**GENERAL:** A WARM DRY TREND HAS SETTLED IN: . Fuels that remain are unburned islands of green vegetation that have potential to flare-up and initiate a run during peak burning conditions especially when RH reaches low teens to single digits. At this point, potential fire behavior will consist of a single or several ignition points around the fire perimeter especially with the general wind flow pattern – most vulnerable will be DIV DD, North FF and South FF along HWY 33. Live and dead vegetation (due to very low fuel moisture) is still extremely receptive to fire brands.

### **ALL BRANCHES AND DIVISIONS:**

The unburned "Green" islands were tested yesterday as relative humidity reached lower teens and single digits.

Sisquoc drainage reported RH between 6 and 8 percent from 0930 – 1330. These low RHs are a trigger point for potential extreme fire behavior. Even under these conditions most of the areas that had potential to flare-up and make major runs produced only light smoke.

All areas of the fire will become active under these conditions IF there is available vegetation to burn



### **MAJOR HAZARDS AND RISKS:**

**Fire Behavior** – Still potential for fire activity, extremely dry fuel conditions, > 50 year old dense chaparral, unburned fuels between you and fire, steep topography and canyon systems, monitor fire weather and indicators of extreme fire behavior potential.

**Monitor Crews** for fatigue, keep good personal hygiene an important briefing topic, it really work in knocking down any communicable health problems..

**Heavy Equipment** – Park completely off roads, When approaching, make sure the operator can see you.

Chipper--Insure all crew people cover the Chipper JHA prior to using this piece of machinery.

STEEP TERRAIN - can significantly increases risk for equipment, increase crews working distance as slope increases.

BEARS- They have been seen throughout incident- keep your area clean of all garbage.

### Watch Out Situation of the Day Heavy Equipment

Crews must be briefed on procedure for working around heavy equipment, dozers, excavators, chippers. Operators of the equipment need to be part of the briefing and describe where and how crews can safely work with the equipment. Topics should include blind spots, distance to keep away, hand signals, battery shut offs.

### **Driving**

**DRIVING:** Drive defensively! Make sure to keep your speed down on Highways 166 and 33. When parking out on the line, be sure there is enough room for even large equipment to get by easily. Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive with headlights on;, keep windshields clean; look before backing; and use backers whenever available. Drive at a speed so you can stop within one half of your visible distance.
