Discussion: On Wednesday, rain showers are possible again (a 20-30% chance) as a weather system remains stalled just to the northeast of the region. Rain showers are most likely to occur between 1200 and 1800, but could be earlier in the day. By late Wednesday, high pressure will start to build across the region bringing dry, stable air. Skies will clear Wednesday evening allowing for a strong inversion to develop. Warmer and drier conditions are expected starting Thursday.

PPE History



- Firefighter PPE starts clear back to 1900's and has been constantly evolving
- Firefighters commonly use 10-12 pieces of PPE during fire line operations
- What are specialty types of PPE used?
- What is your most forgotten piece of PPE?
- Talk with your crew and remember to inspect all components of PPE and why PPE is important.

PPE Timelines

- 1919 E.D. Bullard came up with the hard hat, commissioned by the Navy
- Nomex shirts and pants were first created in the early 1960's by DuPont scientist Dr. Wilfred Sweeney.
- 1907 the German company Ohropax was founded by Max Negwer introduced the first cotton wrapped wax ear plugs, used by soldiers to protect against gun fire.
- Chainsaw chaps have been used since 1965 by the USDA, in 1981 a transition from the ballistic nylon pad to the Kevlar pad occurred.


