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3. Incident Objective(s):

General control objectives for the incident:

- Ensure firefighter, aviation and public safety through adherence to all safety standards and implementation of appropriate risk analyses.
- Protect identified values at risk to include private lands and natural and cultural resources.
- Effectively manage incident costs and risk exposure by planning strategies and tactics toward a high probability of success in meeting incident objectives.

Course of Action: Full suppression, confine/contain, and point protection.

Core Values:

- Ensure all actions reflect a commitment to incident response personnel and public safety – by developing and applying tactics that balance safety, values at risk, and probability of success.
- Ensure mitigation measures are utilized to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Follow CDC guidelines.

Incident Objectives:

- Avoid cutting live Whitebark Pine (5-needle pine) during helispot construction and suppression activities.
- Mitigate snag and overhead exposure risk to all fire resources.
- Protect Salmon River and tributaries from fire suppression impacts.

Desired End State: The fire is contained and values at risk are protected by using appropriate resources and tactics, implemented in locations and with reasonable probabilities of success.

4. Operational Period Command Emphasis

Ensure good communication with adjacent resources and ICP. Implement mitigation measures where communication issues exist.

General Situational Awareness

Ensure all resources are aware of aerial operations and clear of the area during aerial suppression and logistical operations.

DISCUSSION...A dry cold front will push through the fire early in the day Saturday. Winds will be the main concern for Saturday afternoon, becoming sustained near 20 mph with gusts 25 to 30 mph in the afternoon especially at the higher elevations of the fire. The winds are expected to decrease during the evening, leaving cooler temperatures and a slight uptick in humidities in place for the remainder of the weekend.

Cold Wet Weather

Staying warm and dry during down time can be a chore. Your vehicle is the best bet.

Wet Slimy Roads

The road between the highway and the fire can become very slick in spots. Use lower gears and 4-wheel drive if you have it. Go slow!

Hypothermia

The lowering of body temperature. May become life threatening. If suspected get warmed up and dry. Seek medical attention if needed.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."

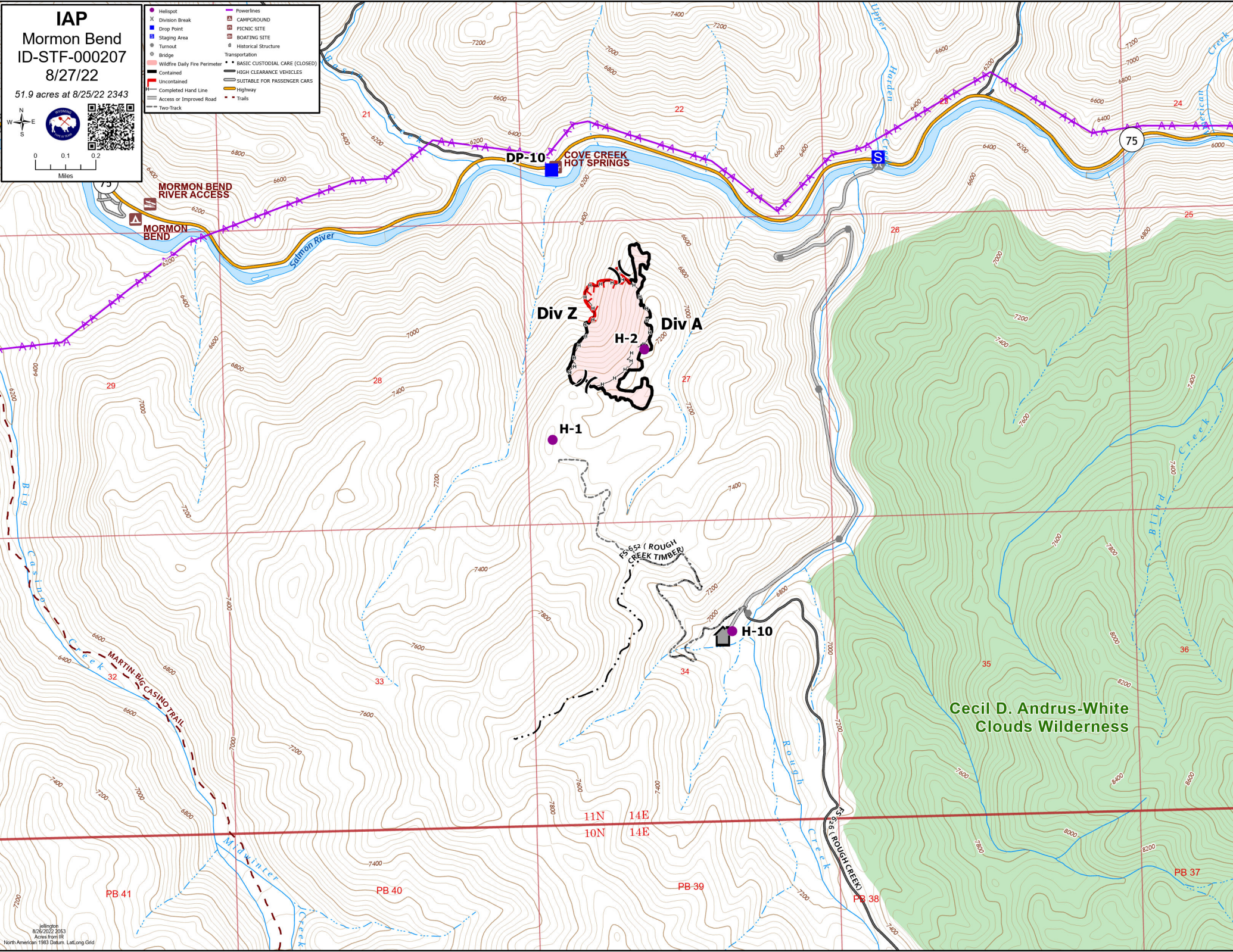
