.DISCUSSION...A low pressure trough stalls over southern British Columbia Tuesday promoting a relatively dry and marginally unstable west-southwest flow aloft over the fire. The trough begins to rotate east Wednesday resulting in isolated to scattered thunderstorm development over and east of the fire during the afternoon and evening hours. Atmospheric moisture levels appear to support a mix of wet and dry thunderstorms.


