Human Resources

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Just as accident rates tend to increase at this juncture of a large incident, so do human resource contacts and complaints of inappropriate behavior, harassment, and discrimination.

- the fire is winding down
- people are fatigued and ready to go home (yay!...demob)
- people are more easily irritated
- people have more time to thing about things that upset them

Be aware of this tendency and make the necessary effort to recognize and deal with situations before they get out of control and become conflicts.

As a result of your efforts thus far, there have been no major conflicts on this incident. The IC team appreciates your cooperation.
