Course of Action: Full Suppression

Incident Objectives:

- Ensure all operations reflect a commitment to incident personnel and public safety.
- Reduce negative fire impacts and minimize loss of structures and/or infrastructure to:
 - Communication sites (Rowberry Peak)
 - Utility lines (gas and power lines: Kern River pipeline, UNEV pipeline, Sigurd to Red Butte transmission, Rocky Mountain Power).
 - Private land and structures to include commercial and agricultural infrastructure.
 - Grazing and spring developments.
- Minimize damage to priority sage grouse habitat, Utah Prairie Dog habitat and big game winter range.
- Ensure prompt and accurate communication that fosters discussion and encourages interaction with hosting agencies.
- Focus public information actions to enhance relationships with landowners, cooperators and the public.

Desired End State:

The fire is suppressed and values at risk protected using the appropriate resources to implement tactics in locations with reasonable probabilities of success. At the conclusion of the incident, there will have been no serious accidents or injuries, all suppression damage will have been repaired, and cooperator and the public relationships will have been enhanced.
