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### **WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

#### **...Red Flag Warning Today through Wednesday Evening for Very Low Relative Humidity...**

A ridge of high pressure will remain over the region through at least Wednesday. The stubborn and persistent inversion will keep smoke locked in between 8,000 and 10,000 ft once the peak burning cycle begins (1300 PDT). Temperatures will warm a few more degrees today then little change expected through Wednesday. Relative humidities will drop rapidly after sunrise and will remain in the single digits through mid afternoon. Sufficient smoke over the fire area will tend to moderate temperatures and RH's later in the afternoon. Winds will continue to be terrain driven.

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### **WEATHER FORECAST:**

**WEATHER:** Sunny, hot and very dry...becoming smoky in the afternoon.

**MAX TEMPS:**

**Ridgetops/Upper Slopes:** 87 – 93

**Lower Slopes/Drainage:** 93 – 98

**HUMIDITY:** 20-30% at 0600...falling to 5-12% by 0800 and remaining within that range through 1500 PDT then rising slightly as smoke covers the area. Some areas will see minimum humidity 2-4%.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** 0600-1000 PDT...Northeast to East 4-8 mph.  
1000-1900 PDT...Southwest to Northwest 4-8 mph with gusts to 14 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Till 1000 PDT.....East or Downslope/Down valley 3-6 mph.  
1000-1900 PDT....Southwest to Northwest or Upslope 4-7 mph  
Stronger afternoon westerly gusts to 12-15 mph  
in alignment.

**MIXING HEIGHT:** Inversion around 8000 ft. Mixing height near 10,000 ft.

**TRANSPORT WIND:** Southwest to west 5-10 mph between 7000 and 10,000. West  
8-12 mph above 10,000 ft.

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### **Wednesday:**

Sunny, hot and very dry. Highs 87-93 ridges...93-98 lower slopes. Minimum Relative Humidity 5-10%. Ridge Winds...Northwest to North 3-7 mph...gusts to 14 mph. Slope / Drainage winds...west or upslope 4-8 mph with higher gusts to 14 mph along west to east orientated terrain.

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**Thursday through Saturday:** Sunny. Highs 83-89 upper slopes...89-94 mid and lower slopes. Min RH: 10-15%. Lows 58-66. Max RH: 30-40%. Ridge winds: Northeast 4-7 mph night and morning. Southwest to northwest 3-5 mph with gusts to 14 mph in the afternoon. Slope winds: upslope or west 5-8 mph...gusts to 14 mph in alignment.

## **RED FLAG WARNING THROUGH WEDNESDAY EVENING FOR VERY LOW RH's'**

**MIN RH:** 5-12% - **SLIGHTLY LOWER THAN YESTERDAY**  
**MAX TEMP:** 87 - 93 on ridge top slightly cooler in the valley **SIMILAR TO YESTERDAY**  
**WINDS (20 FT):** SW TO NW 4-8G14 on ridge tops UPSLOPE/UP CANYON ELSEWHERE

**PROBABILITY OF IGNITION** = 70-80% at lower elevations, 80-90% at upper elevations  
Live Fuel Moistures are below critical levels - about 49% at Reyes Creek/Ozena, taken August 1

**GENERAL: Red Flag Warning:** Single digit RH's will enhance burning conditions earlier in the morning and continue throughout the day until the main part of the fire receives shading from the smoke column. Continued low RH, warm temperatures, exceptionally dry, heavy fuels, and alignment with wind and slope will produce intense fire behavior. Fuel conditions are volatile. Erratic fire behavior, such as fire whirls and spotting, has been observed daily and should be expected today. Spotting distances of up to 1,000-2,000 ft. are possible

### **Branch XXV:**

**Division AA/ BB** – Expect active fire behavior throughout the day as this part of the fire will remain under the influence of an upslope/up canyon winds up the Sisquoc River drainage. East aspect slopes should see fire first thing in the morning. As the day progresses, west aspects that have heavy fuels will tend to make runs to the top of the Sierra Madre Ridge. Should spot fires develop on the back side of the Sierra Madre they will fall out of alignment with slope and aspect. Expect easterly/down-valley winds in the morning becoming NW as the day begins to heat up. All open flame that develops in the river bottom has the potential to make solid runs to the top of the ridge.

**Division CC/DD**– The unburned island has the greatest potential to develop short runs to the north that could threaten the line due to the shallow depth of the blackline. Due to the extremely low RH's watch for crown fire development should winds develop a southwesterly component. A more westerly wind could also align with upper portions of the drainages below the Sierra Madre, increasing fire activity and promoting intense uphill runs. With the warming and drying trend in place, firing operations will have a wider window of opportunity, and continuing later into the early evening. Shading from smoke in the afternoon may limit effectiveness of firing operations.

**Division EE** – Due to extremely low RH's in the morning expect flare-ups near the line to spot across the road and make short runs up the hill. If this section of line receives heavy smoke cover, expect fire behavior to moderate significantly. Firing operations will be most effective when RH's reach mid to upper teens. Late in the day, shading from smoke and RH >25% may limit effectiveness of firing operations.

### **Branch XXVIII:**

**Division FF (North and South)** Pay particular attention to RH's that drop to below 12% as this will cause increase in erratic fire behavior and spotting problems under a southwest flow pattern that could loft brands on the north side of the road. Firing operations along the base of the slopes with single digit RH's will likely develop into a head fire. Expect part of this division to be shaded by the main smoke column later in the day raising the RH's to upper teens and low 20's

**Division GG** – Due to successful firing operations and the ability to burnout unburned fuels on a mid-slope road, this has reduced the potential for slope driven runs to threaten the line. Expect pockets of fuel to continue to show active fire behavior by making short runs upslope towards the line. Watch for spots that could cross the line should momentum carry heat and fire brands across the line.

**Division HH**– Easterly winds through mid-afternoon will help with holding actions. Watch for flare-ups of remaining hot spots with the shift to westerly winds in the afternoon.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Expect good visibility around Richardson Helibase and the retardant base.

### **SAFETY**

- ✓ Pay particular attention to all open flames that develop during single digit RH's
- ✓ Fire activity should start early due to early drops in RH in the morning, with active burning.
- ✓ As firing progress, it is important to be continually aware of the fire's status and location, your location in relation to drainages/canyons and the fire, and how fire behavior and weather are changing.

## Day Shift Safety Message

### August 21<sup>th</sup> 2007

**FIRE BEHAVIOR   DRIVING   STRUCTURE PROTECTION   HYDRATION   MOP-UP**

**FIRE BEHAVIOR:** We are currently under a **Red Flag Warning** for very low humidity's and high temperatures This is expected to last till Wednesday night. Expect the unexpected on all line assignments. Have a "Plan B" set up in case things go sour and make sure all resources understand the plan and what is expected of them. Everyone should get a thorough briefing. Review "Severe Fire Behavior Potential" (IRPG p.76) and be observant for indicators of severe fire behavior. Maintain adequate escape routes and safety zones. Advise all personnel if these are compromised or changed. **Maintain Situational Awareness!**

**DRIVING:** Drive defensively! Make sure to keep your speed down on Highways 166 and 33. When parking out on the line, be sure there is enough room for even large apparatus to get by easily. Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive with headlights on; use chock blocks, keep windshields clean; look before backing; and use backers whenever available. Drive at a speed so you can stop within one half of your visible distance. **Maintain Situational Awareness!**

**STRUCTURE PROTECTION ISSUES:** Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel (inside rear cover IRPG). Utilize Structure Assessment Checklist (IRPG p.14). Follow Structure Protection Guidelines (IRPG p. 16). Utilize hazmat IC Checklist (IRPG p. 26). **Maintain Situational Awareness!**

**HYDRATION:** Drink water before, during and after shifts, up to 1.5 gallons per shift. Be alert for signs of dehydration and heat stress in yourself and others. Mix liquid intake at two or three to one water to sports drinks such as Gatoraide. Avoid energy drinks such as Red Bull, Nitro, etc. These will actually dehydrate you.

**MOP-UP OPERATIONS:** Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel (inside rear cover IRPG). Use all required PPE, including eye protection. Maintain proper spacing and overhead clearance. Be alert for stump holes and root cavities. Minimize exposure to smoke, and rotate personnel into clean air when practical. Evaluate unburned islands. **Maintain Situational Awareness!**
