Fire Weather Forecast for IDZ103

.DISCUSSION...

Idaho: Warm, dry, and smoky conditions will be present over north central Idaho forests through Sunday night. Expect mainly terrain driven (upslope) daytime winds and poor overnight humidity recovery during this time. A weak surge in moisture is projected to move over the Salmon River corridor Monday morning, with a very low chance of wetting rain from thunderstorms through the early afternoon. Even in the absence of rain, humidity will begin trending a bit higher on Monday and Monday night. On Tuesday, a cold front is expected to move from the northwest along the Bitterroot Crest, with wetting rain chances concentrated nearby and over elevations above 4000 feet. The remainder of the region will see increased winds, further increases in humidity, and decreasing smoke concentrations on Tuesday. There uncertainty as to whether or not the wetting rain chances for high elevations will extend into Wednesday. Elevated humidity in cool northwest flow aloft Thursday through next weekend.

Mop-up Guidelines

Mop-up from the fire edge to a distance interior that:

- 1.) Minimizes hazard exposure to suppression resources;
- Is commensurate to the risk of escape from torching and spotting;
- 3.) Is a minimum distance of 100 feet if firefighter safety is not compromised.

Concentrate on ragged green fingers or islands that have potential to torch and spot. One hundred percent mop-up of all spot fires outside the perimeter.

Keep Your Crew Healthy for the Next One!

- **Perform hand hygiene:** When soap and water are available, wash your hands often for at least 20 seconds, especially after coughing or sneezing. This is especially true when hands are visibly dirty, after touching commonly touched surfaces like porta potty doors, tables, and equipment, after using the toilet, or before eating. If soap and water are not readily available, alcohol-based hand sanitizers with at least 60% alcohol should be used.
- Follow respiratory etiquette principles: Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. If using a tissue, immediately throw away the tissue away after use and wash or sanitize your hands as described above.
- **Keeping hands away from face:** Practice not touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. While it may seem simple, germs often spread this way.
- Clean and disinfect the environment appropriately: Frequently touched surfaces in the workplace (engines, rigs, and buggies) should be routinely cleaned and if necessary disinfected.
