The boundary of Travel Restricted Areas may be marked as shown below; also refer to Road, Trail and Area Restrictions.

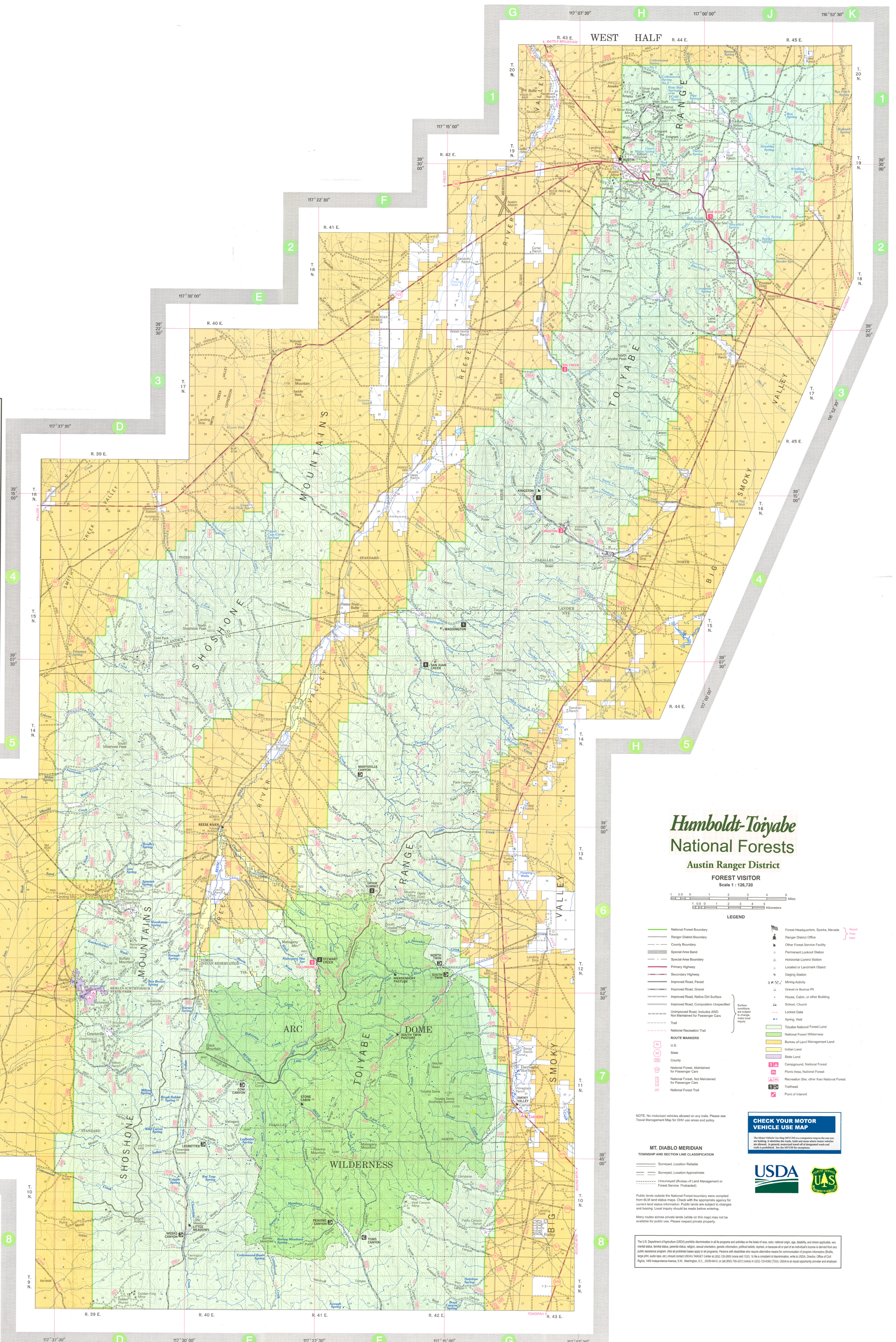
ENTERING TRAVEL RESTRICTED AREA

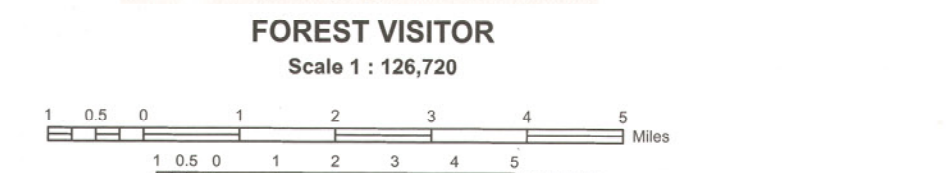
