<u>TASK:</u> Continue to patrol, monitor and mop up control lines as needed. Work with READs to complete suppression repair as identified in field maps using equipment crews. Remove hazard trees along FS identified road corridors. Remove hazard trees in and around private property as directed.

<u>PURPOSE:</u> Protect critical roads, infrastructure and natural resources. Keep fire in its current footprint and repair dozer lines to specifications outlined in the suppression repair guidelines.

<u>END STATE</u>: Fire is maintained in its current footprint and further degradation to natural resources and other critical infrastructure has been reduced.
