<b>3. Objective(s):</b> 1. Provide for the safety and security of Forest Service staff, volunteers, and visitors. 2. Provide the public with enjoyable viewing opportunities and promote reasonable recreation activities. 3. Engage the public and our staff regarding amenities the Forest may provide, and to generally display the Forest as a destination for the public. 4. Mitigate impacts to camping, viewing, concentrated recreation areas, and sensitive areas before, during and after the eclipse. 5. Provide timely and accurate information to forest visitors and staff. 6. Fire prevention. 7. Coordinate eclipse preparations and event management actions with cooperating agencies, to the extent possible.																
<b>4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:</b> - To mitigate fatigue work shifts according to need and dismiss early should the demand not be warranted, especially during earlier shifts of the incident. - Do not assist with the recovery of stuck vehicles insofar where our actions may result in damage to the affected vehicle except in cases of where life safety is endangered (e.g. an ambulance needing access down a road blocked by a stuck vehicle).

# HEALTH AND SAFETY MESSAGE

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## Major Hazards & Risks: Driving & Boating, Wet Surfaces, Congested Rds. & Rec Areas

**Driving & Boating** –This assignment involves both driving and boating. Make sure you are situationally aware of your surroundings. Expect all areas to be more congested than they ever have before, leading to significant delays and close encounters. Drive defensively, use a spotter when backing, and don't get in a hurry. Help the public with organized parking and backing. For boaters, get a briefing before boarding your boat and make sure everyone wears a personal floatation device.

**Wet Surfaces** – Recent precipitation and moisture have created hazardous walking conditions and soft shoulders for driving. Walking areas will hold moisture for several more days before drying out. Always watch your footing. If you are climbing on equipment, use three points of contact to avoid a fall.

**Situational Awareness** – Be aware of your surroundings. There will be lots of congestion due to vehicles and crowds. This can lead to agitation and short tempers. These gatherings can also attract persons with ill intentions. Before engaging in a confrontation make sure you have thought through the potential outcomes and have adequate support in the area. If the situation is beyond your ability or comfort level request assistance from your Division Supervisor or Law Enforcement.

**Medical Emergencies** – Do you know what to do in case of a medical emergency? **Review the Medical Incident Report** in your IAP. Take time to discuss with your Division Supervisor. Identify hazards and potential injuries. Review the Incident Within an Incident IC Responsibilities in your IAP.

**Changing Weather** – Continue to monitor daily weather. The forecast calls for wide swings in the weather from snow to rain, and temps in the 30s to the 70s. Dress appropriately and be prepared if camping out at Hardin Ridge. Eclipse Dispatch will monitor weather and call out any weather concerns in a timely manner. Have a shelter plan for lightning and tornadoes especially Division Alpha (A).

**Hazard Trees** – Be heads up in areas with overhead hazards especially during periods of higher winds (>20 mph). When camping be sure not to set up under dead trees or trees with dead branches overhead.

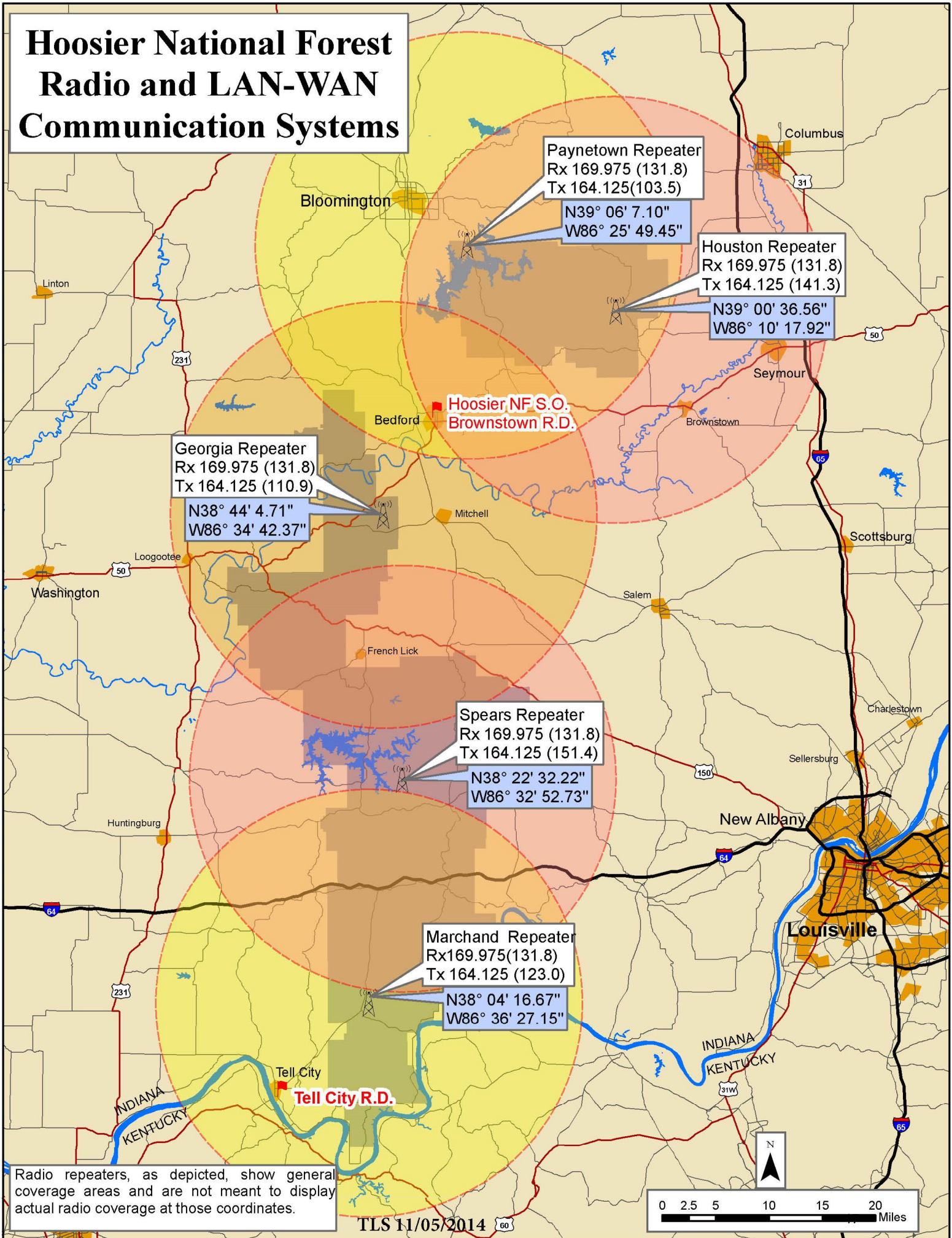

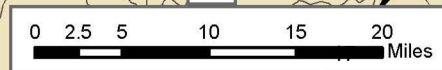

## **IWI IC Responsibilities – Eclipse Event**

- Take charge of the scene and determine the nature of the incident. Not all incidents are emergencies but still require special attention to resolve. Examples of non-emergency incidents include a car off in the ditch blocking the road, a hiker with a sprained ankle, or a lost individual. Emergencies can include a hiker with life threatening or debilitating injury (e.g. broken leg or ankle), vehicle accident with injuries, an individual experiencing an allergic reaction, etc.
  - If emergency patient care is required initiate emergency services and patient care by first calling 911. Know what county you are in and confirm with the 911 operator. If unable to establish communications with 911 due to lack of phone service contact Eclipse Dispatch and ask that they facilitate the call.
  - If non-emergency care or services are needed call the appropriate county's non-emergency dispatch number to coordinate the needed response.
  - If a search and rescue contact your DIVS who will then contact Eclipse Dispatch to initiate the SAR plan.
- Inform the Division Supervisor and Eclipse Dispatch that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). If an emergency identify the emergency name – “Division A medical”, etc. Eclipse dispatch will clear the frequency for emergency traffic only.
- If an incident requiring patient care:
  - Assign or begin patient assessment (Medical Incident Report – MIR) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division or across incident. Transmit MIR patient information to Hoosier Dispatch.
  - Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Hoosier Dispatch as early as possible. Notify Communication as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation (if needed or required), if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear, vehicles, or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. The unit log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, terminate the incident at its conclusion, conduct an After-Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

## **Active Shooter Protocol – Eclipse Event**

### **Situational Awareness**

Identify locations of escape routes and safety zones as they relate to an active shooter situation. Identify things you might use if required to fight a shooter. Review doors, locks, and cover. Be alert for unknown people, especially if anger or weapons are noticed.

### **Strategies**

**Run** to safe area or towards cover. **Hide** behind closed locked doors if possible. **Fight aggressively** as a last resort to survive.

### **Call For Help**

Dial 911 Give your location, provide medical needs, description of subject & vehicle, number of shots fired and distance away. **Notify Hoosier Dispatch 812-547-9262.**

### **Accountability**

Call your IC or Division when you are clear of the incident and safe to do so. Do not return to the shooter site until notified by your Division or Law Enforcement that the threat is clear.

### **When Law Enforcement Arrives**

Law Enforcement's job is to remove the shooter. Follow Officers directions. Keep your hands empty, visible and fingers spread. Additional responders will care for the injured.

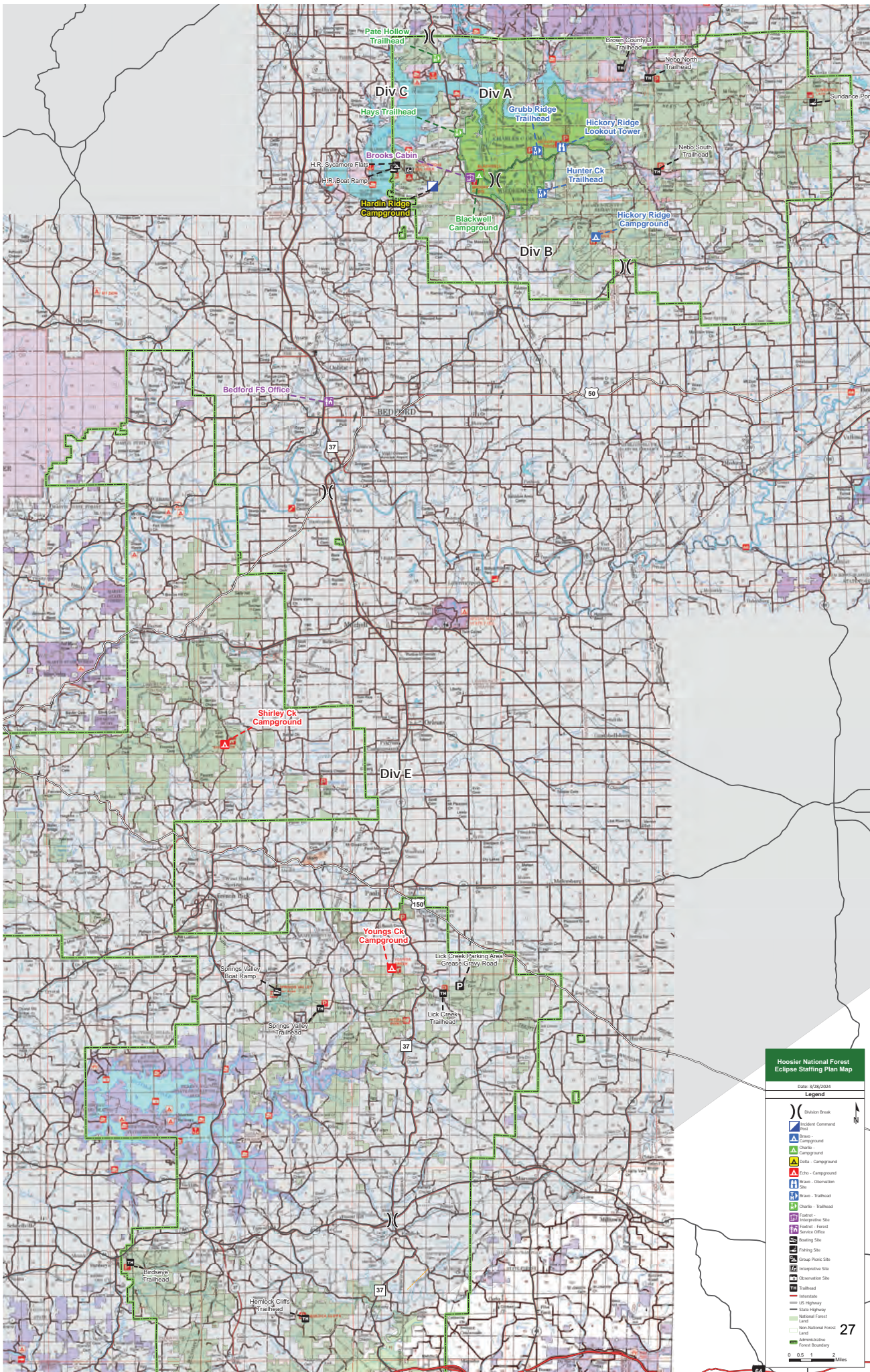
