PROCEDURAL APPROACH TO SAFETY

In a fire situation there are subjective hazards that we as firefighters create, and there are objective hazards such as fire entrapment, snags, rolling debris, and terrain that are inherent to firefighting. The subjective hazards we have control over just by using our attitudes and abilities. The objective hazards we cannot eliminate. The possibility of injury or entrapment is always there, the probability may be large or small. We must take steps to reduce the risks associated with our actions. By using a set procedure each operational period, we can minimize exposure to hazards and better ensure our safety by taking the following steps.

- Determine what the assignment is
 - Identify the hazards
 - Analyze the risks
- Implement steps to ensure safety
- Re-analyze the situation as it changes

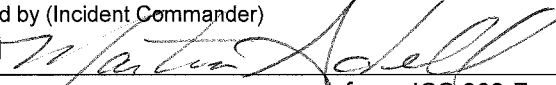

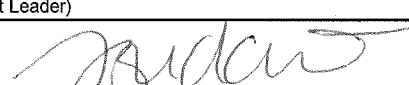
- Safety will be managed using sound risk management principles through out the incident.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The atmosphere is trending warmer and drier through the weekend as an upper level ridge retrogrades west across the Rockies. High temperatures on Friday will increase several degrees with minimum relative humidity values falling below 20% for most locations. Wind speeds will remain gusty and veer from the southwest to west by late afternoon.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy in the morning...then becoming mostly clear.
TEMPERATURES: 5500-7000 feet: 81-86, Over 7000 feet: 74-79, except highest peaks over 8000 feet: 70-75
HUMIDITY: 15-23% 24 hour trend...down 7-9%
20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP -: Southwest 6-12 before 1000...thereafter southwest...becoming westerly in the afternoon 15-25 with gusts to 35 mph. SLOPE/VALLEY -: Primarily down slope/down valley 6-10 through 1000. Thereafter...Southwest...becoming westerly at 10-15 with gusts to 25 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Weak inversion lifting before 1100...Mixing height 10000 ft AGL

WEATHER FOR TONIGHT: Mostly clear.

TEMPERATURES: 5500-7000 feet: 48-53 valley bottoms...except DIV W/IR/T/S where lows of 37-45 are expected. 51-56 for mid slopes and ridge tops.
Humidity: 35-50% valley bottoms...locally higher in valleys within DIV W/IR/T/S. 30-45% ridge tops and mid-slopes.
Wind (Eye Level): Slope/Valley: Down slope/down valley 4-8 mph...except 7-12 within northwest to southeast drainages.
Ridgetops: Before 0000...west 10-15 gusts to 25 mph...then becoming northwest after midnight 5-10 with gusts to 15 mph.
CWR: 0% LAL: 1
Haines Index: 3 (very low)

OUTLOOK FOR SATURDAY:

Weather: Mostly clear and sunny.
Temperatures: 5500-7000 feet: 79-84, 7000-9000 feet: 71-78... except highest peaks over 8000 feet: 68-73
Relative Humidity: 17-24%
20 FT WINDS:
RIDGETOP - Northwest 7-12 gusts to 18 mph before 1000...then becoming west 10-15 with gusts to 20 mph.
SLOPE/VALLEY- :Primarily down slope/down valley 7-12 mph through 1000...thereafter...generally west 7-14 mph with a few higher gusts possible within west to east upslope drainages.
CWR: 0% LAL: 1
Haines Index: 4 (low)

EXTENDED FORECAST: Sunday : Mostly sunny and warm with little chance of precipitation. Highs generally will range from the mid to upper 70s over the higher elevations, to the mid to upper 80s for the valleys and mid slopes. Minimum relative humidity will be 18-24 %. Wind direction is expected to be from the southwest in the 10-20 mph range .

Looking ahead to early next week...upper level ridge of high pressure will once again slowly build east as a trough becomes established off the Pacific Northwest Coast. Southwesterly flow aloft across southern and central Idaho will provide for increasing chances of precipitation /albeit a slight chance/ through Tuesday evening. Along with the increasing precipitation chances, slightly cooler temperatures, increasing relative humidity and general winds from the south of 10-20 mph will be expected.

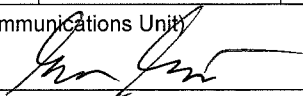

- Pick up all flagging, litter, and trash and pack out to disposal site.
- If water-drafting activities disturbed stream banks reconstruct the bank edge to prevent erosion.
- Remove any dams or other obstructions in channels created for water drafting/pumping.
- Return fish screens (buckets) to Supply.

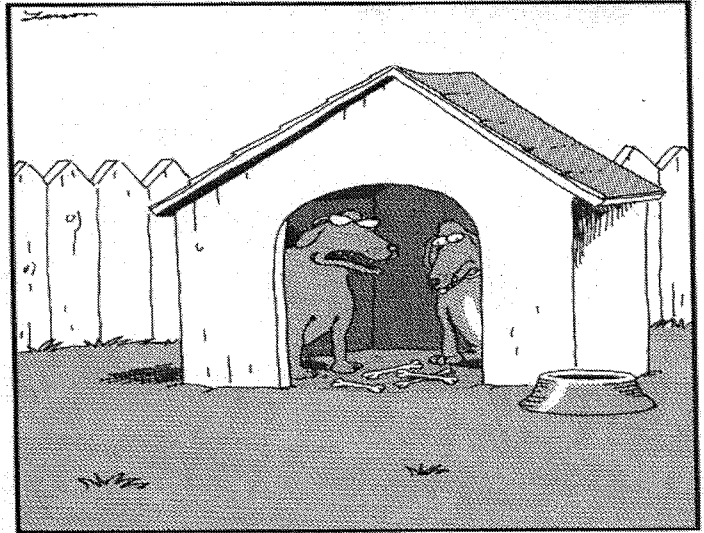
Handline Repair	Mechanical (Dozer) Line Rehab
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recontour handline by pulling berm, duff, and soil onto line. Scatter slash, logs, limbs, pine bows or sage back over handline. • Backfill all cupped and trenched lines (including lines for hose lays and interior lines). Backfill with soil, duff, limbs, slash, etc. • Flush cut stumps to within 4 inches of the ground. Cover stumps with soil, ash, vegetation... • Scatter slash created during handline construction. Scatter back over rehabed handline. Do not scatter into creeks. • For handline in stream banks or wetlands, reconstruct the stream bank and pull back sod and vegetation. • Obscure handline that connects to existing trail/road routes to the extent possible. Utilize existing downed material (logs and limbs). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recontour dozer line by pulling berm (soil, duff) onto the line, scatter sagebrush and small logs in a natural arrangement. • Remove fill that was placed within drainages, so that water flows unobstructed. A hand crew may be needed to re-establish the drainage channel. • Ensure proper drainage of waterbars. • Decompact line where designated by Resource Advisors. • Where possible, block the first 200 feet of the dozer line that ties into the existing roads and trails. Use existing native materials. • Where dozer line crosses and/or has damaged existing recreation trails, reconstruct trails to previous condition and width using hand crews to rebuild trails. A Forest trails specialist will direct all major work to repair trails. • Rebuild fence where it was removed to construct line. • Dozer line on steep slopes (>30%) or in riparian areas may require rehabilitation with hand crews. • Coordinate broadcast seeding of dozer line with a Resource Advisor.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Water bars should slope at a 45 angle to the fire line to move water off the line to the down slope side. Always place a water bar at a slope change. Water bars can be made out of rock, logs, or drainage dips.

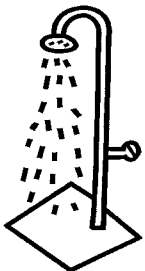
