.DISCUSSION...

Temperatures warming up to 5-10 degrees above normal Sunday through the rest of the week. Weather doesn't change much through the week, outside of one frontal system on Monday. This will bring 20-25 mph afternoon gusts, 30-50% chance of precip in northern zones, 15-25% chance of wetting rain, and mixed precipitation to ridges. Cloud cover increases Monday morning and lasts through Tuesday. Guidance is hinting at a switch to a wetter pattern next weekend.





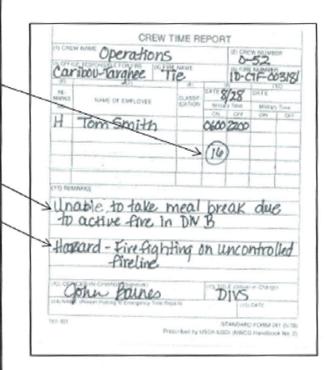
