Hoosier Rx Fire Timelines and Prep Standards

Timelines

No burning will occur during the pupping season June 1 - July 31.

Trees over 3 inches DBH may not be felled between April 15 and September 15.

Avoid mowing between April 15 – July 1.

Avoid placing fire lines mid-slope.
Avoid placing fire lines through Non-Native Invasive Species populations.
Clean equipment when moving from one burn block to another.
Whenever possible masticated line should be used instead of mowed line
Avoid riparian areas with equipment
Lines should be ATV/UTV accessible. Areas where ATV/UTV access is restricted should be
marked with white flagging across the line.
In timber litter fuels all lines should be at least 6 feet wide down to non-combustible
surface or natural barrier.
All whips, low hanging branches, trip and tire hazards should be removed from the line.
In grass/shrub fuels all lines should be mowed at least 10 feet wide and all mow lines
should also be blown or raked.
All jackpots within ½ chain of the line should be removed, raked around or dispersed.
All snags within 2 chains in the black should be addressed by either felling or blowing
out to 6 feet around the base. All snags within 1 chain on the green side should be
felled.
All high values at risk such as: Pipe line markers, culverts, wooden/plastic structures,
carsonite survey markers, power poles, electrical boxes, etc should be cleared with a 6-
foot buffer.
All large debris and trash should be removed from the burn unit or should be cleared
with a 6-foot buffer.
A 200-foot protection buffer will be established with a line 6 feet wide around caves
within the burn unit.
heritage sites, protection lines will meet standards listed above.
