WEATHER DISCUSSION: Upper trough of low pressure will weaken and allow a ridge of high pressure to re-build over the area beginning today. Transport winds will remain out of the southwest and be stronger during the morning hours promoting clearer skies...but the stubborn and persistent inversion will keep smoke locked in between 7,000 and 10,000 ft once the peak burning cycle begins (1300 PDT). Today will also mark the beginning of a warming and drying trend expected to last until Wednesday. However sufficient smoke over the fire area will tend to moderate temperatures and rh's during the afternoon.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Sunny, slightly warmer and drier...becoming smoky in the afternoon.

MAX TEMPS:

Ridgetops/Upper Slopes: 87 – 92

Lower Slopes/Drainage: 90 – 97

HUMIDITY:

42-52% at 0600...falling to 14-20% by 1000 and remaining within that range through early evening. Lower Min RH's ranging from 7 to 12% over Divisions FF,GG and HH.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP -

0600-1300 PDT...East and Northeast 4 - 8 mph.

1300-1900 PDT...Southwest to Northwest 4 - 8 mph

SLOPE/VALLEY -

Till 1200 PDT.....East or Downslope/Down valley 4-6 mph.

1200-1900 PDT...Southwest to Northwest or Upslope 4 - 6 mph

Stronger afternoon westerly gusts to 12 – 14 mph in alignment.

MIXING HEIGHT:

1st Inversion around 6000 ft...2nd and stronger inversion around 8,000 ft. Mixing height near 10,000 ft.

TRANSPORT WIND:

South Southwest 7 to 12 mph between 7000 and 10,000. Southwest 20 to 25 mph above 10,000 ft.

Monday:

Sunny, Hot and Drier. Highs 88-96 ridges...near 100 in valleys. Minimum Relative Humidity 6 to 12%. Ridge Winds...North Northeast 3-6 mph...gusts 12 mph. Slope / Drainage winds...west or upslope 4 to 8 mph with higher gusts to 14 mph along west to east orientated terrain.

Tuesday and Wednesday: Sunny...continued hot and dry. Highs 90 to 96 upper slopes...93-98 mid and lower slopes. Min RH: 6 to 12%...Max: 28-34%. Lows 58 to 66. Ridge winds: Northeast 4-7 mph night and morning. Northwest and southwest 3 to 5 mph with gusts 10 mph afternoons. Slope winds: upslope or west 5 to 8 mph...gust 12 mph in alignment.

Thursday: Sunny and slightly cooler. Highs 85-93. Min RH 16-24%. Night and Morning winds east northeast or Downslope 4 to 7 mph. Daytime winds North Northwest 4 to 7 mph.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: *See attached Fire Weather Forecast*

A re-building of a high-pressure ridge will bring warmer and drier conditions, with SW transport winds stronger than yesterday. The upper level inversion will persist, limiting vertical column development over active fires. Smoke over the fire area will provide partial shading in the afternoon, moderating the temps and RH.

PROBABILITY OF IGNITION = 70-80% at lower elevations, 80-90% at upper elevations
 Live Fuel Moistures are below critical levels - about 49% at Reyes Creek/Ozena, taken August 1

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Continued low RH, warm temperatures, exceptionally dry, heavy fuels, and alignment with wind and slope will produce intense fire behavior. Fuel conditions are potentially very volatile. Erratic fire behavior, such as firewhirls and spotting, has been observed daily and should be expected today. Spotting distances of up to 1,000 ft. are possible. Enhanced solar heating of fuels will favor earlier fire activity, rapid fire growth and intense burning conditions. A shift in winds to westerly/southwesterly in the early afternoon will impact firing operations and holding on multiple Divisions.

SPECIFIC:

Branch XXV:

Division BB – The fire has moved steadily down the Sisquoc drainage yesterday despite westerly winds. Expect runs in Forester’s Leap Cyn. and other smaller drainages where alignment is favorable. Be prepared for easterly/down-valley winds again in the morning. Conditions may become more favorable for firing operations when winds switch to W and SW, but winds and fire spread have been erratic in the bottom of the main drainage. Crews constructing line should continually assess their location relative to the active fire, monitor fire behavior and movement, and changes in weather and fire behavior.

Division CC and DD – With the RH dropping early in the morning, firing operations in light fuels should carry well along the dozerline after about 1000h. Sun exposure of fuels through early afternoon may help overcome the effects of improved higher RH recovery at night. Downcanyon/valley winds may be favorable for firing operations earlier, but with the stronger W-SW winds later in the afternoon, there is potential for firing to spot over the line. A more westerly wind could also align with upper portions of the drainages below the Sierra Madre, increasing fire activity and promoting intense uphill runs. With the warming and drying trend starting today, firing operations will have a wider window of opportunity, starting after 1000h and continuing later into the afternoon, and fire may not carry well through the fine fuels after late afternoon. Shading from smoke in the afternoon may limit effectiveness of firing operations later in the day.

Division EE – Firing operations will be most effective in the late morning to mid-afternoon with the forecast RH and winds. W-SW winds will challenge holding resources; watch for possible spots crossing the line with forecasted winds. Late in the afternoon, shading from smoke and RH >25% will limit effectiveness of firing operations.

Branch XXVIII:

Division FF (North and South) – Expect winds similar to yesterday; E and NE winds earlier in the day will be favorable for firing operations, and expect a shift to stronger and more westerly winds by about 1400h. A persistent upper inversion will limit vertical column development and cause smoke to accumulate, partially shading the fuels.

Division GG – Downslope winds should be favorable for firing and holding in the morning. Drainages will be in alignment with westerly winds in the afternoon, and intense runs with spotting are likely in unburned fuels. Westerly winds will also challenge holding actions.

Division HH and Live Oak Div. KK – Easterly winds through mid-afternoon will help with holding actions. Watch for flare-ups of remaining hot spots with the shift to westerly winds after 1400h.

AIR OPERATIONS: Expect good visibility around Richardson Helibase and the retardant base. Visibility will be poor in the Sisquoc River and along the Sierra Madre Ridge around Judell Canyon after 1000.

SAFETY

- All fuelbeds are carrying fire very well – don’t expect drainages/riparian vegetation to check fire spread.
- Fire activity should start early due to early drops in RH in the morning.
- As firing progress, it is important to be continually aware of the fire’s status and location, your location in relation to drainages/canyons and the fire, and how fire behavior and weather are changing.

DRIVING MEDICAL PLAN FIRE BEHAVIOR MOP UP STRUCTURE PROTECTION

DRIVING: Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive with headlights on; use chock blocks, keep windshields clean; look before backing; and use backers whenever available. Drive at a speed so you can stop within one half of your visible distance. Don't drive when fatigued. Adhere to agency driving regs and guidelines. Be alert for wildlife, heavy trucks, & high speed opposing and over-taking traffic. Check for fast moving traffic approaching from behind when making left turns. Increase following distances on dusty roads. Slow down when you meet opposing traffic or encounter washboard surfaces. **Maintain Situational Awareness!**

MEDICAL PLAN: Have you taken the time to review the Medical Plan? Now is a good time. Stop and review the procedures before an emergency arises. Make sure all of your EMS people know the protocols for getting HELP.

FIRE BEHAVIOR: Review "Severe Fire Behavior Potential" (IRPG p.76). Monitor current weather conditions and forecasts. Expect the unexpected. Make sure all personnel receive thorough briefings every shift. Be observant for indicators of severe fire behavior. Maintain adequate escape routes and safety zones. Advise all personnel if these are compromised or changed. Set trigger points when appropriate. Adhere to the 10 Std Orders and mitigate any of the 18 situations you find present. **Maintain Situational Awareness!**

MOP-UP OPERATIONS: Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel (inside rear cover IRPG). Use all required PPE, including eye protection. Maintain proper spacing and overhead clearance. Be alert for stump holes and root cavities. Minimize exposure to smoke, and rotate personnel into clean air when practical. Evaluate unburned islands. **Maintain Situational Awareness!**

STRUCTURE PROTECTION ISSUES: Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel (inside rear cover IRPG). Utilize Structure Assessment Checklist (IRPG p.14). Follow Structure Protection Guidelines (IRPG p. 16). Utilize hazmat IC Checklist (IRPG p. 26). **Maintain Situational Awareness!**

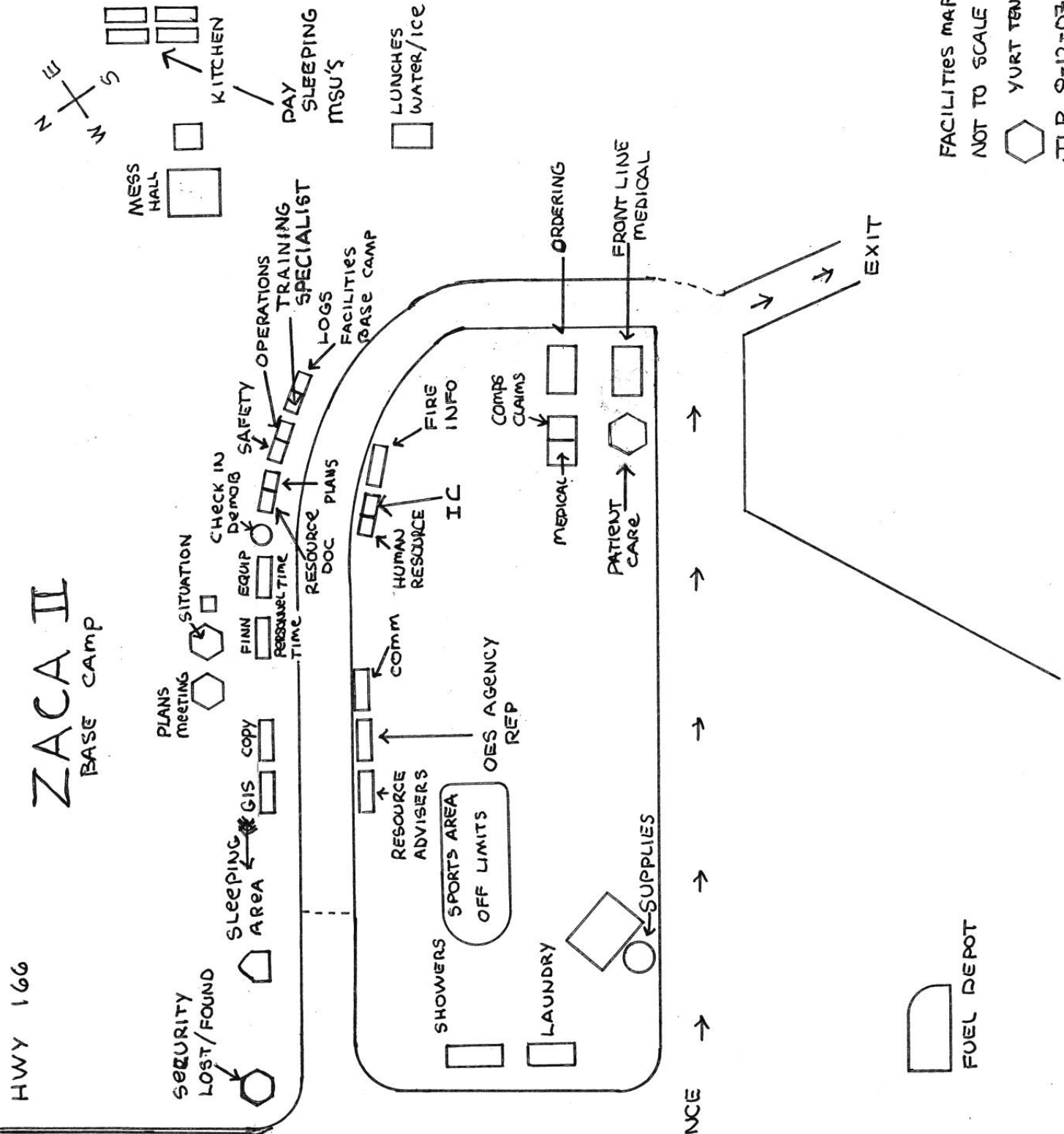
