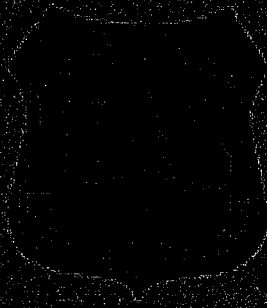
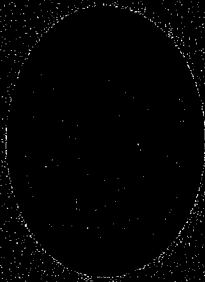


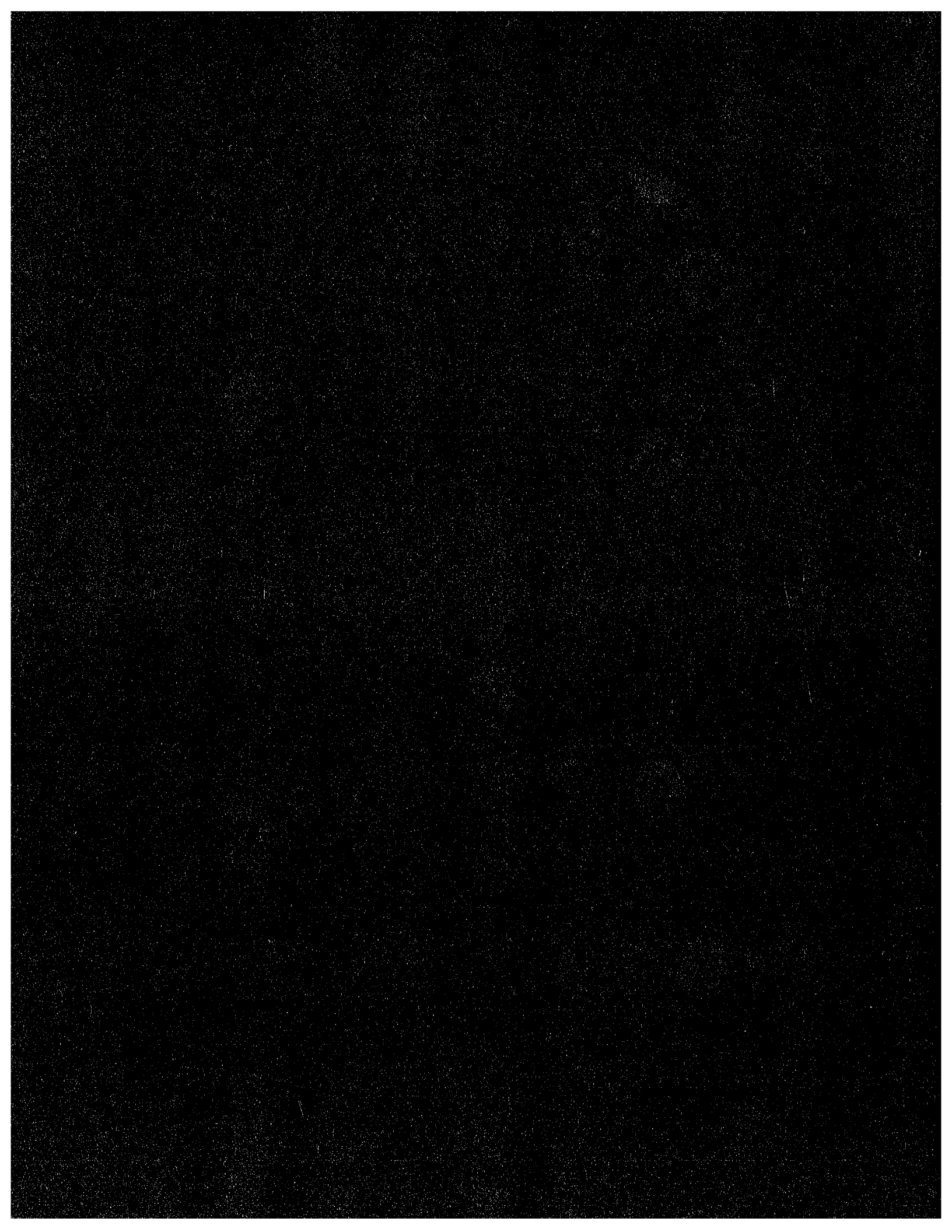

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Southeasterly flow aloft will continue to bring more monsoonal moisture over the fire today. Therefore...isolated showers and dry thunderstorms will once again be possible in the afternoon and evening hours. Storms that develop will be capable of producing gusty and erratic downdrafts. Transport winds will be light to moderate keeping smoke in place...however afternoon southwest winds will once again pick up.

### **WEATHER FORECAST:**

**\*\*\*ISOLATED SHOWERS & THUNDERSTORMS POSSIBLE\*\*\***

#### **TODAY:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly sunny with isolated thunderstorms possible in the afternoon. Areas of smoke.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** Lower elevations 90-100

**24 HOUR CHANGE:** little

Upper elevations 84-92

**MIN HUMIDITY:** lower elevations 13-23%...upper elevations 17-30%

**24 HOUR CHANGE:** wetter 4-6%

**CWR:** <5%

**LAL:** 2

#### **20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** – North to northeast in the morning 4-8 mph with gusts to 15 mph...becoming south to southwest winds 10-20 mph with gusts up to 30 mph in the afternoon.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Terrain driven winds 3-7 mph in the morning...becoming west to southwest 8-15 with gusts to 25 mph.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Semi-stable in the morning with smoke settling becoming more unstable with day time heating.

### **WEDNESDAY NIGHT FORECAST:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly clear. Isolated thunderstorms in the evening. Areas of smoke...especially deeper canyons and drainages.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** 64-74.

**MAX HUMIDITY:** lower elevations 25-35%...upper valleys and higher elevation 25-50%

#### **20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** – Southwest to west in the evening 10-20 mph with gusts up to 30 mph...becoming north to northeast by morning 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Southwest to west in the evening 8-13 mph with gusts up to 20 mph...becoming north to northeast by morning 3-7 mph...protected valleys becoming downslope/downvalley winds less than 5 mph.

**Extended Outlook: Thursday through Saturday:** Upper level high pressure will weaken as a trough approaches the west coast. As a result...onshore flow will increase producing cooler temperatures and slightly higher humidities. Temperatures will generally be in the upper 80s to upper 90s and a few cooler on Saturday. Daytime humidities will be a wetter in the upper teens to lower 30%. Due to the increased onshore flow afternoon and evening gusty west to southwest winds 10 to 20 mph will continue. Gusts 30-40 mph may be possible over the highest peaks...especially the foothills of the Antelope Valley.

**Watch for developing cumulus as it may lead to thunderstorms.**  
**Check IRPG for thunderstorm safety.**

### INPUTS

#### WEATHER SUMMARY

Mostly sunny with isolated dry thunderstorms possible in the afternoon. Areas of smoke.  
 Max Temp – 83-100°. Min RH – 10-30%  
 Ridgetop Winds – NNE 5-10mph with gusts to 15 mph becoming SW to W 12 – 20, gusts to 30 PM.  
 Slope/Valley Winds – variable 4 – 8 becoming SW or upvalley 8 – 15 with gusts to 25 mph in PM.

#### FUELS

Very heavy loading of decadent brush (chaparral, ceanothus, chemise, scrub oak, manzanita) (FM5, SH5, SH7) across the entire fire area, 15 foot high with Pine and Big Cone Doug Fir in the drainage bottoms and ridge tops above 4000'. The dead component in much for the brush exceeds 60%, heavy stands of grass are completed cured. Minimum fine fuel moisture: 3-5%, 1000 hour: 5-8%, Live fuel moisture: 60-65%. ERC's are running above 90%.

### OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** Local Thresholds for active fire behavior: Winds (over 15 mph), RH (less than 25%), Temperature (over 90°) and BI (over 201). Predicted BI for today is 238.

Yesterday fire behavior was moderate, with slow backing fire, occasional rapid upslope runs and short range spotting. The east flank being the most active particularly in the Mt. Wilson area. Early morning clouds and afternoon smoke shaded fuels over much of the fire area along with slightly higher RHs were largely responsible for the quiet fire behavior.

Expect today's fire behavior to be similar to yesterdays with fire behavior increasing gradually throughout the burning period, peaking around 1600.

The potential for very active fire behavior remains along the active perimeter if these areas remain cloudless and receive full solar heating for an extended period of time. Timbered areas and those with old growth brush that contain 100-1000 hour fuels will hold heat for several days and have the potential to come back to life under the right conditions.

Should thunderstorms develop in the fire area, be prepared for strong erratic winds and down drafts. Lightning is possible.

**Maximum Fire Behavior for Head fire under full sunshine: ROS 50-120 c/h, FL 20-50,  
 Spotting Distance ½ mile, Probability of Ignition 90% Backing fire: ROS 15-30 c/h, FL 8-15.**

#### **SPECIFIC:**

**Branch IV and V** – Expect north to northeast winds to be favorable for direct attack and burnout early in the day. A wind shift early in the afternoon will push fire towards containment lines and cause spread to the north and northeast. Spotting could be a problem under clear skies, less so if fuels are shaded.

**Branch I and II** – Expect the fire to continue backing with moderate intensity with occasional upslope runs, most as a result of burning operations. There is a potential for short range spotting and rollout. Afternoon winds will be more favorable for holding and burnout.

**Branch XX** – Expect the fire to continue to spread actively as it moves to the east beyond Mt Wilson. Expect very active to extreme fire behavior in areas where the winds and slope come into alignment.

**FEEDBACK:** Collect WX obs hourly and turn in to FBAN or IMET at end of shift. Include fire behavior.

### AIR OPERATIONS

- Smoky conditions likely across the fire area until 1200 - 1400. Aviation operations will be limited.

### SAFETY.

- If there is T-cell development, it is most likely to build over the San Gabriel Mountains, influencing BRANCH V and XX the greatest.



## **"DO BASIC THINGS VERY WELL"**

- **Driving on the Incident** – Forest System Roads are frequently narrow, winding and have few wide spots for turning around or getting by opposing traffic. Be alert for rock fall in burned areas across the incident. Inattention, distracted driving, or nodding off due to fatigue could easily result in tragedy. Keep your speed down. Drive with headlights on. Make sure drivers are well-rested. Increase following distances on dusty roads. **Maintain Situational Awareness!**
- **POTENTIAL FOR ACTIVE FIRE BEHAVIOR:** Even with the current moderated weather conditions, the potential exists for active burning. Don't let your guard down! Review "Severe Fire Behavior Potential" (IRPG p.76). Monitor current weather conditions and forecasts. Make sure all personnel receive thorough briefings every shift. Maintain adequate escape routes and safety zones. Advise all personnel if these are compromised or changed. Set trigger points when appropriate. **MAINTAIN SITUATIONAL AWARENESS!**
- **Hazardous Terrain** - Steep terrain is one of the most serious hazards on this incident. Rolling material is a major issue. Rocks and trees have been loosened or dislodged by the fire. Evaluate your work area closely before entering. Spread workers out farther than 10 feet apart. Stagger workers so they are not working or walking directly below each other.
- **Hydration & Fatigue** - Heat stress problems will continue as the weather is moderating. The higher humidities reduce the effectiveness of the body's heat regulating system since sweat doesn't evaporate as well. Monitor yourself and those you supervise for symptoms. Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio. Pace yourselves.

## **COMMUNICATIONS RESPONSIBILITIES**

All firefighters have five communication responsibilities:

- Brief others as needed.
- Debrief your actions.
- Communicate hazards to others.
- Acknowledge messages.
- Ask if you don't know or are unclear.

In addition, all leaders of firefighters have the responsibility to provide complete briefings that include a clearly stated "Leader's Intent."

- Task = What is to be done
- Purpose = Why it is to be done
- End State = How it should look when done

- DRINK PLENTY OF FLUIDS
- WASH HANDS FREQUENTLY
- VISIT MED UNIT AT FIRST SIGN OF COLD OR FLU-LIKE SYMPTOMS

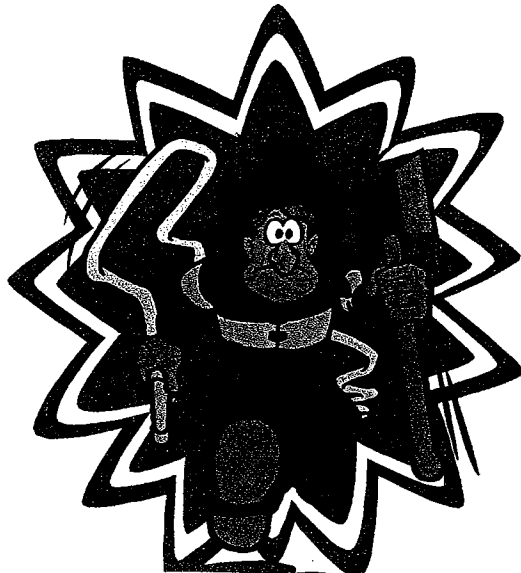

# YOUR RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES ON THE STATION INCIDENT

### Rights:

- ✦ To work in a harassment-free environment where people treat one another with dignity, equity, courtesy and respect.
- ✦ To say "no" to unwelcome advances or requests for favors.
- ✦ To file complaints or grievances through appropriate avenues.

### Responsibilities:

- ✦ To behave in a manner that treats people with dignity, equity, courtesy and respect.
- ✦ To abide by agency and incident ethics and conduct regulations.
