**GENERAL: A WARM DRY TREND HAS SETTLED IN:** . Fuels that remain are unburned islands of green vegetation that have potential to flare-up and initiate a run during peak burning conditions especially when RH reaches low teens to single digits. At this point, potential fire behavior will consist of a single or several ignition points around the fire perimeter especially with the general wind flow pattern – most vulnerable will be DIV DD, North FF and South FF along HWY 33. Live and dead vegetation (due to very low fuel moisture) is still extremely receptive to fire brands.

## **ALL BRANCHES AND DIVISIONS:**

The unburned “Green” islands were tested yesterday as relative humidity reached lower teens and single digits.

Sisquoc drainage reported RH between 6 and 8 percent from 0930 – 1330. These low RHs are a trigger point for potential extreme fire behavior. Even under these conditions most of the areas that had potential to flare-up and make major runs produced only light smoke.

All areas of the fire will become active under these conditions IF there is available vegetation to burn

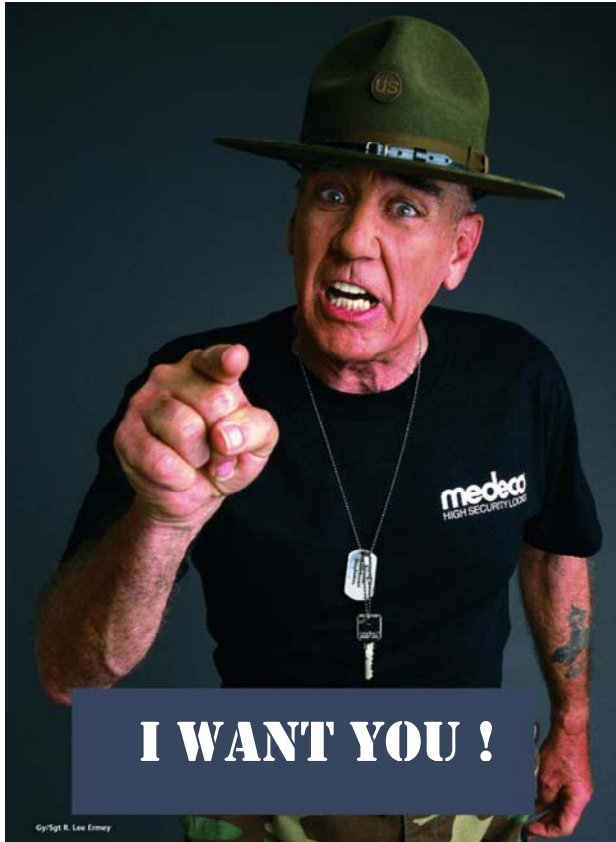
