Watch the rocks and debris in the roadway. Use turnouts; manage parking areas to avoid bottlenecks and increasing hazardous situations. These roadways are very unforgiving.
- ✓ **Personal Protective Equipment**— Not much fire out there anymore but the potential still exists for I. A. or green islands taking off. Don't take shortcuts and don't forget your eye protection when needed, we already had one eye injury yesterday lets not have any more.
- ✓ **Take Care of Your Personal Health**—pace your work, eat well and push yourself to drink fluids, take a shower,

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## REMEMBER

Your tailgate safety sessions are the best place for clarifying your hazards/risks/and needed mitigations. Update your mitigation as conditions change.

### Heat stress under these conditions can kill—

- Drink water and sports drink 2 hours before you work.
- Consume one quart of fluid (water and sports drink) for every hour of work.
- Limit your caffeine intake.
