Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer of command periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident.

MAJOR HAZARDS ALL DIVISIONS

DRIVING HAZARDS: Use *EXTREME* caution when driving in and around the fire area. Numerous logging trucks and heavy equipment are utilizing the road systems surrounding the fires. Drive slow and "DRIVE AS IF THERE IS AN ONCOMING TRUCK AROUND EVERY CORNER!"

HAZARD TREES: Follow "Hazard Tree Safety" on page 22 in IRPG.

COMMUNICATIONS: Ensure you have an updated clone and have communication with adjoining forces.

HEAVY EQUIPMENT: Refer to "Working with Heavy Equipment" section on page 86 on IRPG.

LOG HAULING: Log hauling operations are active in the fire area. Use extreme caution, communicate, and drive defensively.

WEATHER: Hot weather can lead to dehydration and Heat Related Injury (HRI). Pace yourself and drink plenty of fluids! Refer to page 109 in the IRPG for HRI symptoms.

Factors for increased risks during transition periods include:

- No or poor briefing of incoming personnel.
- Lack of fire weather and behavior information, both forecast and observed.
- Communications: face-to-face briefings may not be possible.
- ➤ The Incident Commander (IC) may not be aware of the number, type, and location of all resources.
- Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all resources.
- Not all resources know who is in command.

Mitigation actions to take:

- Lookouts: post and maintain your own lookouts.
- Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources, as well as your original supervisor, while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor.
- Escape routes and safety zones: Identify escape routes and ensure incoming resources are aware of their locations; be aware that your original escape routes and safety zones may no longer be accessible due to changing fire behavior or your increased distance from them.
- Plan for transitions to occur at the morning briefing.

Fire Weather Forecast for IDZ103

.DISCUSSION...

Idaho: The entire region will continue to be socked in by smoke from area wildfires through the rest of the day and overnight hours. Hi-Resolution forecast models continue to indicate the potential for isolated nocturnal thunderstorms developing over the Nez Perce NF and along the Bitterroot Crest after midnight tonight. If this occurs, expect frequent lighting and breezy erratic winds. Though, very little rainfall is expected with the convection. The ridge of high pressure will continue to break down through the day tomorrow, allowing for the atmosphere to finally begin to mix out. This will allow for westerly winds to mix down to the surface and help clear out some of the smoke. Expect gusty winds up to 20-25 mph, especially at the ridge tops. The valleys and canyons will see lighter winds of around 10-15 mph. The low pressure system for Tuesday and Wednesday continues the trend with spreading wetting rains further west into north-central Idaho, with a wetting rain now possible as far west as Orofino. The eastern Nez Perce and Clearwater NF still has the best chance for seeing the wetting rains, and maybe even up to 0.25" or more.

Mop-up Guidelines

Mop-up from the fire edge to a distance interior that:

- 1.) Minimizes hazard exposure to suppression resources;
- Is commensurate to the risk of escape from torching and spotting;
- 3.) Is a minimum distance of 100 feet if firefighter safety is not compromised.

Concentrate on ragged green fingers or islands that have potential to torch and spot. One hundred percent mop-up of all spot fires outside the perimeter.

Keep Your Crew Healthy for the Next One!

- **Perform hand hygiene:** When soap and water are available, wash your hands often for at least 20 seconds, especially after coughing or sneezing. This is especially true when hands are visibly dirty, after touching commonly touched surfaces like porta potty doors, tables, and equipment, after using the toilet, or before eating. If soap and water are not readily available, alcohol-based hand sanitizers with at least 60% alcohol should be used.
- Follow respiratory etiquette principles: Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. If using a tissue, immediately throw away the tissue away after use and wash or sanitize your hands as described above.
- **Keeping hands away from face:** Practice not touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. While it may seem simple, germs often spread this way.
- Clean and disinfect the environment appropriately: Frequently touched surfaces in the workplace (engines, rigs, and buggies) should be routinely cleaned and if necessary disinfected.
