WEATHER DISCUSSION: Persistent weather is expected across the fire during the operational period with high temperatures mostly in the 80s and minimum humidity in the teens and 20s. Typical slope and valley winds will continue through the period. Some northerly winds will develop during the evening and overnight hours with gusts around 15 mph likely at higher elevations.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly Clear. Areas of smoke.

TEMPS: Max 84-92 valleys/mid slopes...78-87 upper slopes/ridgetops.
Min 56-65 valleys/mid slopes...65-75 upper slopes/ridgetops.

Slope/valley winds...upslope/upvalley 6-12 mph with gusts to 22 mph late morning/afternoon...downslope/downvalley 3-6 mph with gusts to 10 mph evening through mid morning.

FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Once again the fire will remain fuels and topography driven. Upslope up canyon winds will determine the direction of fire spread during the day. Were RH is below 25% expect active burning with torching. Spot fires from roll outs will continue to challenge containment. Fire progression will be mainly by flanking fire with short intense upslope runs where slope and fuels align. Down canyon winds during the night will push the fire down canyon. Where wind, slope and fuels align expect rates of spread to 100cph. With flame lengths of 30-60ft. Retardant has been effective holding the fire at fuel transitions.

SPECIFIC:

Branch V

- No forward fire progression expected. Watch for hold over heat on steep slopes.

Branch VII

- Expect the fire to continue down the Mono drainage.
- The fire will hold in the Ogivly burn scar.
- Active down canyon movement should be expected all night.

Branch IX

- Fire is well established in Agua Caliente, expect runs towards Monte Arido.
- Fire progression will be by spot fires from roll outs with intense uphill runs.
- The fire will continue to burn down canyon all night long.

Air Operations: Smoke from the fire will limit air operations until 1100-1200hrs.

SAFETY:

Time tag your tactics to the fire behavior to allow adequate time to get to a safe area.

THE FIRST MISSION. Excerpts from the book "Wonderful Flying Machines", by Barrett Thomas Beard (Part 3 of 3)

Igor 's nightmare, bouncing on its sausage like floats, suddenly leaping, rose vertically. Slowly, still climbing, it backed over the pilings before finally spinning around to the right and heading downwind. Paradoxically, this maligned craft started it first mission flying backwards. It was an appropriate entry into history for the helicopter.

According to Erickson the "weather conditions were such that this flight could not have been made in any other type of aircraft. But for a helicopter, it was simple. So Erickson, with confidence in the helicopter, announced to the public that the flight was routine for the helicopter.

The casualness of his comments did not escape the press. [The New York Times, in an editorial dated January 6, 1944, echoed :](#)

It was indeed routine for the strange rotary-winged machine which Igor Sikorsky has brought to practical flight, but it shows in striking fashion how the helicopter can make use of tiny landing areas in conditions of visibility which make other types of flying impossible.

CUMULATIVE FATIGUE: We are now in our third straight month of high activity fire throughout the West. This has a significant cumulative effect on both ground and aviation operations. Crews have logged many hours on incidents including this incident, and are getting tired both mentally and physically. Please take the time to review, reinforce, and reiterate the practices that keep us safe on the road, in the air, and on the fireline. Please keep the remainder of your season safe and productive.

DRIVING SAFETY: A quick review of the 2007 Wildland fire safety data shows this has been difficult year for accidents, and most particularly for motor vehicle related accidents. Since March of this year there have been a number of driving-related incidents, including several in the past month. Incredibly, these accidents reveal that many firefighters are still not wearing their seatbelts. This is simply hard to understand and unacceptable from firefighters who know the risks. Driving is one of the most hazardous tasks in which firefighters engage. Because most of us drive every day, we tend to normalize the dangers involved. Add to that the stress of emergency response and cumulative fatigue and the risk of serious accidents increases. The busy weekend is here again for Hwy 154, anticipate traffic and drive defensively.

SMOKE & VISABILITY: Smoke has the potential to cause severe safety hazards. Visibility is reduced for working and driving. Crew supervisors should limit their crew to smoke exposure as much as possible. Rotate crewmembers in and out of the smoke as conditions dictate. Provide for rest breaks that are out of smoke if possible. Heavy exposures to smoke will contribute to the fatigue process, impair judgment.

BE ATTENTIVE TO YOUR SURROUNDINGS TODAY. BRIEF YOUR CREWS AT THE BEGINNING OF THE SHIFT AND AGAIN WHENEVER THE SITUATION OR CONDITIONS CHANGE. SATISFY LECS AT ALL TIMES; ALL CIRCUMSTANCES.
