## **HEALTH & SAFETY MESSAGE:**

### THUNDERSTORM SAFETY

Thunderstorms cause significant hazards for wildland firefighters, including **high out-flow** winds that can cause **erratic and or extreme fire behavior, and lightning**. When thunderstorm development is likely, lookouts should be posted and aware of signs of a developing storm. Heavy rain, hail, and lightning occur only in the mature stage of a thunderstorm. During a storm, use the following guidelines:

- If you feel the hair on your arms or head "stand up," there is a high probability of a strike in the vicinity. Crouch or sit on a pack.
- Do not lie down.
  - The best position is sitting on the pack or crouching with feet close together.
  - Avoid sitting directly on the ground, if possible; but if necessary, keep feet and butt close together.
  - Crouching for extended periods is not easily done, so sit on your pack.
  - Sitting on or covering up with a ground cloth is okay.
- Find a place free of hazard trees, strong outflow winds may cause them to come down.
- Handheld radios (with short rubber antennas) or cell phones are safe to use. Communication is vital to crew safety.
- Don't group together. Ridge tops and wide-open areas should be avoided.

## **Left Fork Fire Aquatic Invasive Species Operational Guidance**

Engines should work in the same drainage they have drafted from. Drafting should only be done at approved drafting locations; to reduce the probability of spreading invasives into uncontaminated portions of water ways. Before working in a different drainage, decontamination must be complete. For decontamination engines should arrive with an empty tank.

Bucket work in **Retardant Avoidance Areas** should be avoided to reduce the likelihood of spreading both Chytrid and Whirling disease.

Aircraft will need to decontaminate before switching dip site locations.

### SPIKE CAMP SELECTION CRITERIA

- Camping within one-half mile of the Forest Road 087 (East Fork Road) and Tropic Reservoir is limited to numbered (designated) sites only.
- Dispersed camping is permitted more than one-half mile off Forest Road 087 in previously disturbed areas, avoid creating new campsites.
- Please use existing parking pull-outs and turnarounds where possible.
- Choose an appropriate camp size for your crew needs.
- Camping in meadows is acceptable, however, DO NOT drive in meadows to access camping areas.
- Campsite #5 on Forest Road 087 is occupied by a Range Permittee.
- Do not use Forest Road 091 (on the west side of Tropic Reservoir) to access Base Camp as the Campground located on 091 is still open to the public.

## LEFT FORK FIRE WATER TENDERS AND ENGINES

## Aquatic Invasive Species Decontamination Protocol

# Decontamination station at the Left Fork Helibase (Bryce Canyon Airport) is open from 0800 to 2000

- Water drafted from the left fork fire is contaminated with Whirling disease and Chytrid fungus.
  - Water drafted out of Blubber Creek in contaminated with Chytrid fungus.
  - Decontamination will need to occur before going to another incident, leaving the fire, or when moving from east fork, Kanab, and Tropic Reservoir to Blubber Creek.
  - Engines should continue to work in the same drainages they have been assigned to prevent the spread of aquatic invasives from one drainage to the other.
- 2. Engines should arrive at the decontamination station empty.
- 3. Decontamination will require engines and tenders to draft the quat solution out of the folda tank furthest to the north labeled **Quat Solution**, after the engine or tender is full (or has drafted all the solution in the tank) the solution must remain in the tank for at least **10 minutes** to totally kill Whirlings Disease. For larger engines and tenders that draft all of the solution it is recommended they drive around for 10 minutes to allow the solution to splash inside the tank to get all the nooks and crannies.
- 4. After 10 minutes the solution can be released back into the **Quat Solution** tank.
- 5. A triple rinse is recommended for engines and tenders after quat treatment, 3 other folda tanks are located just south of the tank containing the quat solution. Engines and tenders will draft from Rinse Station 1 until they are full and then release that water back into Rinse Station 1. If you have a big tender or engine you may want to drive around to thoroughly rinse the inside of the tank. After rinsing at station 1 proceed to Rinse Stations 2 and 3 following the same procedures to thoroughly triple rinse.
