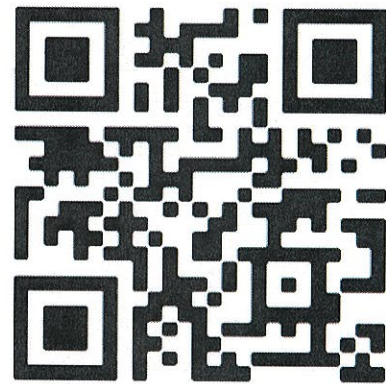

.DISCUSSION...

A warming trend begins Tuesday, with temperatures near to slightly below normal through the week. Dry conditions are expected with seasonably low humidity values and no chances for precipitation the week ahead. Typical westerly afternoon breezes will occur each day, starting to pick up around 1-3 pm and lasting through 9-10 pm.

Communication Responsibilities

All Firefighters have five communication responsibilities

- ***Briefings** – All resources require briefings. Use briefing checklist in pocket guide.
- ***Debrief Actions** – as necessary. Use pocket guide After Action Review to stimulate discussion and provide guidance.
- ***Communicate Hazards to Others** –
- ***Acknowledge messages** –
- ***Ask if you do not know** –Ask questions in unfamiliar situations. The only dumb question is the one you did not ask.

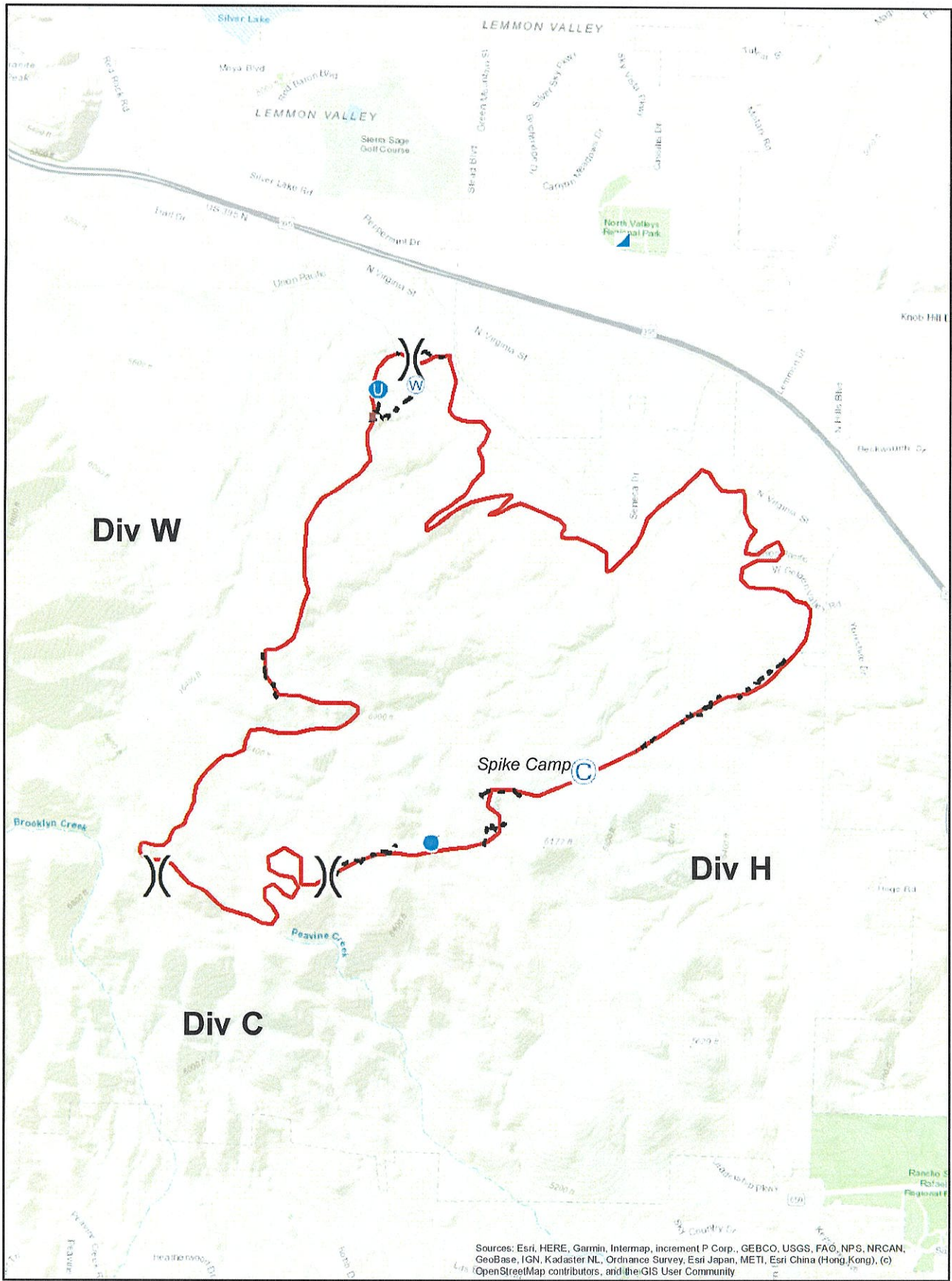


