WEATHER DISCUSSION:...A cold front will depart to the east of the fire this morning, with rain and snow showers lingering during the morning. A lull in precipitation is anticipated from midday through much of the afternoon, before additional rain or snow showers change to all snow showers around midnight tonight as another disturbance nears. Winds will remain gusty from the southwest today, though temperatures will be 15 to 20 degrees colder than Wednesday with humidity also moderated. There is a good chance for a wetting rain this morning and from tonight into Friday.

FORECAST FOR TODAY: Mostly cloudy (80-100%). Rain or snow showers, mainly before 1100 and after 1600. Patchy Smoke. Snow level 8,000-8,500 feet MSL.

INPUTS

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The major fuel types found in and around the Pack Trail Fire area are very high load timber fuel type with some shrub / grass types intermixed. The primary carrier of the fire will be in the heavy timber (Englemann Spruce and Subalpine Fir, TU5) with a 60% standing snag component. Sage / grass (GS2) is largely dormant and receptive to rapid fire spread. Spread rates and flame lengths will be moderate to high in these fuel types until the forecasted moisture event moves across the fire area.

The large-scale drying trend will quickly come to an end by Thu/Fri due to incoming moisture event.

Ignition Receptiveness: ERC level is at the 94th percentile, however ERC levels are forecasted to drop back to normal levels with the moisture event moves into the area today.

Dryness - Fuel moistures (Fuel samples collected around the fire area on 10/08) :1 hour – 5%, and 1000 hour– 9%, Lodgepole – 105%, Sub Alpine – 111%, Spruce – 105%, Whitebark Pine – 105%, Sage brush – 84%, Pine grass – 129%
Fuel moistures will moderate due to the moisture events the next three days.

General discussion: A strong low-pressure system and associated cold front will impact the entire area Mostly cloudy. Rain and snow showers expected today. Snow level 8,000-8,500 feet MSL.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

A moderate to heavy amount of precipitation is expected with the incoming storm for the next two days. The coverage will be across the entire fire area. The cooler temperatures increased relative humidity situation, and precipitation will have a significant effect on the existing fuel dryness and fire behavior activity today. Fire activity will be fairly domicile with very little to no measurable advancement or heat intensity development.

General

Strong Cold Front Brings Much Colder Temperatures, Wetting Rains & Mountain Snow

Significant moistening of fuels will begin across the entire fire area.

All Divisions – Creeping and smoldering in the sheltered 1000 hr. fuels will be the primary fire behavior observed today. Expect very little to no fire advancement today.

All readings are using daily worst-case scenario.

Firefighter & Public Safety Is The # 1 Priority



Adverse weather conditions increase your odds of being involved in an accident. Is your trip necessary? Can it wait until the conditions get better?

1. Speed is not your friend. As Slow As Possible, As Fast As Necessary.
2. Slow and Steady – When approaching a stretch of visibly muddy/snow covered road or ground, maintain a slow but steady speed.
3. Maintain Control – Keep the wheels straight as you enter the muck and for as long as your momentum continues. Turning the wheels will only slow momentum and increase your odds of getting stuck.
4. Lock It In – If you have four-wheel drive, lock it in before entering the mud/snow. If you wait until you need it, it may be too late. More tires turning with power through soil will improve your chances of making it through and will also reduce tire spin, which merely digs deep ruts in the road.
5. Sometimes you can't get there from here. It's far easier to discover an alternate route than to find someone willing and able to come to your rescue. Walking the rest of the way is better than walking home.
6. Walk it first. If you can't negotiate mud, sand or other obstacles on foot, it's highly unlikely your vehicle can make it. It's critical to check out a water-covered route: Unless you've seen another vehicle go through it, you can't be certain it doesn't hide a huge hole.
7. Tell somebody. Tell somebody where you're going and when you expect to be back. At least they'll know when and where to start searching.

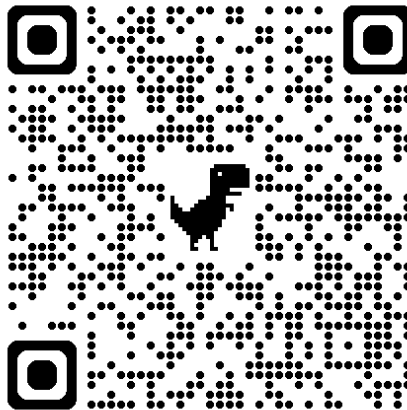

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
