MAJOR HAZARDS ALL DIVISIONS

DRIVING HAZARDS: Use **EXTREME** caution when driving in and around the fire area. Numerous logging trucks and heavy equipment are utilizing the road systems surrounding the fires. Drive slow and **“DRIVE AS IF THERE IS AN ONCOMING TRUCK AROUND EVERY CORNER!”**

HAZARD TREES: Follow “Hazard Tree Safety” on page 22 in IRPG.

COMMUNICATIONS: Ensure you have an updated clone and have communication with adjoining forces.

HEAVY EQUIPMENT: Refer to “Working with Heavy Equipment” section on page 86 on IRPG.

LOG HAULING: Log hauling operations are active in the fire area. Use extreme caution, communicate, and drive defensively.

THUNDERSTORM SAFETY

- Take shelter in vehicle when possible.
- Take shelter in a building, if available. When there is no shelter avoid high objects such as lone trees.
- Keep away from wire fences, telephone lines, and conductive elevated objects.
- Do not use radios or telephones.
- Avoid grouping together.
- Sit and crouch if in open country.

HAVE A PLAN IN PLACE REGARDING ROAD CONDITIONS IN THE EVENT THAT HEAVY RAINS COME WITH THE THUNDERSTORMS!

COVID-19 MITIGATIONS

- If you are planning on coming to ICP, let the front desk know who you need to see, they will come meet you.

1. Incident Name: Cougar Rock Complex	2. Operational Period: Date From: Aug 1, 21 Date To: Aug. 1, 21 Time From: 0600 Time To: 2200
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3. Objective(s):

1. Protect human life. Firefighter and public safety will be given the highest priority at all times. Risks to firefighters and the public will be managed by utilizing a risk-based approach to decision making. An emphasis will be placed on exposure to accidents and heat related illness.
2. Utilize appropriate fire strategies to minimize fire impacts to residences, commercial properties, critical community infrastructure and natural resources, merchantable timber and critical watersheds.
3. Maintain and foster relationships with users of the public lands, landowners, agencies and local communities.
4. Effectively manage costs commensurate with the high value assets and resources to be protected and risks.
5. Prioritize potential fire suppression and values at risk protection opportunities.

4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:

1. Crews will look for opportunities to install containment line on the west side of the Goat fire.
2. The Cougar Rock Complex is committed to following the current CDC guidelines for the Covid-19 precautions and mitigation measures consistent with local protocols. Please adhere to Team 3 Covid-19 precautions and procedures at ICP due to confined work spaces.
3. Hold installed containment lines and go direct when possible.
4. Crews will continue to secure the Eastern containment line down to Butte Creek Road on the Benton Ridge fire.
5. Expect increased fire behavior throughout the Cougar Rock Complex similar to the Goat Creek fire on July 30.

General Situational Awareness

With the increase in fire behavior yesterday, ensure that you have LCES in place for today and tomorrow's operational periods.


Given the chance of showers and thunderstorms predicted, be mindful of the road systems you are utilizing in the event that significant moisture starts to occur. Keep a heads up for gusty outflow winds surrounding thunderstorms. Risk management doesn't get in the way of doing the mission - it is the way we do the mission. +



WEATHER DISCUSSION: For Cougar Rock Complex – Branch I (Hobbit 1, Scott, Trapper Saddle, Goat Creek)

...FLASH FLOOD WATCH SUNDAY AFTERNOON AND EVENING...

Significant changes are on the way as weather disturbances moving up from the south are expected to bring showers and thunderstorms Sunday into Monday with high potential for wetting rain Sunday. Thunderstorms with heavy rain combined with steep terrain and burned areas could result in a dangerous and sudden wall of water which will be hazardous to anyone in its path. **Rain amounts of .25 to .50 inch is likely**, with higher amounts in **excess of an inch under thunderstorms** Sunday afternoon and evening.

Today Sunday, August 01:

WEATHER: Partly sunny. Showers likely with thunderstorms through the day

TEMPERATURES: Fire: 78°F

HUMIDITY: Fire: 48%

WINDS (20ft): South 3 to 9 mph. Gusty and erratic winds expected near thunderstorms.

Monday, August 02:

WEATHER: Partly sunny. A chance of rain showers and a slight chance thunderstorms

TEMPERATURES: Fire: 77°F

HUMIDITY: Fire: 50%

WINDS (20ft): West 3 to 7 mph. Gusty and erratic winds expected near thunderstorms

WEATHER DISCUSSION: For Cougar Rock Complex – Branch II (Butte Creek, Benton Ridge Fires, Lovell Knob)

Latest model guidance depicts thunderstorm activity picking up as early as 2 pm PDT Sunday and lingering over the region through midnight Sunday night. It could come as waves, the initial activity could also bring strong wind gusts from the south, possibly over 40 mph. **Sunday precipitation of .10 inch day, .11 inch night. Monday .01 inch** If the fire gets hit directly with the heaviest cores, rain amounts could exceed 0.50" or more. More isolated showers and thunderstorms possibly by Monday afternoon.

Today Sunday, August 01:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy. Chance morning rain showers, showers and thunderstorms afternoon

TEMPERATURES: Fire: 83 to 88°F

HUMIDITY: Fire: 53 to 58%

WINDS (20ft): Variable 1-3 mph, becoming S 4-7 mph in afternoon. Strong gusts, 40 mph with thunderstorms

HAINES INDEX: 2 Very low **LAL:** 3 **CWR:** 60%

Monday, August 02:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Chance morning rain; slight chance of showers and thunderstorms afternoon

TEMPERATURES: 82-87°

HUMIDITY: 43 to 48%

WINDS (20ft): Variable 1-3 mph.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: - *FLASH FLOOD WATCH SUNDAY AFTERNOON TO EVENING* -

Sky Weather: Partly sunny, to mostly cloudy **CWR:** 10 to 60 %, **Temps:** 77 to 87°, **RH:** 43 to 50%, **Haines:** 2 to 3 Very Low **LAL:** 3 to 2

Winds (20 ft): South to variable 3 to 9 mph on Sunday, west to variable 1 to 7 mph Monday.

Gusty and erratic winds near thunderstorms up to 40 mph.

FUELS: Cougar Rock Complex- 10 fires

Mixed conifer forest dominated by Western Red Cedar, Douglas Fir, Western Larch, and Grand Fir. Subalpine Alpine Fir, Engelmann Spruce and Lodge Pole Pine at the higher elevations (>4,800'). All age and size classes of conifer fuels with relatively high crown bulk density and low crown base heights. Light to moderate amounts of dead fine fuels and logging/ thinning slash will contribute to surface fire spread. Herbaceous and live woody fuels are green and will generally not contribute to fire spread.

Fine Fuels: 2-5%; 10-hr: 8%; 100hr: 9%; 1000hr: 12% (These values will rise with anticipated rain showers Sun-Mon)

ERC: >97th percentile. **Max spotting distance:** 0.2 Mile plus with ridgetop winds

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

General:

Expect low to active surface and ground fire. Anticipated rain showers may not penetrate the tree canopy to wet surface fuels. Single to small group tree torching/short range spotting in unburnt areas within the fire and areas of unsecured line. Live fuels and young conifer plantations should discourage crown fire activity. Except in the SAF/ES stands (i.e. Goat Fire) fire activity should remain on the ground under dense canopies and sheltered sites. Fire primarily moving in activity fuels/slash and jackpots of dead/down/litter. Both on and off-site smoke, cloud cover and higher humidity values will dampen fire activity.

Backing/flanking spread 2-3 ft/min with flames 2-3 ft. Head fire with possible 5-7 ft. flame lengths and 16 ft/min rates of spread on the steeper sites, higher with torching and when slope and wind align. **(These values will decrease with anticipated rain showers Sun-Mon)**

Specific:

Benton Fires: Continued movement to the N/NW toward the Reservoir. Fire will move towards the tether line on the east side of the fire.

Butte Creek: Continued fire growth to the E/NE of Thompson Point and towards the Reservoir. Thompson Creek is currently suppressing fire growth.

Goat Creek: Sub-alpine fir will continue to promote fire spotting thru single tree and group tree torching. Fire spread may be limited or temporarily reduced with likely rain showers on Sunday and Monday. Interior burning will continue to occur unless significant moisture is received.



Probability of Ignition (PIG): 75% (Value is likely to lower with rain showers and increase in humidity)

AIR OPERATIONS: Notable impact to aviation over the next 48 hours will be area smoke, thunderstorm activity and associated thunderstorm winds

SAFETY: Keep informed of weather changes, especially with expected rain showers and thunderstorm activity for Sunday and Monday; thunderstorm outflow winds can bring down snags and fire weakened trees.




- Maintain social distancing from any personnel outside your fire module
- Complete (daily) wildland fire COVID-19 health screening tool for each firefighter
- Upon resource order, collect intelligence on how local units will receive incoming resources
- Minimize unnecessary stops in-route to assignments
- Utilize digital technology (AirDrop, QR codes, photos, text) to the extent possible to share information such as Crew Manifest, Maps, IAPs, CTRs, etc.
- Use remote briefing via radio or cell phone if possible. If not, maintain social distancing, wear face covering and minimize personnel at the briefing.

Maintain Situational Awareness of The Fire Environment: 10 & 18, LCEs

- Monitor each other, watch for symptoms (Firefighter Health Screening Tool).
- Never share PPE, UTV & flight helmets, radios, or other equipment
- Implement daily decontamination procedures of apparatus and equipment
- Adjust operational periods to allow for additional COVID-19 logistics.
- Plan for overnight lodging/camping/feeding scenarios that maintain separation from other fire personnel and community

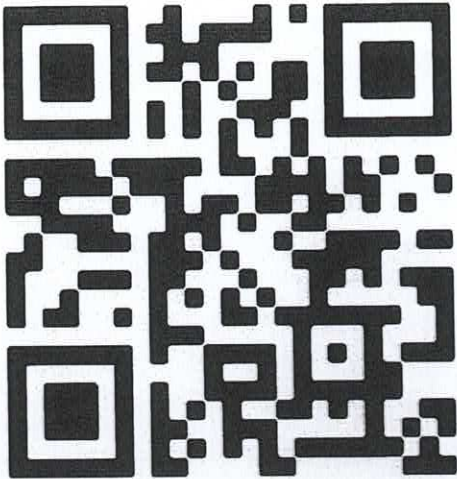

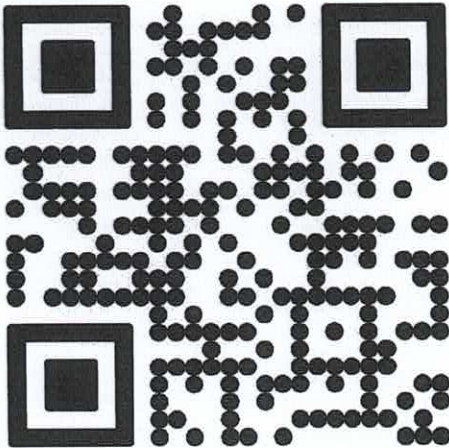

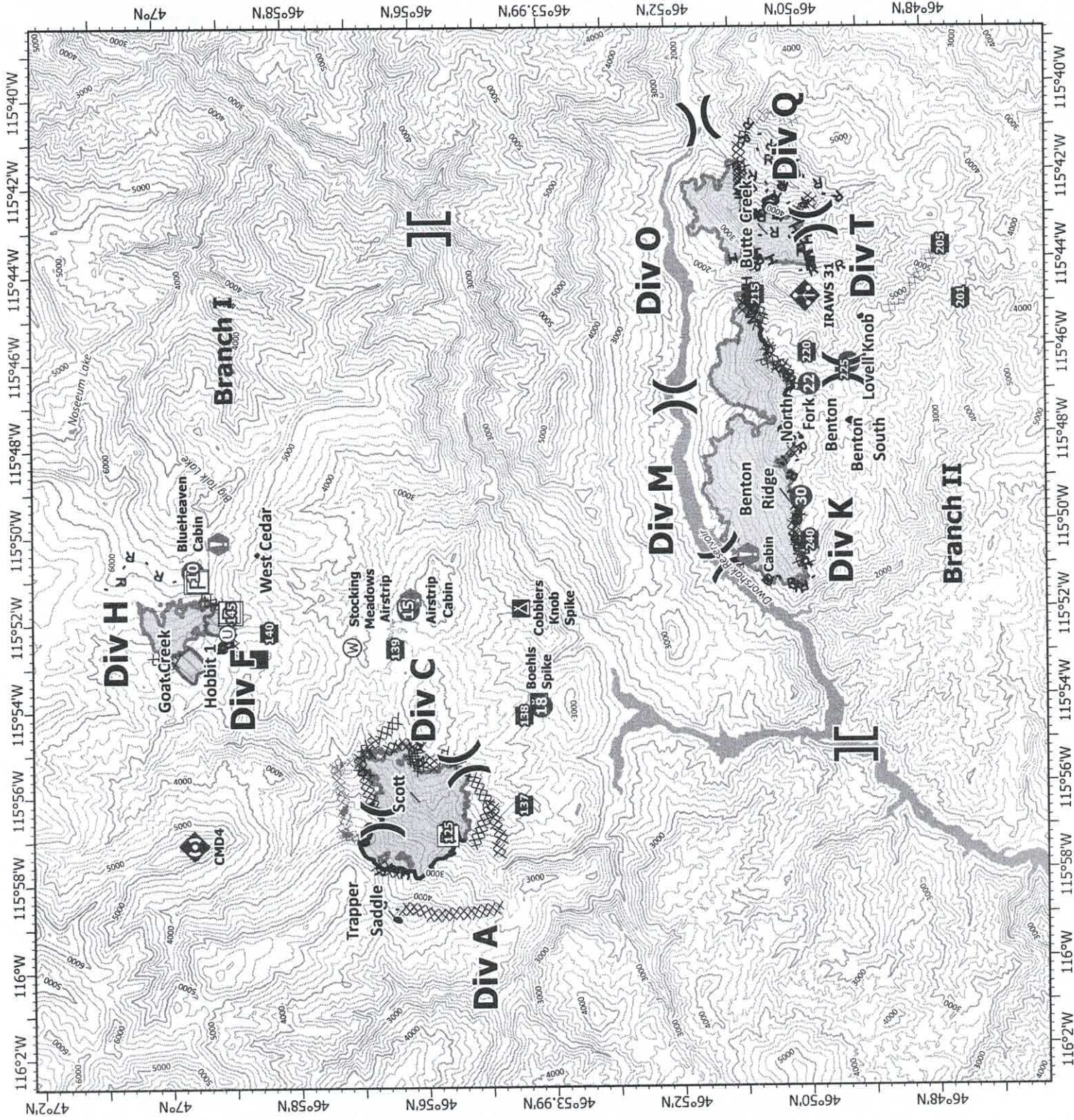
