Discussion: Rain showers will be intermittent throughout the day, with brief breaks in the clouds. The rain/snow line will be near 10,500 ft in the morning, with snow level dropping to 9,000 ft in the evening hours as a weak cold front drops into the region. Lightning and graupel cannot be ruled out in a stronger shower, but will be isolated. Precipitation amounts will be generally less than a tenth of an inch. Winds will come out of the southwest early in the afternoon, then will shift to become out of the northwest by evening. A few isolated rain and snow showers are possible again on Tuesday, with snow level increasing back to 11,000 ft during the day.

Forecast for Today: *Intermittent rain and snow showers throughout the day. Wind shift.*

Sky/Weather: Variable clouds. Numerous rain showers. Snow level dropping from 10,500 to 9,500 ft.

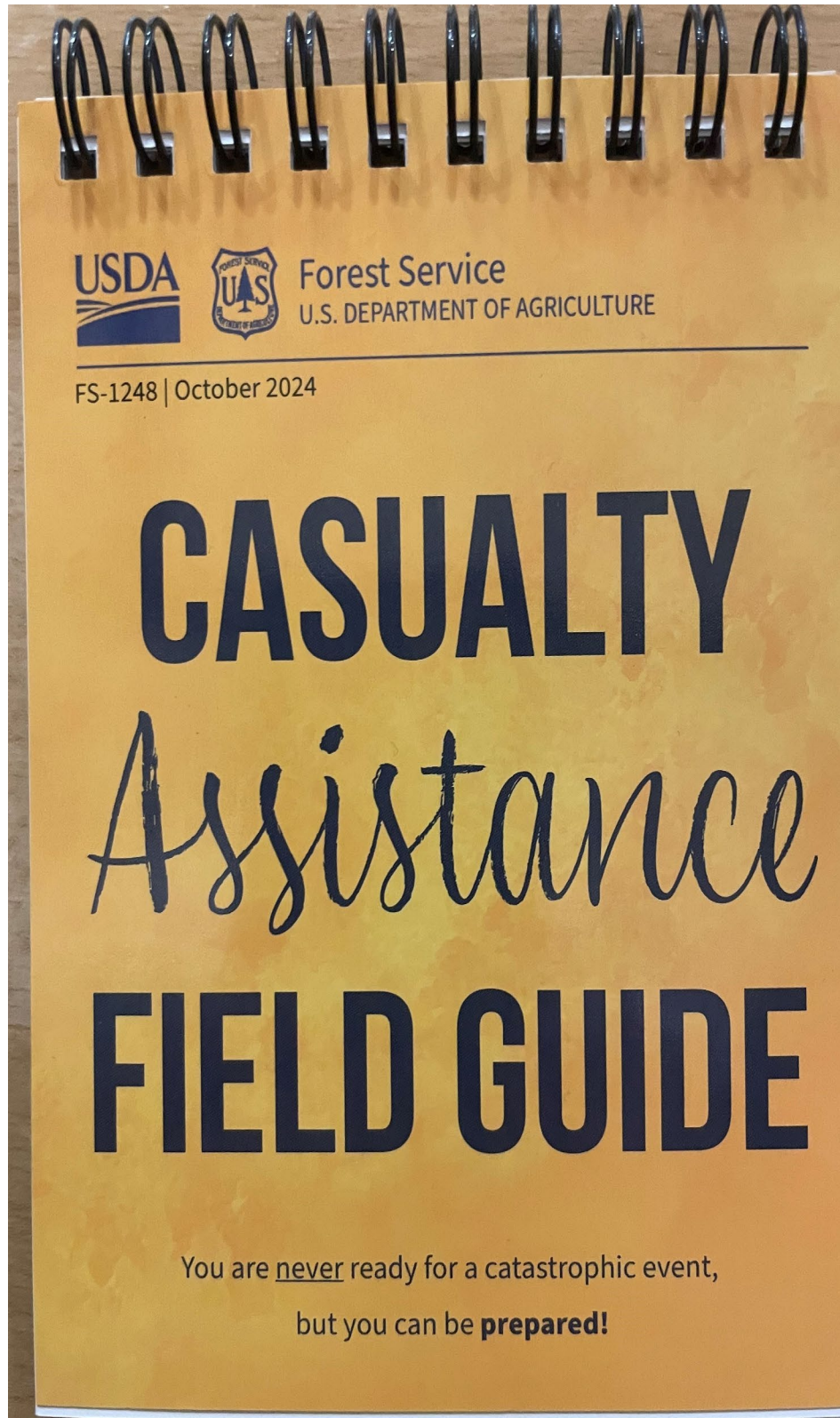

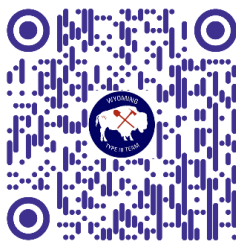
