.DISCUSSION...

Dry warm days through Tue, with a strong cold front and wet system arriving Wed. Winds will increase Mon and Tue, with gusts to 25 mph on higher terrain Tue aft/eve. A cold front will move through Wed, with W to NW winds 10-20 mph, gusting 20-30 mph. Rain/snow will spread W to E through the day, with snow levels initially around 10000 ft, but rapidly falling to 6-8000 ft Wed night, and to 4500 to 6500 ft Thu night. Low temps in the mountains will be below 32 Wed night, with widespread 20s, and even some teens, Thu night.

 - 3. If I'm wearing earplugs, I can't hear my swamper/falling boss yell "RUN!"
 - 2. The guy in camp said I didn't need that on this fire.
 - 1. No one else is wearing theirs, including my supervisor.
