## MAJOR 215 A HAZARDS AND RISKS

- Be aware of late season fatigue. Try to stay hydrated, take breaks as needed.
- Working in steep rocky areas in some places. Slip & falls as well as rolling rocks are possible.
- COVID - Follow social distancing, mask protocols, Fire and COVID -19 Briefing Checklist
- Reports of rattle snakes in the area. Probably will be active in the warmer part of the day.
- Be aware of overhead aviation resources. Will be on heavy use early in the operational period.
- Steep rocky, rough terrain, falls/slips - Be sure of your footing, go slow.
- Public and traffic around the fire area - Park away from congested areas, off the narrow roads, drive slow.
