### MAJOR HAZARDS ALL DIVISIONS

**DRIVING HAZARDS:** Use **EXTREME** caution when driving in and around the fire area. Numerous logging trucks and heavy equipment are utilizing the road systems surrounding the fires. Drive slow and **"DRIVE AS IF THERE IS AN ONCOMING TRUCK AROUND EVERY CORNER!"**

**HAZARD TREES:** Follow "Hazard Tree Safety" on page 22 in IRPG.

**COMMUNICATIONS:** Ensure you have an updated clone and have communication with adjoining forces.

**HEAVY EQUIPMENT:** Refer to "Working with Heavy Equipment" section on page 86 on IRPG.

**LOG HAULING:** Log hauling operations are active in the fire area. Use extreme caution, communicate, and drive defensively.

### SNAGS AND GREEN TREE HAZARDS

- Numerous snags, blackened trees, and green trees are falling or have fallen in work area.
- Pay special attention when working in areas of Western Red Cedar where the hazard trees may not be as obvious.
- Keep 2&1/2 times the tree length from any felling or heavy equipment operations being conducted.
- Establish no work zones for areas where hazard trees cannot be mitigated and communicate the hazard.

### FIREFIGHTER FATIGUE

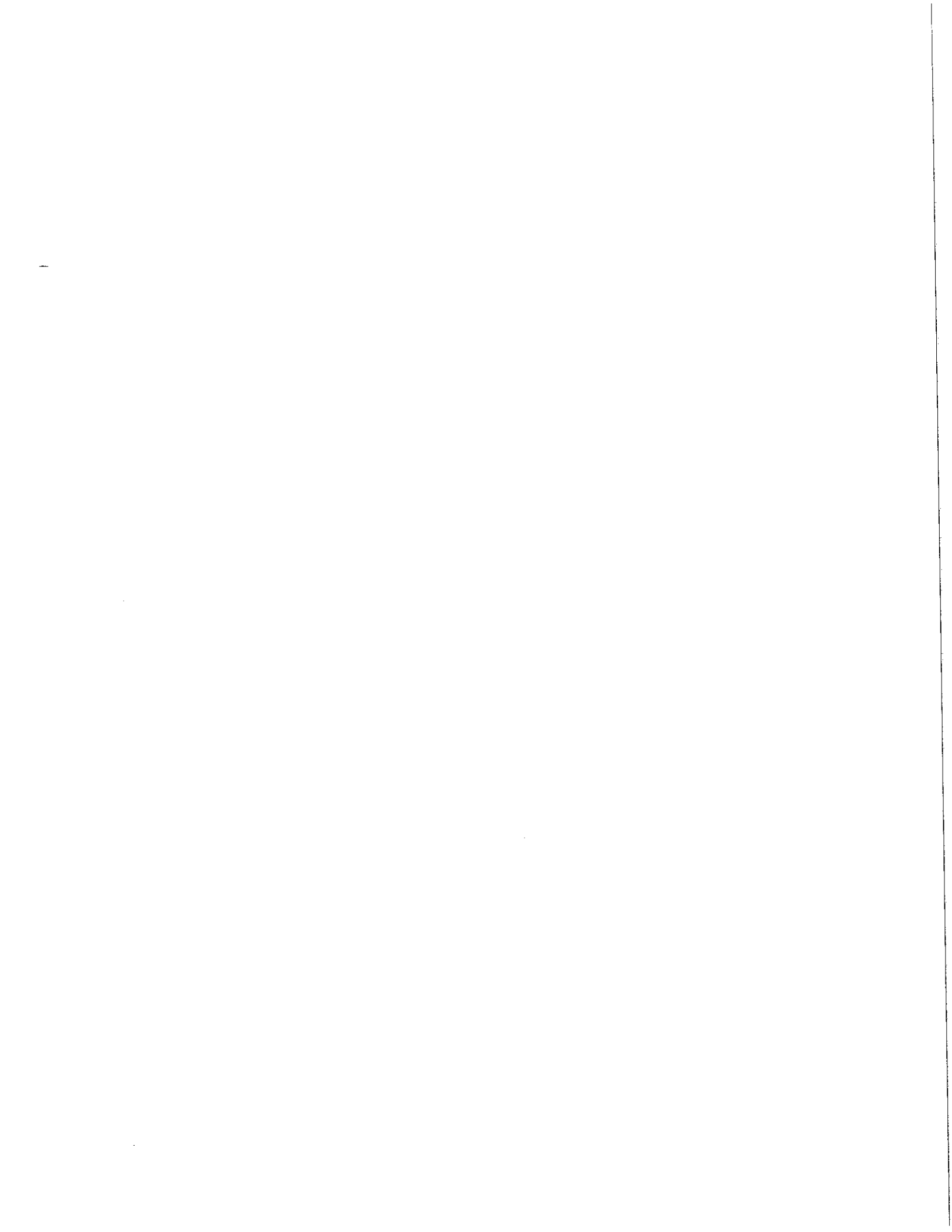
- Cumulative fatigue is dangerous. It prevents sound decision making and dulls reaction time.

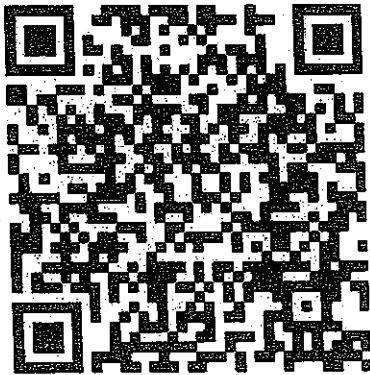



**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** For Cougar Rock Complex (Hobbit 1, Scott, Trapper Saddle, Goat Creek)

Hot, dry and unstable Friday and Saturday, poor relative humidity recoveries Friday night. Fires will be under a ridge of high pressure Friday into Saturday. This will result in warm temperatures and dry conditions. Friday and Saturday will be particularly warm, dry and unstable. An easterly pressure gradient will also tighten up over the fire Friday into Saturday with breezy winds on ridge tops. Monsoonal moisture will increase with a low pressure system Saturday night into Monday. This will bring a chance of showers and wet thunderstorms. A wind shift with outflows from showers and thunderstorms is expected sometime Saturday night. Wetting rains will be possible with total rainfall accumulations of 0.30 to 0.60 inches is expected, but could be as much as 0.75 to 1.00 inch.

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** For Cougar Rock Complex (Butte Creek, Benton Ridge Fires, Lovell Knob)

Hot and dry conditions continue Friday and Saturday. Overnight Rh recovery will be poor on Friday night, improving some Saturday night. Winds will be relatively light but a notable change to easterly winds will occur later Friday continuing into Saturday. Monsoonal moisture begins to increase Saturday night with increasing shower and thunderstorm chances Sunday into Monday. The best rain chances will be Sunday night into Monday. Wetting rains are likely but exact rain amounts are still in question. By Monday, daytime temperatures will be 15-20 degrees cooler than observed this weekend with min Rh improving to 40-50 percent.

### INPUTS

#### **WEATHER SUMMARY:**

**Sky Weather:** Sunny, to partly sunny, haze **CWR:** 0-2 %, **Temps:** 86 to 100°, **RH:** 18 to 26%, **Haines:** 4 Low - 5 Mod; **LAL:** 1-2

**Winds (20 ft):** East to NE 1 to 9 mph on Friday, east to NE 4 to 12 mph Saturday with ridgetop gusts 10 to 20 mph.

#### **FUELS: Cougar Rock Complex- 10 fires**

Mixed conifer forest dominated by Western Red Cedar, Douglas Fir, Western Larch, and Grand Fir. Subalpine Alpine Fir, Engelmann Spruce and Lodge Pole Pine at the higher elevations (>4,800'). All age and size classes of conifer fuels with relatively high crown bulk density and low crown base heights. Light to moderate amounts of dead fine fuels and logging/ thinning slash will contribute to surface fire spread. Herbaceous and live woody fuels are green and will generally not contribute to fire spread.

**Fine Fuels:** 2-5%; **10-hr:** 8%; **100hr:** 9%; **1000hr:** 12%

**ERC:** >97<sup>th</sup> percentile.      **Max spotting distance:** 0.2 Mile plus with ridgetop winds

### OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### **General:**

Expect active surface and ground fire. Single to small group tree torching/short range spotting in unburnt areas within the fire and areas of unsecured line. Live fuels and young conifer plantations should discourage crown fire activity. Except in the SAF/ES stands (i.e. Goat Fire) fire activity should remain on the ground under dense canopies and sheltered sites. Fire primarily moving in activity fuels/slash and jackpots of dead/down/litter. Both on and off-site smoke will damper fire activity.

Backing/flanking spread 2-3 ft/min with flames 2-3 ft. Head fire with possible 5-7 ft. flame lengths and 16 ft/min rates of spread on the steeper sites, higher with torching and when slope and wind align.

#### **Specific:**

**Benton Fires:** Continued movement to the N/NW toward the Reservoir. Fire will move towards the tether line on the east side of the fire.

**Butte Creek:** Continued fire growth to the E/NE of Thompson Point and towards the Reservoir. Thompson Creek is currently suppressing fire growth.

**Goat Creek:** Sub-alpine fir will continue to promote fire spread thru single tree and group tree torching in most directions. Predominant spread direction S/SE. This will continue to occur until significant moisture is realized.

**Probability of Ignition (PIG):** 75% during the peak of the burning period.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Notable impact to aviation over the next 48 hours will be limited surface and slantwise **visibility** due to **wildfire smoke**. Ridgetop wind gusts on Saturday may be factor also

**SAFETY:** Keep informed of weather changes, especially with wind shift to East to Northeast and monsoonal moisture arrival late Saturday.

## Northern Rockies COVID-19 Pocket Card

### Interagency Fire Operations

- Maintain social distancing from any personnel outside your fire module
- Complete (daily) wildland fire COVID-19 health screening tool for each firefighter
- Upon resource order, collect intelligence on how local units will receive incoming resources
- Minimize unnecessary stops in-route to assignments
- Utilize digital technology (AirDrop, QR codes, photos, text) to the extent possible to share information such as Crew Manifest, Maps, IAPs, CTRs, etc
- Use remote briefing via radio or cell phone if possible. If not, maintain social distancing, wear face covering and minimize personnel at the briefing.

### Maintain Situational Awareness of The Fire Environment: 10 & 1B, ICES

- Monitor each other, watch for symptoms (Firefighter Health Screening Tool)
- Never share PPE, UTV & flight helmets, radios, or other equipment
- Implement daily decontamination procedures of apparatus and equipment
- Adjust operational periods to allow for additional COVID-19 logistics
- Plan for overnight lodging/camping/feeding scenarios that maintain separation from other fire personnel and community
