...HOT AND DRY WEATHER COMING THIS WEEK...

DISCUSSION...LEFT OVER MOISTURE AND WEAK INSTABILITY IS CAUSING SOME AFTERNOON CLOUDS AND ISOLATED SHOWERS AND POSSIBLE THUNDERSTORMS TO DEVELOP OVER THE MOUNTAINS TODAY. ALL ACTIVITY IS EXPECTED TO DISSIPATE SHORTLY AFTER SUNSET.

HUMIDITIES WERE WELL ABOVE CRITICAL LEVELS TODAY DUE TO THE MOISTURE FROM DEAN. HOWEVER, AS HIGH PRESSURE BUILDS ACROSS SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA THIS WEEK, AFTERNOON TEMPERATURES WILL BECOME PROGRESSIVELY WARMER AND HUMIDITIES WILL FALL. BY THURSDAY AND FRIDAY HUMIDITIES WILL BE DROPPING INTO THE TEENS AND POSSIBLY AS LOW AS 10 PERCENT FOR A FEW HOURS. MEANWHILE, AFTERNOON TEMPERATURES ARE EXPECTED TO CLIMB TO 105 TO 110 IN THE WARMEST INLAND LOCATIONS THURSDAY AND FRIDAY.

WINDS WILL GENERALLY BE LIGHT THROUGH THE WEEK. THE MAIN EXCEPTION IS THE POSSIBILITY FOR GUSTY EVENING AND MORNING NORTHERLY WINDS TUESDAY NIGHT THROUGH THURSDAY MORNING THROUGH THE Santa Barbara COUNTY MOUNTAINS AND ASSOCIATED COASTAL PASSES AND CANYONS THROUGH THE SANTA YNEZ RANGE. THE STRONGEST WINDS ARE EXPECTED WEDNESDAY NIGHT THROUGH THURSDAY MORNING. THE COMBINATION OF GUSTY WINDS AND VERY WARM TEMPERATURES AND LOW HUMIDITIES WILL CREATE HAZARDOUS FIRE WEATHER CONDITIONS AND MAY PROMPT THE ISSUANCE OF A FIRE WEATHER WATCH TUESDAY OR WEDNESDAY.

ELSEWHERE, THOUGH HUMIDITIES WILL BE VERY LOW AND TEMPERATURES APPROACHING 110 DEGREES IN THE WARMEST INTERIOR LOCATIONS THURSDAY AND FRIDAY, RED FLAG CONDITIONS ARE NOT EXPECTED FOR MORE THAN A FEW HOURS. HOT AND DRY WEATHER IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE THROUGH THE WEEKEND, THOUGH TEMPERATURES SHOULD DROP A COUPLE DEGREES FROM FRIDAY'S HIGHS.

Weather

Warmer and dryer compared to yesterday as the high pressure builds across S. California. RH 18%, high temps could reach 102 around 3000 ft. General winds will be upslope/up-valley in the morning and SW in the afternoon with possible strong northerly gusts by 1800. Expect strong upslope winds in areas where the general winds are inhibited by topography. **ERC** – 66 at about 96th percentile.

Fire Behavior

General:

Keep monitoring unburned fuels between the fire and the line, there are several pockets that continue to hold heat although they may not be easily visible. Where wind, slope and fuels align expect rates of spread to be from **100 - 250 ch/hr**. Flame lengths could reach **25-40ft**. Daily upslope winds are dependant on solar heating and shading, therefore aspect becomes very important to monitor throughout the day. Competing upslope and general winds may cause erratic fire behavior.

Specific:

Div Q & Div TT – The heat in the unburned fuels in both divisions is mainly on a Northerly aspect. With the predicted Northerly winds in the late afternoon, the potential for flare-ups and short runs is moderately high. These divisions still need to be monitored throughout the day. Although these areas may get active, the likelihood of threats to the line is low.

Richardson Zone or initial attack - Live fuel moistures continue to be at record lows throughout Southern California. This combined with the low RH and potential probability of ignition today could lead to extreme fire behavior. Winds will be similar to the Live Oak side today (see weather discussion). Fuels on this side of the fire are slightly different than the Live Oak side, but are equally as dry and can burn equally as intense.

Air Operations: Air operations may be hampered by some gusty winds in the afternoon.

Safety: The combination of weather (hot, dry, gusty winds) and fuels (very dry live fuels, drought conditions) leaves us in extreme fire weather conditions. Be aware of your surroundings and be careful when working in unburned vegetation not to cause new fire starts.

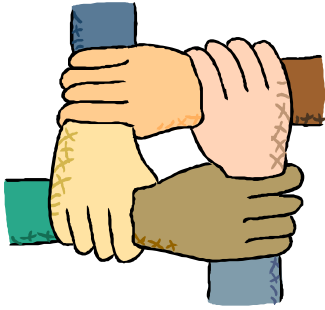
