.DISCUSSION...A STRONG UPPER LEVEL HIGH PRESSURE SYSTEM WILL BUILD
ACROSS THE REGION DURING THE NEXT FEW DAYS. IT APPEARS SOME MID
LEVEL MOISTURE WILL MOVE INTO THE REGION THROUGH TODAY. THIS SHOULD
BRING SOME AFTERNOON CLOUDS TO THE AREA. HOWEVER...THERE IS THE VERY
SLIM CHANCE A STRAY ELEVATED SHOWER COULD DEVELOP WITH LITTLE IF ANY
PRECIPITATION REACHING THE GROUND. TRIPLE DIGIT HEAT IS EXPECTED TO
CONTINUE OVER THE LOWER TO MID ELEVATIONS OF THE BURN AREA TODAY.
EYE LEVEL WINDS SHOULD BE GENERALLY LESS THAN 10 MPH. HOWEVER...ANY
STRAY SHOWER COULD BE ACCOMPANIED WITH BRIEF GUSTY WINDS AT TIMES IN
THE AFTERNOON. HUMIDITIES WILL REMAIN RATHER LOW TODAY WITH READINGS

Weather

Today sunny in the morning becoming partly cloudy in the afternoon. Temperature around 100, RH =15-25%, Eye level winds= East Northeast in the morning 2-5 mph. **Becoming** South by early afternoon 4-8 mph. Ridgetop winds Northeast 4-8mph in the morning Becoming Southeast to South by early afternoon 5-10 mph with gusts to 15.

Fire Behavior:

General:

The fire has been in-active near control lines. Hard work by crews and excellent mop up standards have maintained the current fire perimeter. Several deep interior islands continue to produce smokes in heavy down fuels and snags. Poor night recoveries have kept these smokes alive.

Live fuel moisture = 50%- 60%.

Burn Index=116. Fire Danger Index= Extreme PBI= 100%

Specific:

Interior Islands will continue to produce smoke in heavy fuels. With the extreme fire danger index today an isolated headfire fun may develop by early afternoon. Flame lengths of 30-50 feet can be anticipated. The smokes that were identified near H27 and three sisters pose no threat to the line.

With the second day of an extreme fire danger index more smokes have the potential to materialize.

Initial Attack (SITUATIONAL AWARENESS)

Head fire will not be conducive to direct attack. Safe engagement practices must be identified on the observed and predicted fire behavior.

Air Operations: Good visibility today.

Safety:

- **Observe the fire behavior for fire suppression engagement**
- **A new start may develop more abrupt than anticipated**
- **Identify a solid anchor point and safety zones.**
- **Situational Awareness needs to be a top priority= Safety**
