Comments / notes on tonight's mission and this interpretation: Started interpretation with NIFS Wildfire Event Poly pulled 08/27/2022 @ 2326 MDT The heat perimeter continues to grow. Previous IR acres 10,182 mapped 11,345 acres. SE, SW and East Perimeter seeing lots of activity as expected per GISS on incident. Growth on the southern tip of perimeter toward Wilson Peak with lots of intense heat and dense scattered heat in that area. There are large areas of intense heat along east perimeter. Additional growth in the NE corner toward lake north of Silver Creek. Several small areas of heat to the east of perimeter out ahead of the growth in that area. One isolated heat source mapped west of perimeter along Four Bit Creek 116.2689218°W 44.4827551°N could be a campfire. Unmapped: Same isolated heat sources east of the lake again this evening, could be campfires. Same couple of isolated heat sources SW of the perimeter along 3 rd Fork Road and the creek showing up again, could also be campfires.
