Div M – Areas of concern are Dugout Creek and Lodgepole Creek.

Div P – Watch for fire movement and runs in the Shields River drainage, around the Crandell Creek.

Woods Creek

Div. YY - The Atlantic Creek and Boulder Creek drainages are of concern due to alignment with forecast winds and sparse rainfall from the last rain event

Div MM – Watch for the potential of fire moving into the Gypsy Creek drainage.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Haze, 3-5 mile visibility, possible rain and showers in the PM.

SAFETY: The Pocket Card is a tool for field personnel to locally track fire potential throughout the season. It is based on historical weather and fire occurrence for a localized area.
