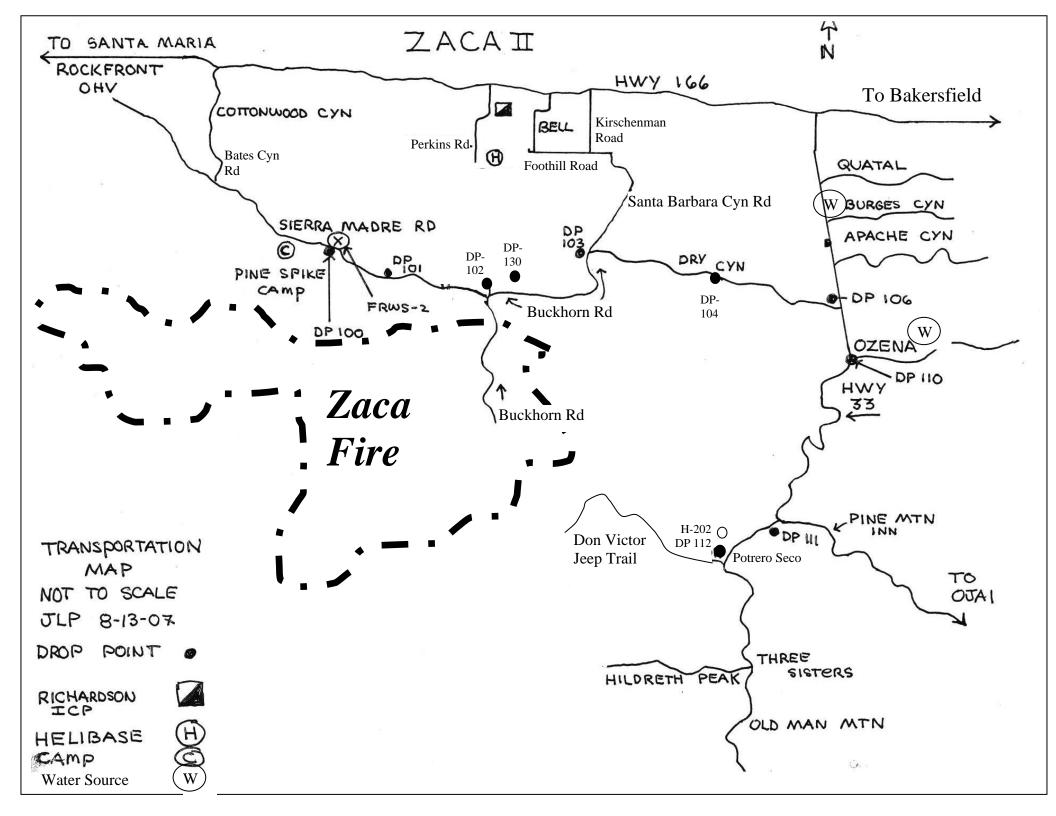
