

FORECAST ISSUED: Friday 9/04/09 @ 2100

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The cooling trend noted Friday will continue again today as an upper trough moves in from the west with increased onshore flow. The most notable cooling will be over the highest peaks. Despite the cooling trend... humidities will see little change this afternoon. However... further drying is expected over the weekend on the ridge tops with poor recoveries. Typical diurnal wind pattern will remain with terrain drive winds.

WEATHER FORECAST:

TODAY:
WEATHER: Mostly sunny. Areas of smoke.
MAX TEMPERATURES: Lower elevations 87-96
Upper elevations 75-86
24 HOUR CHANGE: cooler 2-4
MIN HUMIDITY: 13-26%
24 HOUR CHANGE: little

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – Northwest to north in the morning 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph... becoming southwest to west in the afternoon 8-15 mph with gusts up to 25 mph in the afternoon.
SLOPE/VALLEY – Northeast/downvalley winds 3-7 mph in the morning... becoming southwest/upvalley 7-12 with gusts to 20 mph. Local southwest gusts up to 35 mph along the Antelope Valley foothills

STABILITY/INVERSION: mostly stable in the morning with smoke settling becoming marginally unstable with day time heating.

SATURAY NIGHT FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly clear. Areas of smoke... especially deeper canyons and drainages.
MIN TEMPERATURES: lower elevations 57-67... upper elevations 51-60.
MAX HUMIDITY: lower elevations 35-50%... higher elevation 25-35%... highest peaks locally to 20%.
20 FT WINDS:
RIDGETOP – Southwest to west in the evening 5-15 mph with gusts up to 20 mph... becoming north to northeast by morning 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph.
SLOPE/VALLEY – Southwest/upslope in the evening 7-13 mph with gusts up to 20 mph... becoming Northeast/downslope by morning 3-7 mph.

Extended Outlook: Sunday through Tuesday: A cool airmass will remain over the fire this weekend and into early next week. Humidities will improve slightly over the lower slopes and valleys... but the cool airmass will bring drier conditions to the upper ridges. Afternoon high temperatures will be in the mid 80s to mid 90s and in the 70s over the highest ridges. As for winds... expect some gusty southwesterly winds in the afternoon due to the strengthening onshore flow. Some of the windier areas... including the foothills of the Antelope Valley... could experience gusts of 35-40 mph.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY

Refer to Weather Forecast for details: Mostly sunny. Areas of smoke. Max Temp: 77-96°. Min RH: 15-30%. Ridgetop Winds – NNW 5-10mph with gusts to 15 mph becoming SSW 12-20, gusts to 25 PM. Slope/Valley Winds – terrain 3-7 becoming WSW or upvalley 8 – 15 with gusts to 18 mph in PM. Marginally unstable atmosphere.

FUELS

Very heavy loading of decadent brush (chaparral, ceanothus, chemise, scrub oak, manzanita) (FM4, SH5, SH7) across the entire fire area, 15 foot high with Pine and Big Cone Doug Fir (FM8) in the drainage bottoms and ridge tops above 4000'. The dead component in much for the brush exceeds 60%, heavy stands of grass are completely cured. Minimum fine fuel moisture: 3-5%, 1000 hour: 5-8%, Live fuel moisture: 60-65%. ERC's are running above 90%.

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Local Thresholds for active fire behavior: Winds (over 15 mph), RH (less than 25%), Temperature (over 90°) and BI (over 201). Predicted BI for today is 254 (up 2).

Yesterday's fire behavior was very active, favorable transport winds keep most areas free of smoke. The most active area of the fire was in the Lobo & Devil's Canyon drainages where it made rapid upslope runs resulting in convection column development. The Bare and Magic Mt areas are still holding heat, but much less, in part due to suppression efforts. Expect today's fire behavior to be similar to yesterday in the Devil's Canyon, with diminishing fire behavior in the Bare and Magic Mt areas.

In the AM, smoke may shade areas of the fire stunting the fires activity. Expect smoke to begin lifting around 1000-1200 and fire activity to increase in those areas under full sunshine. Be prepared for winds to shift from NNE to SSW around 1000 depending upon smoke coverage. Heavy smoke will delay this wind shift.

Maximum Fire Behavior for Head fire under full sunshine: ROS 60-120 c/h, FL 30-60,

Spotting Distance 3/4 mile, Probability of Ignition 90% Backing fire: ROS 20-40 c/h, FL 8-15.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I and II – For the divisions along the Foothill Drive corridor, the fire activity has diminished greatly. Expect to find isolated areas of heat in the interior especially where fuels were heaviest.

In the **Mt Wilson** area, the fire has transitioned into a timber fuel model resulting in a significant reduction of the fire behavior. Expect the timbered, north aspect slopes to the north of Mt Wilson to burn with moderate fire behavior, ROS: 20-30c/h, FL: 2-10'. If the fire from Lobo or Devil's Canyon does spot across the West Fork of the San Gabriel River, the fire could make a rapid upslope run with extreme fire behavior, convection column development and spotting. If this happens, the WSW ridgetop winds will limit the potential of spot fires over the proposed containment line. These winds will also be favorable for burning ops.

Branch IV and V – Pacoima drainage: Pay attention to wind direction and the effect on burnout and holding operations. **Bare Mt:** Sparser fuels at lower elevations will make burnout operation difficult. Burnout at higher elevation could also be problematic due to sparse or compacted fine fuel litter in tree covered areas and higher fuel moistures. Watch for wind eddies around side drainages and in Division FF.

Branch XX – In the **Devil's Canyon** area, expect the fire to spread with active to extreme rates of spread with the potential for convection column development. Should this occur be prepared for the column to collapse creating gusty and erratic winds.

AIR OPERATIONS

- Smoky conditions likely across the fire area until 1000-1200 especially on the eastern side.

SAFETY

- For the resources working in DIVISIONS V & W, ensure lookouts are in place, trigger points are established and you have a backup plan in place before you need it.

Fire Order of the Day: Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.

- **Hazardous Materials**– When conducting operations, especially mop-up near homes, outbuildings and illegal trash dumps be careful about exposing yourself to Hazardous Materials. Items such as paint, varnish, pesticides, cleaners, batteries, automotive fluids and plastics can give off toxic vapors that can be very harmful.
- **Fire Behavior** – Expect the unexpected and be prepared to react accordingly. Review “Severe Fire Behavior Potential” (IRPG p.76). Monitor current weather conditions and forecasts.
- **Non-Incident Personnel:** The fuel tanks at the Mt. Wilson Communication Site are running low on fuel so anticipate fuel trucks driving up the Angeles Crest Highway and the road to Mt. Wilson. Likewise, Edison and LA Dept. of Water and Power will be sending personnel into the burned area to do damage assessments and replace poles and lines. Drive defensively and anticipate these individuals in burned, but secure areas.

Escape Route/Safety Zone Checklist

Escape Routes:

- *Designate primary and back-up escape routes.
- *Scouted – soils, vegetation, slope
- *Timed – slowest person, fatigue, dozer speed
- *Marked – flagged for day and night use

Safety Zones:

- *Survivable without a shelter
- *Natural – clean burn, water, bare soil/rock
- *Man-made – constructed sites, roads, etc.
- *Scouted for size and hazards
- *Close enough considering escape time needed


Remember and Follow:

- *The 10 Standard Fire Orders
- *The Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires
- *The Downhill Line Construction Guidelines

Common Denominators of Fire Behavior On Tragedy Fires

- *Most incidents happen on the smaller fires or on isolated portions of larger fires.
- *Most fires are innocent in appearance before the “flare-ups” or “blow-ups”. In some cases, tragedies occur in the mop-up stage.
- *Flare-ups generally occur in deceptively light fuels.
- *Fires run uphill surprisingly fast in chimneys, gullies, chutes and on steep slopes.
- *Some suppression tools, such as helicopters or air tankers, can adversely affect fire behavior. The blasts of air from low flying helicopters and air tankers have been known to cause flare-ups.

Power Line Hazards On Wildland Fires

- **Look Out** for **power lines** in, and around, the fire area.
 - Treat all downed wires as if energized. Downed wires can energize fences, equipment, phone lines, cable lines, etc.
- **Communicate** with your personnel, the location of power lines that are, or may be involved in the incident.
 - Contact Edison to report electrical facilities that are involved or damaged, and with a location for crews to respond.
- **Escape Routes** – **Do NOT** identify escape routes that would take personnel under or near power lines!
 - Heat from extreme fire activity ionizes the air. Superheated, ionized air can act as a conductor, causing a line to arc to directly to ground.
 - Smoke, fire retardant, foam, or water can contaminate insulators, causing a power line to arc across insulators, through poles or towers to ground.
- **Safety Zones** – **Do NOT** identify safety zones under or near power lines!
 - In addition to the arcing potential described for escape routes, “Fire Shelter” material is conductive and may attract an arc if a power line faults to ground due to direct, or near direct flame impingement.
 - Do not locate the ICP, or park equipment under power lines.
- **Extinguish pole fires when discovered.** This will help prevent “wire down” hazards that may block escape routes, equipment, or pose a hidden danger during mop up operations.
 - ◆ *Avoid applying water, foam, or gel above the first level of communication cables. If necessary, only use a water fog pattern on pole-top equipment.*
- **Air Operations** - Be aware of all power lines in and around the fire area, including skylines that run along the tops of transmission towers. Skylines are single, grounded, ¼” steel wires that are very easy to overlook in contrast to the larger conductors on the same tower.

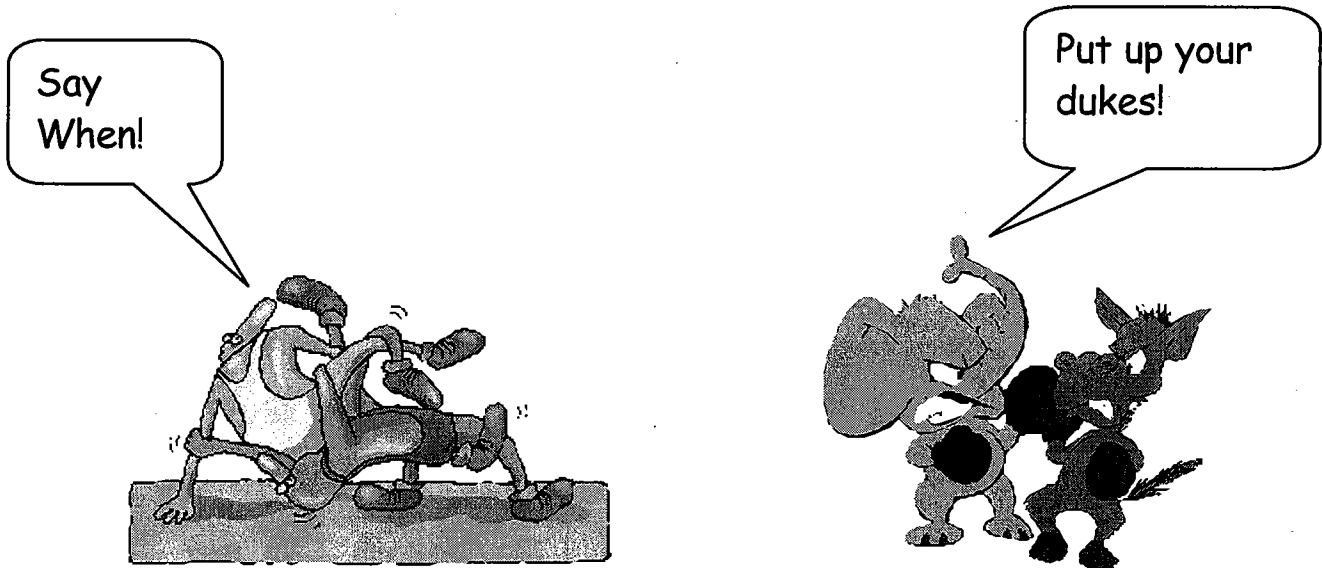

ATTACHMENT A – WATER BAR GUIDELINES

When locating and building waterbars, place them the right **distance** apart, at a **diagonal** to the fireline, so that they **divert**, then **discharge**, then **dissipate** the energy of the flowing water. Be sure to make them deep enough so they'll be durable.

Equipment Lines

- Pull back edge berms and smooth out any internal berms.
- Install water bars as per attached guidelines.
- Install water bars so that they drain into the "green" whenever possible. If water bar is directed into the black, install green brush at the mouth of the water bar in the black to lessen impact from water flow.
- Open up natural drainages along dozer lines.
- Where possible, use hand crews to cut waterbars to minimize additional disturbance or damage to waterbars by equipment traffic exiting the line.

Fireline slope %	Maximum Distance Apart (feet)
1-6.....	300
7-9.....	200
10-14.....	150
15-20.....	90
21-40.....	50
41-60.....	25

Recommended spacing for waterbars on firelines.
Waterbars should be no further apart than this, but they may be closer. When in doubt, put in more. From: UDSA-Forest Service, "Sale Administrator's Handbook"

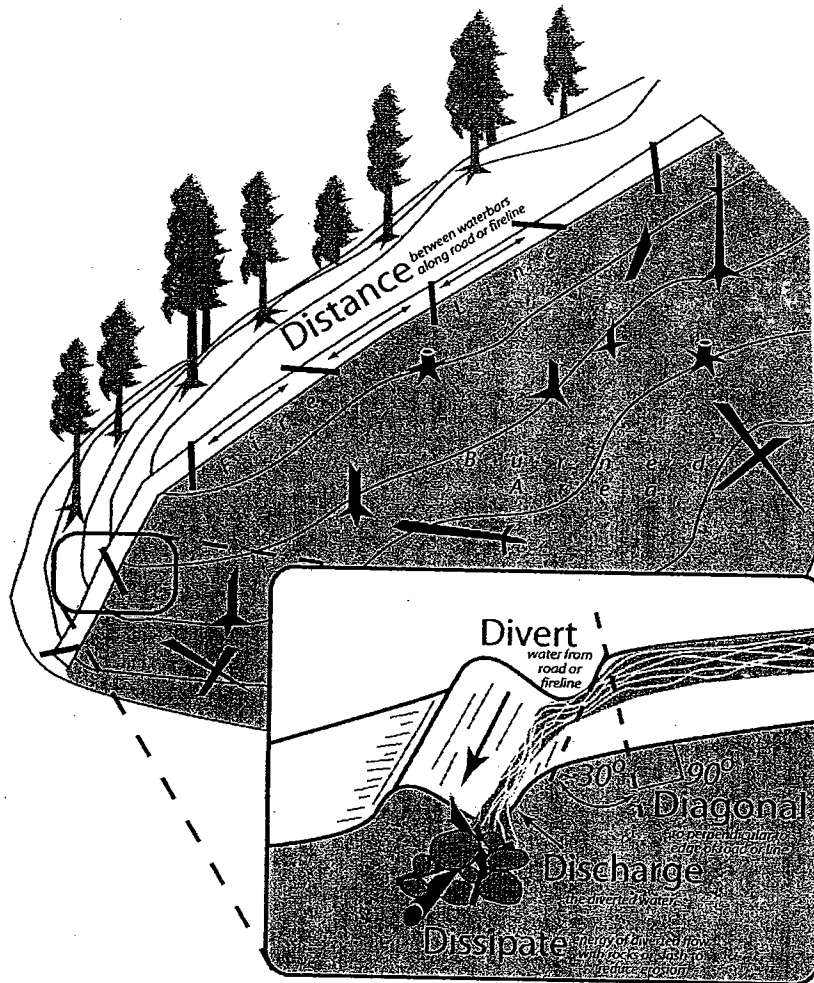
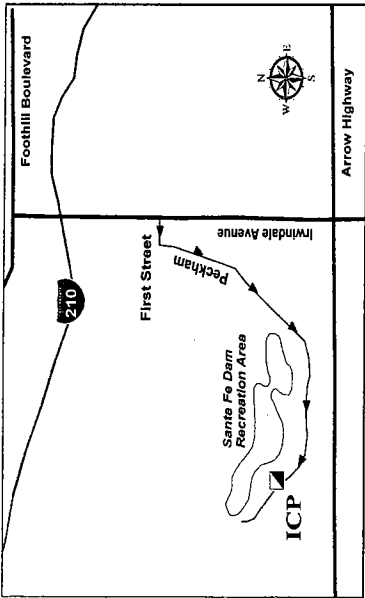

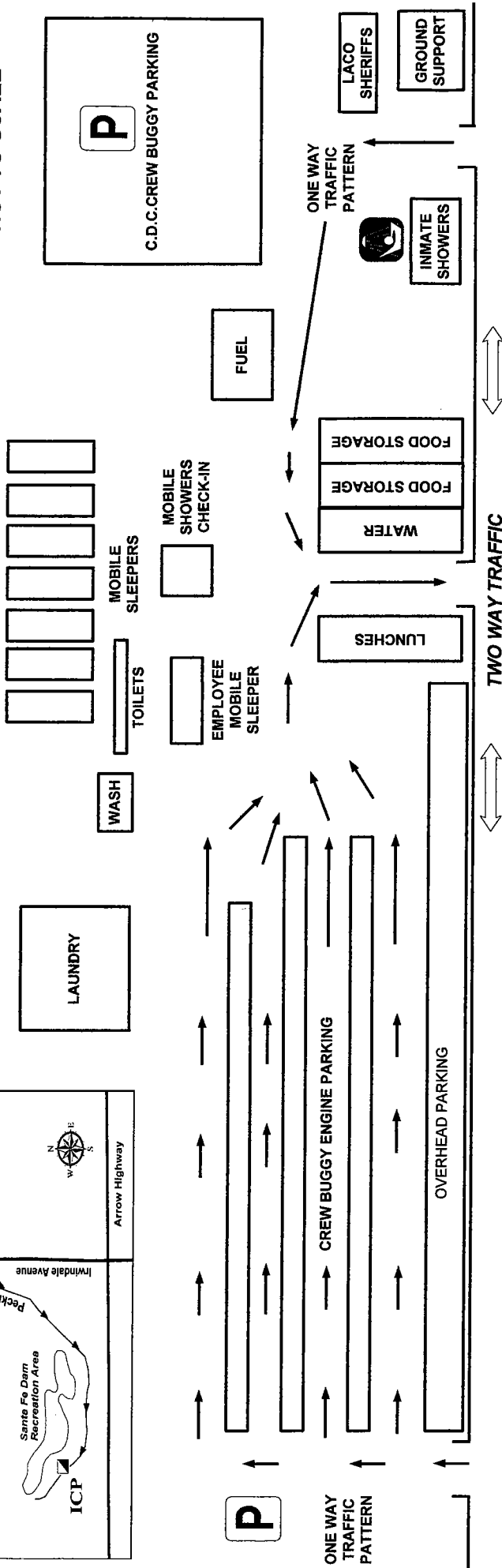
Handlines

- Whenever possible, waterbar to the green not the black. If the waterbar must go into the black, put brush and rock at the outlet to armor the outlet and dissipate the energy of the flow.
- Make sure that the berm of the waterbar is higher than the uphill ground surface right above it.
- Construct waterbars on handline that is safe (< 60% slope). Use previous chart for spacing.
- Encourage crews to construct handlines as they exit the handline at the end of shifts.

STATION FIRE FACILITIES MAP SANTA FE DAM



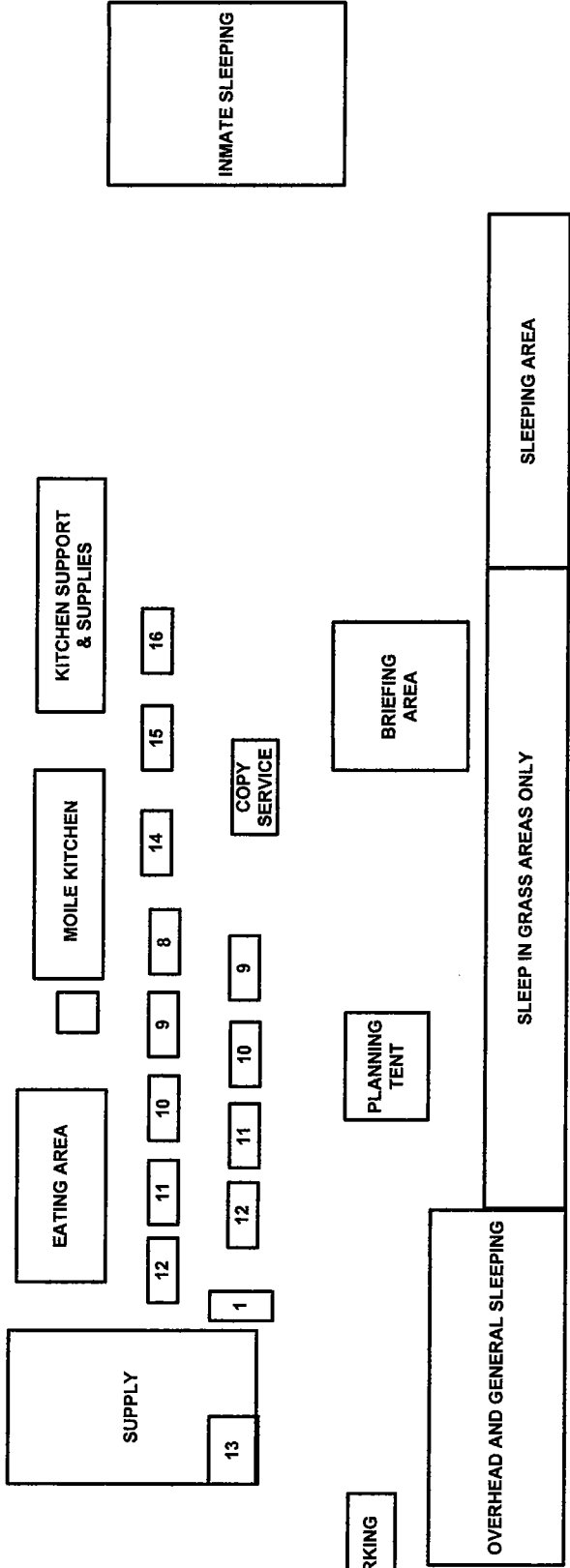
