WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Weak high pressure will be over the fire area the next few days with a southerly flow aloft. Moisture from the remnants of Hurricane Dean will move into the fire area today and continue through Sunday. Some cumulus clouds are possible this afternoon. Then mid and high level clouds will move in tonight and Sunday. Cooler temperatures and higher humidities can be expected Sunday. Some residual moisture will remain Monday. Warmer and drier conditions will return Tuesday and Wednesday.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly sunny. A few cumulus developing in the afternoon.

MAX TEMPS:

WINDS (20 FT): SSW 5-8G18 SIMILAR TO YESTERDAY

GENERAL: SAME CONDITIONS AS YESTERDAY – EXPECT EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR WHEN RH'S REACH LOW TEENS TO SINGLE DIGITS. Temperatures are slightly higher and humidities are lower. Humidities are at critical levels favoring extreme fire behavior. Winds in deep, narrow canyons will be very erratic and unpredictable.

Branch XXIII:

Division AA/BB – Diurnal winds will dominate early but will be dominated by general winds from the SSW by late morning. The SSW winds will enhance diurnal winds on the upper 1/3 of the slopes. Slope driven runs are still likely in patches of unburned vegetation especially in the late afternoon. Fuels in the lower third of the drainage bottom are becoming sparse and discontinuous and less susceptible to fire spread.

Branch XXV

Division CC/DD/EE– With RH's in the low teens and single digits EXPECT FIRE BEHAVIOR TO BE EXTREME. Areas of unburned vegetation and areas that do not have CLEAN black have the potential to reburn. Fire spread will be dictated by general winds from the south/southwest and will tend to want to travel downslope in the major drainages that are aligned in a north/south direction. Winds will want to funnel from the fire through Santa Barbara Canyon.

Branch XXVII:

Division FF North: The main fire edge is now on the eastern aspect facing HWY33 and is backing around the slope to the next major canyon north of Brubaker Canyon. Vegetation in this area is more continuous and will continue to work its way around to the north/northeast aspect. Direct heating on this slope will occur first thing in the morning promoting active fire behavior when RH's reach lower teens. The key to retard fire spread in this area will be to keep the fire from flaring up and establishing a run. Once a run is initiated, direct attack with airtankers and helicopters may be very difficult to halt forward spread on steep slopes. EXPECT FIRE BEHAVIOR TO BE EXTREME when RH's reach 10% and below.

Division FF South: Most of the vegetation from the interior to the dry wash has burned clean from Ozena Spike north towards Brubaker Canyon. This will reduce fire behavior considerably unless the fire gets established in pockets of unburned vegetation. This area will continue to experience battling winds as the general winds will want to scour out the head of the drainage beginning at Ozena spike working north. As daytime heating progresses, expect to see upvalley winds develop from HWY166 and work its way south through the valley. Winds throughout this division will be variable and very erratic. Watch the residual smoke for signs of changing wind directions. Small runs could still be possible in the flats pushed by erratic winds. Pay particular attention to potential spots that could still be undetected on the west side of HWY33.

Division GG – Mop-up and patrol along both this division has limited the potential for flare-ups near the line. Flare-ups are still possible interior where large islands of unburned vegetation remain.

AIR OPERATIONS: Richardson Helibase may be impacted by lingering smoke due to the general winds from the south. Firing operations will produce thick smoke and may limit fix wing operations where production is greatest.






