Division CC/DD/EE – This is a critical portion of the line to ensure no lingering heat exists in the next few days. This area will be prone to developing flare-upS and small runs that could spot across the line on the northside of the containment line and develop into a large run. All heat near the line needs to be suppressed if it is to withstand anticipated single digit RH's in the coming days. Seek out the small heat pockets under dense unburned vegetation to ensure flare-up do not occur.

Division FF North: These 2 slopovers need to be sure all the heat is out of the edge in order to withstand single digit RH's towards the end of the week. Dirty burns will tend to hold heat and quickly develop into flare-ups which will initiate slope and fuels driven runs. SSW winds will enhance daytime upslope winds and may be higher than the predicted winds. The history of winds in Dry and Brubaker Canyon are very unpredictable especially with higher, sustained winds.

Branch XXVII:

Division FF South: HWY 33 is still an area of concern and will continue to show smokes when RH's begin to drop. Reduce any potential for flare-ups when RH's reach mid-teens with sustained winds that could generate small runs that might spot across HWY33. Expect very erratic winds as they funnel up through Bear Canyon as the upper reaches of this canyon contains unburned vegetation. Fire behavior along the Cuyuma drainage should remain relatively low.

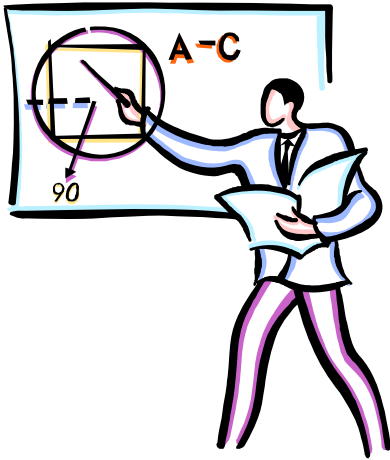
Division GG/HH – No significant fire activity expected today. Flare-ups are still possible interior where large islands of unburned vegetation remain.

- Arrange for a trainer qualified in the position you are learning

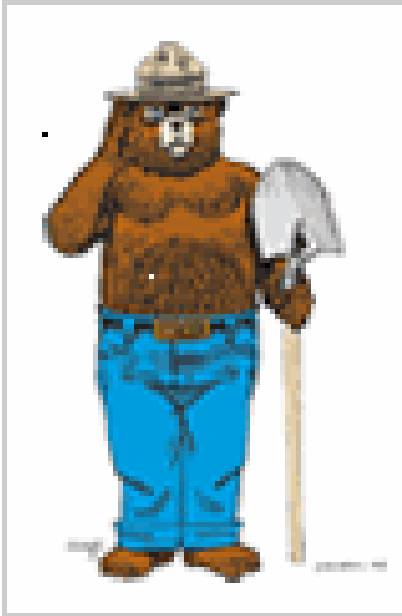
