Some hotspots are still being detected by IR but many go undetected due to heavy brush and heat that lingers deep underground in dead roots wads.

Branch XXV

Division FF North: Heavy mop-up over the last several days has limited the amount of heat that is detectable next to the line. IR is not picking all of the hotspots next to the line. Most of this area burned clean on the interior. Any lingering heat will be a concern on the flanks where heavy retardant was dropped that may burn under and though the retardant if not extinguished.

Lookout Group: Several hotspots near the line are still being worked. There is still some lingering heat on the back side in a steep draw that is difficult to access. These hotspots on the backside of the ridge is out of alignment but will still pose concerns when RH's drop to single digits. This heat source will continue to burn downslope if not extinguished..

Branch XXVII:

Division FF South: No significant fire activity expected today. Flare-ups are still possible in pockets of unburned vegetation.

Division GG/HH – No significant fire activity expected today. Watch for isolated activity when RH's drop to low teens and single digits.

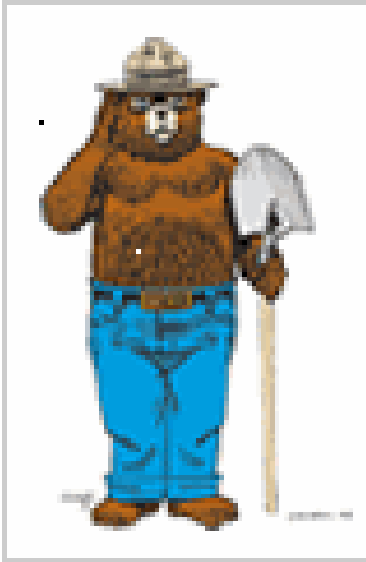

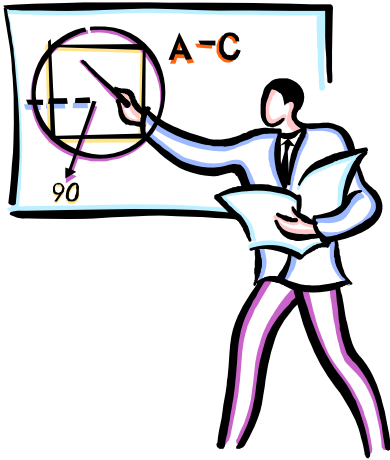
