Comments /notes on tonight's mission and this interpretation: Fire is located just south of the Bonneville and Caribou County line at the head of Marshall Canyon, 2 miles east of Tincup Mountain and 1 mile north of Tincup Creek and Highway 34. Intense heat detected in Marshall Canyon, and to the west in Corral Creek watershed. Half-acre hot spot to the north along the ridge. Three isolated heat sources were detected outside the perimeter. These are labeled on the map.
