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**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Persistent weather is expected across the fire during the operational period with high temperatures mostly in the 90s and minimum humidity in the teens. Typical slope and valley winds will continue...with some gusty upslope winds in the afternoon. Northerly winds will develop during the evening and overnight hours...with gusts around 20 mph possible at the ridgetops and through favorable drainages.

## **FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST**

### **GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

Once again the fire will remain fuels and topography driven. Upslope up canyon winds will determine the direction of fire spread. The fire has burned into Branch IX at Hildreth Peak. We will start getting better RH recovery at night so fire behavior will diminish. Were RH is below 25% expect torching. Spot fires from roll outs will continue to challenge containment. Fire progression will be mainly by flanking fire with short intense upslope runs where slope and fuels align. Down canyon winds during the night will push the fire down canyon. Where wind, slope and fuels align expect rates of spread to 100cph. With flame lengths of 30-60ft. Retardant has been effective holding the fire at fuel transitions.

### **SPECIFIC:**

#### **Branch V**

- No forward fire progression expected. Watch for hold over heat on steep slopes.
- Watch column if unburned islands ignite, spot fires are possible with column collapse.

#### **Branch VII**

- Expect the fire to continue to back into the Mono drainage.
- The fire will hold in the Ogivly burn scar.
- Watch for the potential of down slope runs at night.

#### **Branch IX**

- The fire has crossed into the Branch at Hildreth Peak.
- Fire progression will be by spot fires from roll outs with intense uphill runs.
- Watch for the potential of down slope runs at night.

**Air Operations:** Smoke from the fire will limit air operations until 1100-1200hrs.

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### **SAFETY:**

**Time tag your tactics to the fire behavior to allow adequate time to get to a safe area.**

**THE FIRST MISSION. Excerpts from the book "Wonderful Flying Machines", by Barrett Thomas Beard (Part 2 of 3)**

Erickson flying the Navy new HNS (Sikorsky R-4) , Buno 46445, with Ens. Walter Bolton as co-pilot struggled with the controls fighting the gusting winds tearing through the corridors of downtown Manhattan. The dark blue colored craft was but a shadow in the swirling snow. Visibility was so low, Erickson observed, "We practically had to 'feel' our way around the ships anchored in Gravesend Bay. He battled the roiling snow-turbid winds in a steep approach over pilings along the shoreline to a landing in Battery Park. Bolton, just qualified as a helicopter pilot three days before, reluctantly left the aircraft to allow for the weight of two cases of plasma strapped to the landing floats. Erickson noted the "only way to get out was to back out. His forward passage was blocked; he could not take-off normally, forward into the wind. Sitting in the helicopter's pilot seat parked next to the Barge Office on New York's waterfront, Erickson, with his left hand, rolled the hand-grip throttle. Gradually he raised the collective lever coordinating the twisting motions of his left hand and rising arm, watching closely that engine RPMs did not drop below 2150 or surge past 2250. The Warner R-550-3 Super Scarab engine provided him 200 horse power maximum. Erickson's hands, arms, and feet moved in an uncoordinated cacophony of motion. Anticipating needed rotor blade pitch for balance, he moved the cyclic stick with his right hand. Simultaneously, with deftness, but gently, he alternated foot pressure gradually applying left rudder pressure to counteract the torque, keeping the nose pointing straight ahead into the park. This strange seated dance of the helicopter pilot was a reaction to the irregular rhythm beat of the sudden and variable wind gusts pummeling the frail fabric and steel-tube structure. Steadily, he kept the shaking helicopter in place and level as it struggled to rise into battering winds.

# ***SAFETY MESSAGE***

## **ZACA – LIVE OAK BRANCH**

### **DAY/NIGHT OPERATIONAL PERIOD**

#### **General Safety Information:**

- ❖ **Spot Fires:** Watch green for possible spot fire up to ½ mile out.
- ❖ **Lookouts:** Establish Lookouts prior to engaging in firefighting operations.
- ❖ **Smoke:** Don't let smoke compromise your Lookouts.

**HYDRATION:** Studies conducted on wildland firefighters indicate that fire suppression activities generate about 7.5 kilocalories of heat each minute worked, or 450 kilocalories for each hour. Additional heat (about 180 kilocalories per hour) comes from the environment and the fire. In order to maintain a healthy body temperature, the firefighter needs to evaporate about 1 liter (slightly more than 1 quart) of sweat during each hour of work.

**HAZARD MITIGATIONS:** Before work you should take extra fluids to prepare for the heat. Drink 1 or 2 cups of water, juice, or a sport drink before work. Avoid excess caffeine; it hastens fluid loss in the urine. While working drink at least 1 quart of fluid per hour. Drink as much as you can during the lunch break. Water is your greatest need during work in the heat. Providing a portion of fluid replacement with a carbohydrate/electrolyte sport beverage will help you retain fluids and maintain energy and electrolyte levels.

After work it is important to continue drinking to replace fluid losses. Thirst always underestimates fluid needs, so you should drink more than you think you need. Re-hydration is enhanced when fluids contain sodium and potassium, or when foods with these electrolytes are consumed along with the fluid. Don't overdo salt intake; too much salt impairs temperature regulation and can cause stomach distress, fatigue, and other problems.

Make potassium-rich foods like bananas and citrus fruits a regular part of your diet, and drink lots of lemonade, orange juice, or tomato juice. Limit the amount of caffeine drinks such as coffee and colas because caffeine increases fluid loss. Avoid alcoholic drinks. They also cause dehydration.

You can assess your hydration by observing the volume, color, and concentration of your urine. Low volumes of dark, concentrated urine, or painful urination indicate a serious need for re-hydration. Other signs of dehydration include a rapid heart rate, weakness, excessive fatigue, and dizziness.
