Day Shift: 0600-2200

Keep your heads up, given the recent rainfall. Expect an increase in rolling rocks/debris and trees coming down, due to the loosened soils.

MAJOR HAZARDS ALL DIVISIONS

DRIVING HAZARDS: Use *EXTREME* caution when driving in and around the fire area. Give yourself 2x the normal required stopping distance when traveling wet and muddy roads.

“DRIVE AS IF THERE IS AN ONCOMING TRUCK AROUND EVERY CORNER!”

HAZARD TREES: Follow “Hazard Tree Safety” on page 22 in IRPG.

COMMUNICATIONS: Ensure you have an updated clone and have communication with adjoining forces.

HEAVY EQUIPMENT: Refer to “Working with Heavy Equipment” section on page 86 on IRPG.

LOG HAULING: Log hauling operations are active in the fire area. Use extreme caution, communicate, and drive defensively.

Points to Ponder

- Vehicle accidents are a common cause of firefighter injuries – **Drive Smart**
- Wildland FF’s are injured or killed more annually from falling trees – **Look Up**
- Ash pits and stump holes are the most common cause of burn injuries – **Look Down**
- FF’s can be the cause of, or recipient of rolling debris – **Look Around**
- Heat, long hours, and repetition can lead to complacency and injuries – **Pace yourself**
- Multiple Resources of multiple typing doing multiple jobs = Multiple potential for injury – **Stay Focused**
- Communicate clearly and get confirmation that your message is understood – **Communicate Clearly**

WEATHER DISCUSSION: For Cougar Rock Complex – Branch I (Hobbit 1, Scott, Trapper Saddle, Goat Creek)

Expect a warming and drying trend through Wednesday as high pressure rebounds over the region. A significant change in the weather will occur Thursday with a cold front bringing a good chance of showers and thunderstorms Thursday and Friday. Temperatures will be much cooler late in the week through the weekend.

Today Tuesday, August 03:

WEATHER: Sunny. Haze and areas of smoke.

TEMPERATURES: Fire: 83°F

HUMIDITY: Fire: 25%

WINDS (20ft): Variable 3 mph in the morning becoming southwest 4-7 mph in the afternoon.

HAINES INDEX: 3 Very low **LAL:** 1 **CWR:** 0%

WEATHER DISCUSSION: For Cougar Rock Complex – Branch II (Butte Creek, Benton Ridge Fires, Lovell Knob)

Hot and dry conditions are expected on Tuesday and Wednesday. Thermal belts will become established once again with modest Rh recovery on the slopes the next few nights.

WEATHER: Sunny. Haze and areas of smoke.

TEMPERATURES: Fire: 90 to 95°F

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: Hot and Dry Conditions Returning

Sky Weather: Sunny with smoke and haze, **CWR:** 0 %, **Temps:** 83 to 95°, **RH:** 20 to 25%, **Haines:** 3 Very Low **LAL:** 1
Winds (20 ft): Variable 1 to 3 mph, becoming southwest 4 to 7 mph in afternoon.

FUELS: Cougar Rock Complex- 10 fires

Mixed conifer forest dominated by Western Red Cedar, Douglas Fir, Western Larch, and Grand Fir. Subalpine Alpine Fir, Engelman Spruce and Lodge Pole Pine at the higher elevations (>4,800'). All age and size classes of conifer fuels with relatively high crown bulk density and low crown base heights. Light to moderate amounts of dead fine fuels and logging/ thinning slash will contribute to surface fire spread. Herbaceous and live woody fuels are green and will generally not contribute to fire spread.

Fine Fuels: 7+%; **10-hr:** 10%; **100hr:** 16.5%; **1000hr:** 16% (These values adjusted for recent rain showers Sun-Mon)

ERC: 27.5, below 90th percentile. **Max spotting distance:** 0.2 Mile plus with ridgetop winds

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

General:

Expect low to moderate active surface and ground fire. The rain showers we received may have penetrated the tree canopy to wet surface fuels to various extent. Smolder and creep may be common in some areas, while tree torching/short range spotting in unburnt areas could occur within the fires and areas of unsecured line. Live fuels and young conifer plantations should discourage crown fire activity. Except in the SAF/ES stands (i.e. Goat Fire) fire activity should remain on the ground under dense canopies and sheltered sites. Fire primarily moving in activity fuels/slash and jackpots of dead/down/litter. Both on and off-site smoke will damper fire activity. Warmer and dryer weather may not immediately increase fire behavior as the effects of precipitation lingers for several days.

Backing/flanking spread 2-3 ft/min with flames 2-3 ft. Head fire with possible 5-7 ft. flame lengths and 16 ft/min rates of spread on the steeper sites, higher with torching and when slope and wind align. (These values have decreased from what is currently listed following the rain showers Sun-Mon)

Specific:

Benton Fires: Continued, but slower movement to the N/NW toward the Reservoir. Fire will move towards the tether line on the east side of the fire.

Butte Creek: Continued but slower fire growth to the E/NE of Thompson Point and towards the Reservoir. Thompson Creek is currently suppressing fire growth.



Goat Creek: Sub-alpine fir will continue to promote minor fire spotting thru single tree and group tree torching. Fire spread is less likely following the rain showers received on Sunday and Monday. Interior burning will continue to occur but with reduced intensity because of moisture received.

Probability of Ignition (PIG): 54%

AIR OPERATIONS: Notable impact to aviation will be area smoke, and lingering low clouds; thermal belt development may result in morning inversion with smoke in drainages

SAFETY: Remember Watch Out #14 Weather is getting hotter and drier.





Interagency Fire Operations

- Maintain social distancing from any personnel outside your fire module
- Complete (daily) wildland fire COVID-19 health screening tool for each firefighter
- Upon resource order, collect intelligence on how local units will receive incoming resources
- Minimize unnecessary stops in-route to assignments
- Utilize digital technology (AirDrop, QR codes, photos, text) to the extent possible to share information such as Crew Manifest, Maps, IAPs, CTRs, etc.
- Use remote briefing via radio or cell phone if possible. If not, maintain social distancing, wear face covering and minimize personnel at the briefing.

Maintain Situational Awareness of The Fire Environment: 10 & 18, LCES

- Monitor each other, watch for symptoms (Firefighter Health Screening Tool).
- Never share PPE, UTV & flight helmets, radios, or other equipment
- Implement daily decontamination procedures of apparatus and equipment
- Adjust operational periods to allow for additional COVID-19 logistics.
- Plan for overnight lodging/camping/feeding scenarios that maintain separation from other fire personnel and community

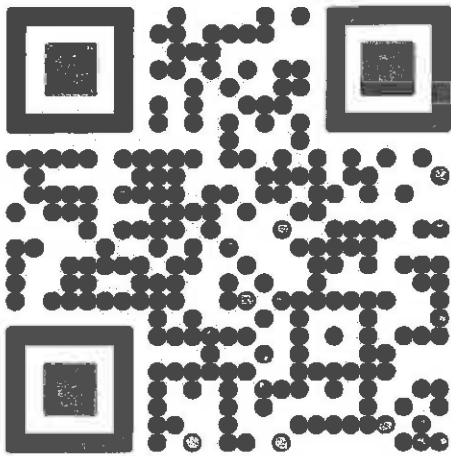

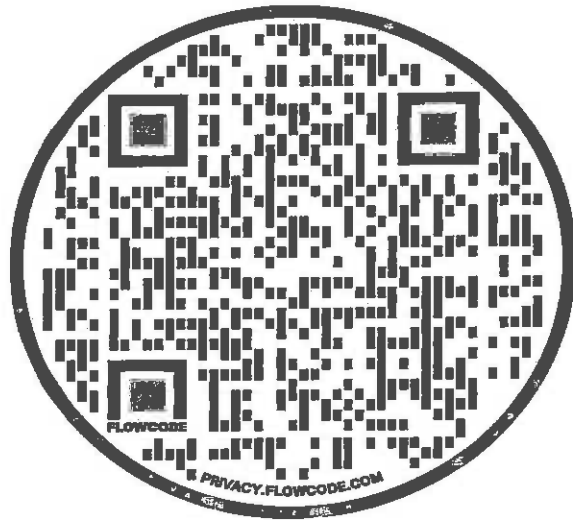

The virtual demobilization process has been established for all resources demobilizing from Cougar Rock Process. You will need a cell or internet connection to complete the checkout form. In-person Demob will be located at Cougar Rock ICP.

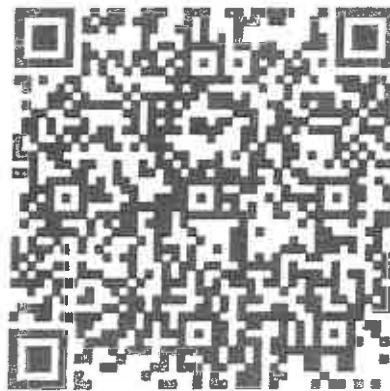
Step 1: Return all accountable property (radio, supplies, etc.) to the Communications Unit and/or Supply Unit. All private/contract vehicles need a post fire inspection from ground support. All non-local vehicles that have been off-payment must go through weed wash at the HQ Camp or other area designated by ground support prior to demobilizing.

STEP 2: Deliver Unit logs, Field Wx Observations, Performance Evaluations and other documentation to the Documentation Unit at the Cougar Rock ICP.

Step 3: Finalize all CTR's and Shift Tickets and complete any other required Finance demobilization items per the Finance Demobilization page.

Step 4: After you have completed Steps 1,2 and 3, you may demob via any of the following depending your location:

- Stop in person to the Demob Unit leader located at Cougar Rock ICP **OR**
- Call the Demob Unit leader at 208-719-6009 **OR**
- Use the following QR code to access the virtual Demobilization Form

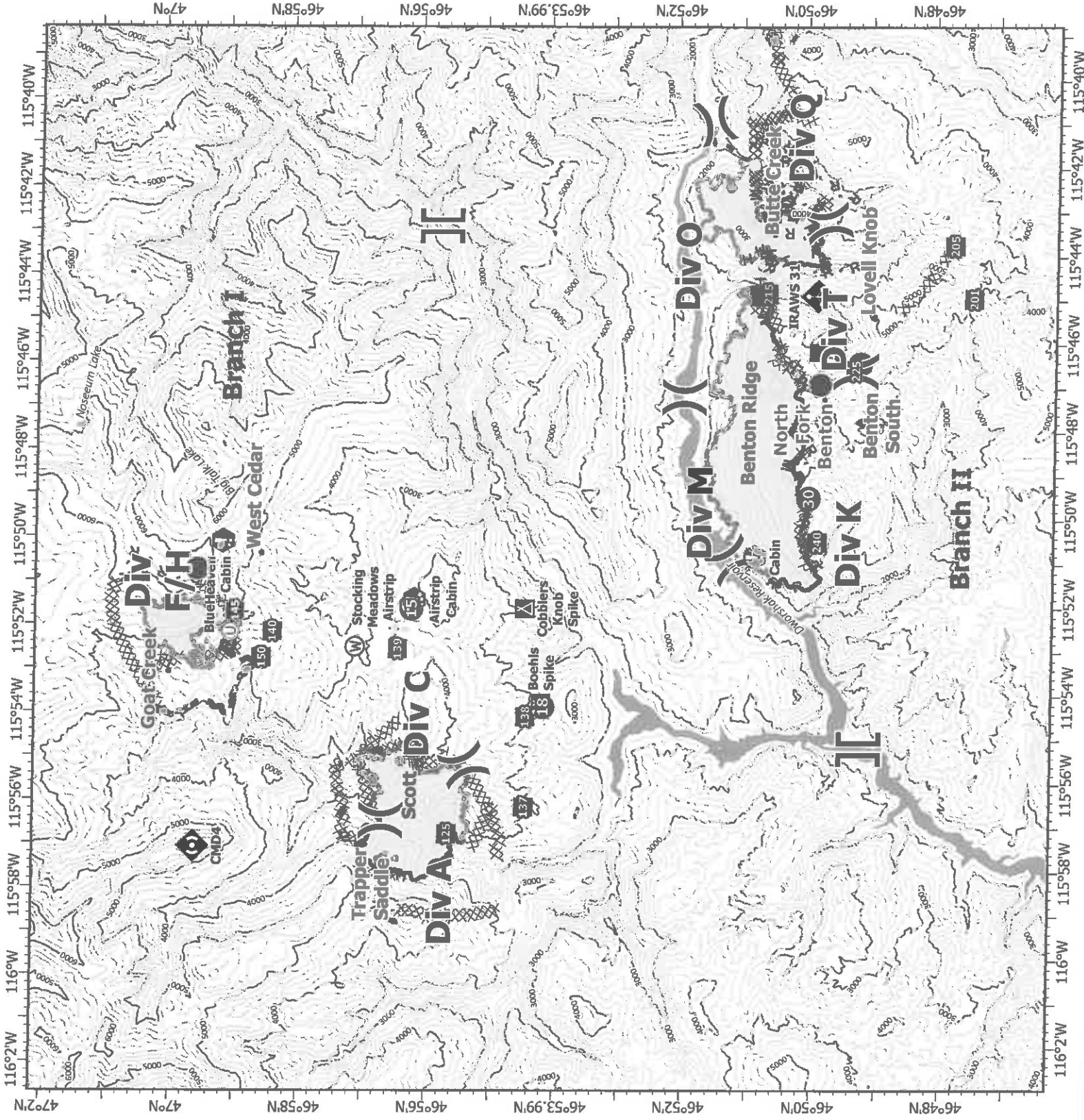
