General control objectives for the incident:

- Ensure firefighter, aviation and public safety through adherence to all safety standards and implementation of appropriate risk analyses.
- Protect identified values at risk to include private lands and natural and cultural resources.
- Effectively manage incident costs and risk exposure by planning strategies and tactics toward a high probability of success in meeting incident objectives.

Course of Action: Full suppression, confine/contain, and point protection.

Core Values:

- Ensure all actions reflect a commitment to incident response personnel and public safety – by developing and applying tactics that balance safety, values at risk, and probability of success.
- Ensure mitigation measures are utilized to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Follow CDC guidelines.

Incident Objectives:

- Avoid cutting live Whitebark Pine (5-needle pine) during helispot construction and suppression activities.
- Mitigate snag and overhead exposure risk to all fire resources.
- Protect Salmon River and tributaries from fire suppression impacts.

Desired End State: The fire is contained and values at risk are protected by using appropriate resources and tactics, implemented in locations and with reasonable probabilities of success.

Ensure good communication with adjacent resources and ICP. Implement mitigation measures where communication issues exist.

FIRE FIGHTER FATIGUE

- Fatigue management goes beyond counting hours on timesheets, it is individualized and overt.
- Cumulative fatigue is dangerous. It prevents sound decision-making, confounds situational awareness, and dulls reaction times. It is as problematic in the office as it is on the fireline.
- Cumulative fatigue is manifest in the explanations used when folks are asked to take a break, or take a day off... "I don't have time." "There is too much going on." "As soon as things calm down a bit."
- Fire fighters **MUST** assure their situational awareness and risks are assessed and mitigated before committing to an action.
- Our values are simple... firefighter and public safety are the number one concern to be addressed within the priorities of suppression.

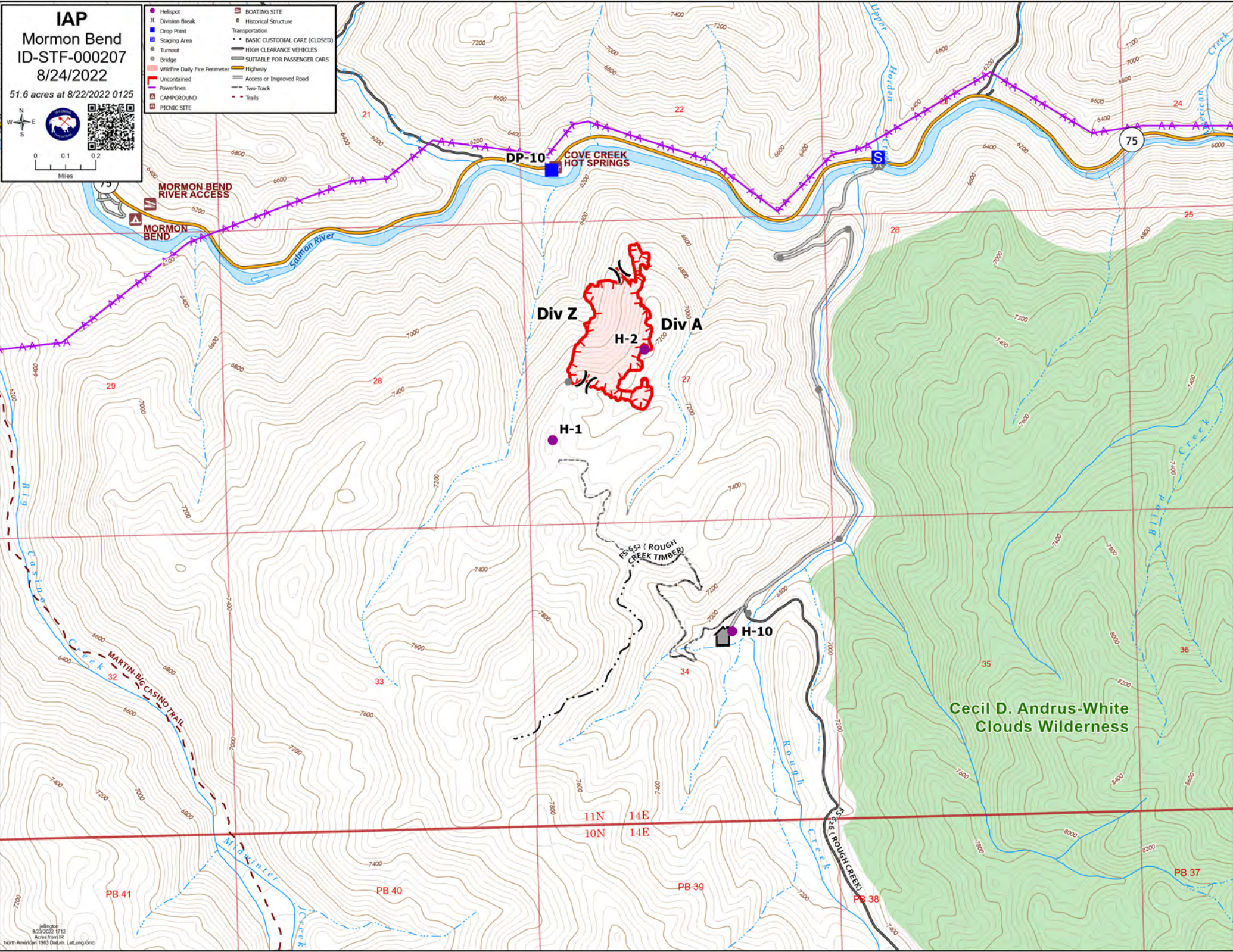
