LEADERSHIP

Confidant and Competent is Essential for Crew's Safety

- **TAKE CHARGE** of assigned resources.
- **MOTIVATE** crewmembers with a “can do” safety attitude.
- **DEMONSTRATE INITIATIVE** by acting in the absence of others.
- **COMMUNICATE** by giving specific instructions, solicit feedback.
- **SUPERVISE** at the scene of action.

TRANSITION

- Keep situational awareness during transition.
- Ensure that instructions are clear and understood.
- If communication plan changes, ensure that you get the right clone and test comms.
- Establish accountability of your people.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: For Cougar Rock Complex (Hobbit 1, Scott, Trapper Saddle, Goat Creek)

Periods of light rain showers or sprinkles are expected for the rest of today through Wednesday morning. The potential for lightning across Shoshone county is low. Better chances for lightning are expected over Oregon, far southeast Washington, and the southern Idaho Panhandle where the atmosphere will contain more moisture and instability. Look for the scattered light rain showers to exit the Idaho Panhandle by mid to late morning on Wednesday.

Today Wednesday, July 28:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy with a 20 percent chance of light rain showers or sprinkles before 0800 pdt. Becoming partly cloudy with haze by late morning into the afternoon.

TEMPERATURES: Fire: 78 to 82°F

HUMIDITY: Fire: 30 to 35%

WINDS (20ft): Variable wind 0 to 5 mph in the morning becoming west or southwest 3 to 6 mph around noon.

HAINES INDEX: 3 Low **LAL:** 1 **CWR:** 5%

WEATHER DISCUSSION: For Cougar Rock Complex (Butte Creek, Benton Ridge Fires, Lovell Knob)

Monsoonal moisture will continue to filter into the region on Wednesday, mainly in the form of cloud cover and increasing RHs. There is potential for a few showers late tonight into Wednesday morning, but the likelihood of wetting rainfall is very low (less than 10 percent) and will likely amount to just sprinkles. Thunderstorms are not anticipated for Wednesday afternoon as most of the activity is expected further to your southeast. There is a better chance of seeing a thunderstorm this weekend. These storms could be pretty wet, with a roughly 30 percent chance of seeing a wetting rain and about a 15 percent chance of seeing a quarter inch of rain or more.

Today Wednesday, July 28:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Smoke. Slight chance of a shower.

TEMPERATURES: Fire: 78 to 83°F

HUMIDITY: Fire: 33 -38%

WINDS (20ft): Variable 2-5 mph

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Sky Weather: Partly Cloudy, Haze CWR: 5%, Temps: 75 to 80°, RH: 28 to 35%, Haines: 2 Very Low; LAL: 1
Winds (20 ft): Variable wind 0 to 5 mph in the morning becoming west or southwest 3 to 6 mph around noon.
See spot weather forecast for July 29 and 30.

FUELS: Cougar Rock Complex- 11 fires

Mixed conifer forest dominated by Western Red Cedar, Douglas Fir, Western Larch, and Grand Fir. Subalpine Alpine Fir, Engelmann Spruce and Lodge Pole Pine at the higher elevations (>4,800'). All age and size classes of conifer fuels with relatively high crown bulk density and low crown base heights. Light to moderate amounts of dead fine fuels and logging/thinning slash will contribute to surface fire spread. Herbaceous and live woody fuels are green and will generally not contribute to fire spread.

Fine Fuels: 5 -8%; 10-hr: 10%; 100hr: 11%; 1000hr: 12%

Fine dead fuels for 7/29-30 similar unless predicted weather changes. With additional moisture fuel moisture will increase.

ERC: 90 to 97th percentile. Max spotting distance: 0.2 Mile

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

General:

Expect active surface and ground fire. Single to small group tree torching/short range spotting in unburnt areas within the fire and areas of unsecured line. Live fuels and young conifer plantations should discourage crown fire activity. Except in the SAF/ES stands (i.e. Goat Fire) fire activity should remain on the ground under dense canopies and sheltered sites. Fire primarily moving in activity fuels/slash and jackpots of dead/down/litter. Both on and off-site smoke will dampen fire activity.

Backing/flanking spread 2-3 ft/min with flames 2-3 ft. Head fire with possible 5-7 ft. flame lengths and 8-10 ft/min rates of spread on the steeper sites, higher with torching and when slope and wind align.

Specific:

Benton Fires: Continued movement to the N/NW toward the Reservoir. Fire will move towards the tether line on the east side of the fire.

Butte Creek: Continued fire growth to the E/NE of Thompson Point and towards the Reservoir. Thompson creek is currently suppressing fire growth.

Goat Creek: Sub-alpine fir will continue to promote fire spread thru single tree and group tree torching in most directions. Predominant spread direction S/SE. This will continue to occur until significant moisture is realized.

Probability of Ignition (PIG): 60-65% during the peak of the burning period.



PIG for 7/29 to 30 similar unless drastic change in predicted weather.

AIR OPERATIONS: Notable impact to aviation over the next 24 hours will be limited surface visibility due to wildfire smoke.

SAFETY: Keep those lookouts posted. Quiet portions of the fire may suddenly wake up.

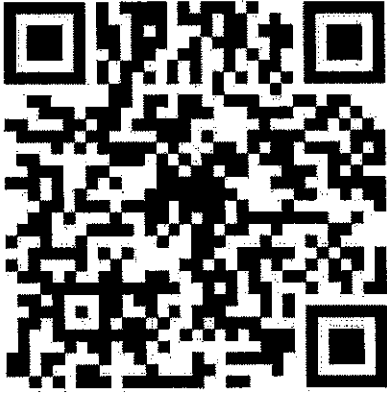

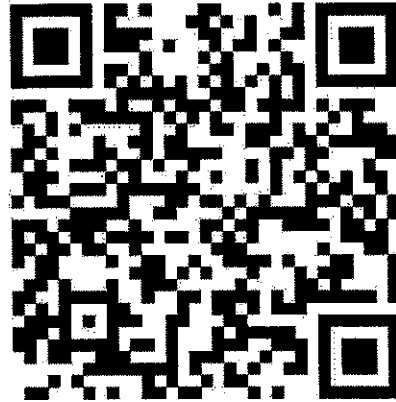

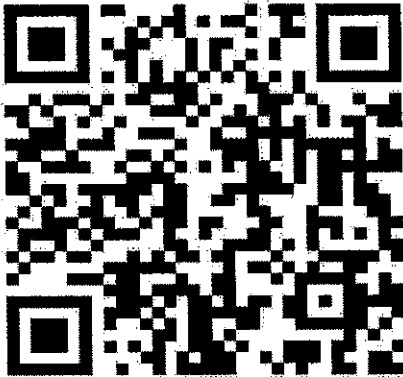

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE

USE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS TO COMMUNICATE SITUATION WITH COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
