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## Strategic Framework

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Yellow Lake Fire. Values at risk include human safety, critical infrastructure, natural resources and local economy. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success while ensuring firefighter safety.

## Leaders Intent

Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved in the Yellow Lake Fire. Ensure transparent, timely, and accurate communication flow at all levels of the incident and strengthen relationships with stakeholders, communities and cooperators. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:

- Personnel safety and the safety of others, including driving slowly and defensively.
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work/rest cycles.
- Professional behavior and conduct including no use of drugs or alcohol.

## Management Objectives

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Utilize natural barriers, constructed features, and favorable fuel types that will provide the greatest possibility for suppression success.
- Coordinate suppression activities and suppression repair with assigned incident resource advisors to minimize impacts on natural and cultural resources.
- Provide initial attack response within the identified Yellow Lake Fire Temporary Flight Restriction area.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and keep cost commensurate with values at risk.

## Control Objectives

Keep the Yellow Lake Fire:

- Keep the fire north of Red Creek Mountain
- Keep the fire South of State Route 150 corridor
- Keep the fire East of Camp Hollow
- Keep the fire West of Granddaddy Lake and the confluence of the west/north fork Duchesne River

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

Unseasonably warm and dry weather is expected the remainder of the week. Temperatures will average 15 degrees warmer than normal with humidity minimums near 20%. There may be a few cloud build-ups this afternoon, so watch for squirrely wind directions if they develop over or near the fire. Strong nighttime inversions are forecast the next several nights, so expect smoke to settle into the canyons after sunset with poor visibility becoming a hazard up until the inversion lifts mid-day.

**WEDNESDAY:**

**WEATHER:** Poor visibility this morning, improving after noon. Mostly sunny...scattered afternoon clouds.

**MAXIMUM TEMPERATURES:** 64 to 68. (↑ 1-3) 76° at ICP.

**MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:** 18-22% (↓ 3-5)

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** - Variable 6 mph until 1200. West 8 to 12 mph, gusts 14 to 18 mph in the afternoon.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** - Downvalley 1-3 mph thru 1100. Upvalley 5-9 mph with gusts 12-15 mph aft 1200.

**CHANCE OF MEASURABLE RAIN (≥ 0.01"):** 0%

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Valley inversion lifting after 1200. Unstable after 1300. Mixing to 9,500 feet AGL.

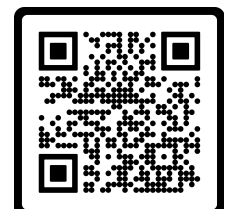

## FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** The majority of the fire is at present in a backing alignment and with the absence of any wind event, expect slow to moderate rates of spread. Spotting will be short range from torching trees and rollout. Expect active burning from about noon until sundown. Areas of grass and sage are struggling to carry fire in the absence of wind and often will not support fire after dark. Single and group tree torching will continue and short intense crown runs were timber, slope and wind align are probable. With multiple steep narrow drainages there is the potential for fire whirl development.

### SPECIFIC:

**Branch XX:** Highest potential for fire growth will be north of Hwy35 and along the North Fork of the Duchesne River. Expect active backing with short range spotting and rollout.

**Branch V:** Minimal fire growth is expected in the absence of any wind. Torching and short range spotting will continue in timber stands.

**Night:** Minimal forward fire progression expected. Expect pockets of timber above the inversion to continue to burn actively. Below the inversion jackpots of dead and down will continue to burnout.

**IA:** Any new starts that are in alignment with wind slope have the potential exceed the capabilities of ground forces without air support in the timber. Ensure you have a good anchor point before engaging.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Westside of the fire good flying conditions by 1000hrs. Eastside the inversion is forecasted to mix out by 1200hrs some drainages may clear out sooner.

## SAFETY

Multiple fuel factors are present that can contribute to large fire growth including heavy loading of dead and down material, bug kill and unusually low live and dead fuel moisture. Review Page 36 of the IRPG.

During every transition you will most likely have a new supervisor. Make sure you know who they are and get your instructions from day to day. In a transition there are many moving parts. The camp in Francis, UT is staying for now until they get set up at the Duchesne County Fairgrounds. Listen up during today’s briefings. Thanks, from the Northern Utah Interagency Team Safety Section...Great safety record!

### **Demob---before you hit the road...**

- Walk around the vehicle.
- Check the windshield, wipers, and wiper fluid level.
- Keep windows, mirrors, and lights clean to better see and be seen.
- Check headlights, turn signals, taillights, reflectors and running lights.
- Clean and adjust mirrors.
- Check front and back tires (including wheels and lug nuts).
- Under the hood, check all fluid levels and especially the Air Filter.
- Drivers to be rested up prior to driving.
- If tired and by yourself, take a safety nap.

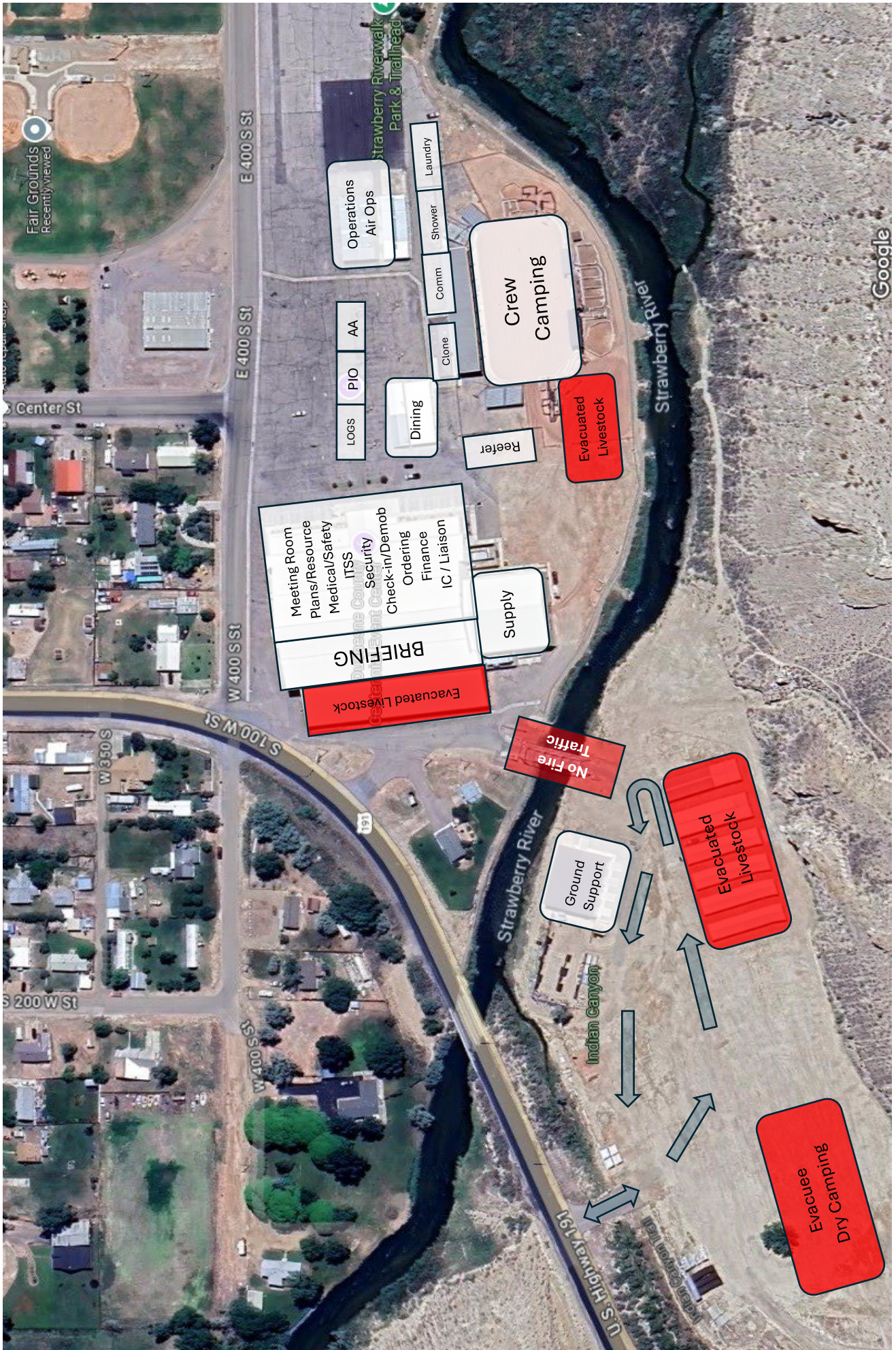




