For Day Operations: August 9, 2021

Major Hazards and Risks:

- **SNAGS** - There are numerous snags as well as fire damaged trees and trees with widow-makers throughout the incident. Always maintain strong situational awareness for snag issues in your work area. Look up, look down, look around. Be especially alert if the wind picks up as gusts are expected. When falling operations are in progress, keep non-essential personnel at least 2 ½ tree lengths away from the activity.
- **CUMULATIVE FATIGUE:** This is clearly a very active fire season with folks working long hours on back-to-back assignments or extensions. This can lead to serious cumulative fatigue. Monitor yourself, your subordinates, and others for fatigue. Take frequent short rest breaks, eat balanced meals, and get as much quality sleep as possible.
- **DRIVING** –Drive slowly, headlights on, use backers. Practice “Defensive Driving” techniques. Drive at posted or slower speed limits as conditions warrant. Look for increases in trucking traffic. Know the traffic plan for calling out mile markers on the fire line and road system.
- **HEAVEY EQUIPMENT OPERATIONS-** When working around heavy equipment, ensure that everyone is well briefed on the plan. Always maintain a safe distance and avoid working directly down slope to avoid rolling debris in steep terrain.
- **MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORTING-** Do you know what to do in case of a medical emergency? Review Medical Plan (ICS 206) and become familiar with the “Medical Incident Report.” Your actions may be what save a life. Also know that the Emergency Medical Coms go direct through Grangeville dispatch.
